

In connection with its investigation into the circumstances surrounding the assassination of President John F. Kennedy, the Select Committee on Assassinations requests that the Central Intelligence Agency make available for interviews by our staff the Chiefs of Station and Deputy Chiefs of Station in Moscow from 1959 to 1963; the chief officers and deputy chief officers of the CIA base at Atsugi, Japan from 1956 to 1960; and the Chiefs of the Soviet Russia Division, Deputy Directorate for Plans, from 1956 to 1964; or provide their last known addresses so that we can contact them.
