Airlines Pilot V Cito Mexico City 19854 Eastern  
Expressed to LNERGO states  
Cain hijacked <sup>Eastern</sup> plane and forced  
to fly to Honduras. LNERGO  
stated Cain in Mexico City around  
4-15-72 - returned to Chicago,  
and disappeared stating he was going  
to Latin America. Allegedly involved  
in illegal international arms  
deals and on occasions stated  
he worked for BKT RUST.

- 1. Chicago Tribune article of 28+31 Dec. 1973  
Summary of contacts Cain had w/ CIA  
compiled by Cell for WNS  
Fall 1960 - Cain contacted DCS  
Chicago Field Office and provided  
info on Cuban exile groups in  
Chicago.
- 2. June 1961 - Cain contacted Mr.  
Lohmann of Chicago Field Office  
to report he would be working  
with a Mr. Kroupansky to investigate  
communism in Panama for  
Pres. of Panama.
- 3. Summer of 1961 - Cain met in  
Mex Cit. by Cell staffer ident.  
unknown - reason unknown.

DO NOT REPRODUCE  
RETURN TO CIA

4. October 61 - Cain wrote to Lohmann from Panama reported his findings of attitudes in Central America toward U.S. and offered his services to the U.S.
5. April 62 - Cain visited CIA reps. Scott + Dean in Mex. Cit. and informed them of investigative agency he had in Mexico training Mexican Govt. officials. He was warned.
6. June 4 62 - Cain deported from Mexico for carrying loaded revolver and brass knuckles impersonating a Mexican Govt. official.
7. August 19, 1963 - Cain met in Chicago Ill. by W.H. Riv. staff officer Wallace Speed and chief of Chic. D.C.D. Office.

a. Cain expressed desire to work for CIA overseas. current coop with CIA might be beneficial towards this end.

b. Cain agreed to assist CIA by providing info on undercover activities of Cubans, esp. Paulino Sierra.

8. August 26, 63 Cain gave following info to D.C.D. Chicago Office on Student Directory a Cuban exilic group in Miami August 30, 63 reported Miro Cordozo interested in purchasing arms. memo WH 1405 date 9-4-63 Cordozo said "CIA will pay"

Cain talked to Salvo who said his group was opposed by Pentagon

9. Sept. 11, 63 Horace Speed requested PCSA/CSA on Cain. No indication it was granted.

10. Sept. 12, 63

Cain reported to Chic. Field Office info on persons representing ORF who purchased arms for ORF. Cain planned another meeting with ORF reps. Speed got word to Cain to get picture away to make no commitments.

Jarvis & Serao memo concerning Mateyo dated 9-12-63 by Stanley Fugolab

11. 1967 - OS files show FBI initiated invest. on Cain because of Mafia connections and recommend CIA terminate association w/ Cain.

12. ~~Cain~~  
April 15, 1972 - Cain returned to Chicago from Mex. Ct. disappeared May 1, 1972.

13. May 16, 72 FBI agent in Mexico Ct. asked Mex. City Station for traces on Cain because of the skyjacking.

Concluded that there is no indication that clearance was ever granted to Cain for Agency or that he received any compensation.

Memo written by Lohmann  
Feb. 23, 61.

Cain telephoned Lohmann 2-21-61  
(not mentioned in summary) and  
reported that a lieutenant of  
Castro intelligence org. was in Chicago  
Bernard's Sauckel.  
Lohmann was hesitant to pursue  
the matter because it was  
more specifically under the jurisdiction  
of FBI rather than Army (3).

office (Cain presumably) informed  
that early in 1963 McCombs  
took over operations for SPC  
in Feb. 63 a secret meeting  
was held in Chicago and the  
assassination of Pres. was discussed.

Memo 12-12-60  
to Chief Contact Division  
from Lohmann.

10-12-60  
Memo by Cain  
to Chief Contact Div  
Lohmann on 12-8-60 that the flights  
were canceled.  
Currently he is involved in  
setting up an organization  
going to w/ Attorneys & Businessmen  
to infiltrate and combat Communism  
in Central Am.  
Jack M. Kelly & Lohmann reports he is  
not yet cleared.
