Rerep SA Joseph C. Learned dated 2-14-64 in captioned matter.

The following observations and instructions are set forth as a result of a review of rerep.

1. Cover Pages A-C set out leads for the Dallas, Kansas City, Los Angeles, Mobile, Philadelphia and Denver Offices. All offices are instructed to expedite the coverage of the leads and submit the results in form suitable for dissemination. Seven copies of the communication should be furnished the Bureau.

2. Kansas City in advising whether it has sources who can furnish the locations of "Minutemen" units and the membership list of captioned organization should advise the Bureau and all other offices which have set out leads to secure such information. In so doing, Kansas City should set out the identities of the communications setting forth the leads.

3. Cover Page D stated individual cases were being opened on Imelda L. Euteneuer, Phillip Petars and Charles E. Walker. Denver should advise the basis for

It does not appear that mere membership or leadership in captioned organization is sufficient basis for opening such cases unless the activities of the individuals come within the purview of Section 87 D of the Manual of Instructions or meet the criteria for the Security Index or one of the Reserve Indices.

4. Rerep is classified "Confidential." Cover Page D states it is so classified since data reported by T-1 "could reasonably result in identification of a confidential source of continuing value and compromise the effectiveness thereof." T-1 is identified on Cover Page C as Patrick Price who requested his identity be protected. The major criteria for classifying a communication is whether the disclosure of the information or the compromising of a source or informant would adversely affect the national defense interests of the Nation. It cannot be seen how the compromising of Price, who is not an established confidential source or informant, would have such an adverse effect. Denver should re-evaluate this matter and advise by return airtel whether or not the report should remain classified as dissemination is being held in abeyance pending receipt of this information.

5. Rerep discloses that most of the information reported deals with the Denver area. Denver should advise by return airtel the extent and results of the investigation conducted to determine if there are any units of "Minutemen" active in the other parts of Colorado and in the State of Wyoming.

The above should receive expeditious attention.

1. Cover Pages A-C set out leads for the Dallas, Kansas City, Los Angeles, Mobile, Philadelphia and Denver Offices.
