Titamil - 7's assignments included reporting on Embassy activities and personnel as well as procuring exemplars such as seals, envelopes (unused and those mailed from Cuba. In August 62, she cooperated well but had little access to important information. She only had access to courtesy & diplomatic visas which were those not issued by the Consulate.

Titamil - 7 was a secretary at the Cuban Embassy from 1930 to the present which was July 1962. She was a very close associate of Luis Albern Souto (Titamil - 9).

In July of 1962 Mexi City Station requested P.O.A. on her. She had finally furnished something useful: a copy of the visa form used by travelers who do not wish their travel to Cuba to appear in their passports. Provisional <sup>operational</sup> approval granted September 10, 1962.

Sept. 22, 1962: Headquarters calls Mexi [D.I.R. 38657] asking for the following at Station's discretion from Titamil - 7: a) report names and available bio's on Mexi citizens who regularly visit specific Cuban in Embassy

b) report details any disagreements, personality conflicts, feuds, dislikes, romances, marital, financial, or other problems among Cuban Embassy official.

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c) Report detailed description procedure for providing Cuban visa to non-Mexican travelers from L.A. countries who arrive in Mexico with Mexican visa & intend to continue on to Cuba but do not wish evidence Cuban visit recorded in passport. Provide names bio data on all such travelers.
