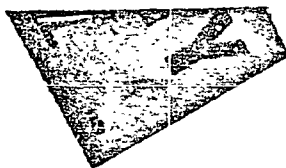

Costa Rican's Call for Talks With Castro Shocks Exiles

Interpretation

Costa Rica's President Jose Figueres has thrown the Western Hemisphere's half-million Cuban exiles into a state of shock by his declaration that they should seek a dialogue with Fidel Castro.

It happened at an exile banquet in San Juan, Puerto Rico, last week attended by many anti-Castro leaders and by the leading officials of the island commonwealth, including Luis Munoz Marin and the new governor, Rafael Hernandez Colon.

Figueres had seemed to be an ideal choice as the speaker to the exile leaders because no Latin American leader has been a more open and vigorous enemy of Castro. The occasion was the 120th birthday celebration of Jose Marti, Cuba's national hero and a man idealized by both the exiles and by Castro supporters. For most of his speech, the eloquent and democratic-minded Figueres gave a stellar performance, combining fine oratory with wit. But then, toward the end of his speech, "Don Pepe" Figueres dropped his bombshell.

Seek a Dialogue

He said the Cuban exiles should seek a dialogue with Castro because there is no prospect of overthrowing him. And he offered himself as an intermediary.

"If I have to share with you actions which are not pleasurable but bitter, and mediate with Fidel, Russia or the devil, I am at your disposal," Figueres said to the stunned au-

dience. Such exile leaders as Jose Mira Cardona and Manuel Ray, who once were active in militant attempts to overthrow the Communist regime set up by Castro, were described as barely able to restrain themselves.

The surprise declaration by Figueres was greeted with almost total silence, although a few women reportedly cried at his words.

Figueres appeared to have second thoughts about what he had said later in the week when he arrived in Panama. Reporters asked him about reports that he had offered to be a mediator among the Cubans and Figueres replied evasively that he had said nothing specific.

"I am always at the disposal of the Cubans for whatever they please," he told Panamanian newsmen.

Close to Exiles

Asked if it was true that the militant exile organization Alpha 66 had rejected his offer, Figueres said he was not familiar with the organization.

Well-informed sources on Caribbean and Central American affairs say Figueres knows as much as any man about the Cuban exile movements and the men who lead them. After the Bay of Pigs disaster, some of the survivors of the invading force went to Costa Rica. Figueres himself, in his youth, was a leader of guerrilla forces fighting against such dictators as Ra-

fael Trujillo and Anastasio Somoza Garcia.

But Figueres also is known as a realistic man. When Costa Rica found itself with a huge coffee surplus, Figueres established diplomatic relations with Russia and sold his entire surplus to the Soviet Union.

His Marti dinner speech seems to mean that he has decided that, realistically, Castroism is here to stay and will have to be accepted. Only Figueres, however, would have chosen a Cuban exile conclave to state his new stand.

Biography: Born¹³ June 1924 in Havana. Educated in Cuban universities and became a very able construction engineer. He was politically unknown until 1957. In early 1957 he joined the Internal Resistance Movement (MRC). After engaging in numerous clandestine activities, he was made Secretary General of the MRC and a leader of the 26th of July Movement for Havana Province. At the time, he was President of the Havana Society of Civil Engineers and was employed by the Frederick Snare Corporation on the Hotel Hilton project. When Batista was overthrown, Castro made Ray his Minister of Public Works. Ray did a very creditable job "re-building" Cuba and acquired a substantial popular following. As Minister of Public Works, he showed a great understanding of the needs of the people of Cuba and a real concern for their welfare.

Political Affiliation and Attitudes:

Although liberal and pro-revolutionary, Ray resented the Communist domination of the Castro regime and in November 1959 he was replaced by a Communist. He lived for several months under surveillance that amounted to house arrest and was unable to acquire another post. However, he remained in Cuba and organized the MRP as an anti-Castro movement. He escaped to the US in October 1960. His leadership, ability, and integrity are unmistakable.

In the US as an MRP leader.

He subsequently lost his job and devoted all of his time to the 26th of July Movement. Nothing is known of his domestic affairs or competence in foreign languages.

SUBJECT : Donn MUNSON, Author of SAGA Article, and
Juan ERQUIAGA, Subject of Article.

1. Donn Hale MUNSON, born 1905, resident of Los Angeles, approached LICOMET/1 in 1964 claiming he represented a large group of Cuban exiles in the Los Angeles area. MUNSON asked LICOMET/1 about the location of training camps, etc. LICOMET/1 reported the discussion to Station Mexico City and was instructed to avoid MUNSON. Donn Hale MUNSON is probably identical with the Donn MUNSON who authored the Saga article. There are no additional identifiable traces on MUNSON.

2. There are numerous traces on Juan ERQUIAGA Aizcorbe, the owner of the weapons plant named in the Saga article. The FBI also reported ERQUIAGA was involved in the sale of arms to Cuban revolutionaries in 1965. Although RI was unable to locate the report, it was classified to Manolo RAY's 201 file. This would tend to support the Saga claim that any weapons supplied by ERQUIAGA's firm went to the JURE crowd, not to any Agency supported group.

GUN MERCHANTS TO AMERICA'S HATE GROUPS

By Donn Munson



CIA-approved Arizona factory sold 45-cal. "Spitfire" machine guns as sporting weapons to Cuban exiles (photo), paramilitary "home defense" groups, and black nationalists . . . until IRS crack-down.

Intelligence Agency was secretly subsidizing the manufacture of thousands of machine guns which were being snapped up by some of the worst extremists in the U.S. today!

Last year, Attorney General Thomas Lynch of California ordered a raid on a secret machine gun plant in City of Industry (a suburb of L.A.), which did not have state permission for the manufacture, possession, sale or transportation of such weapons—but was churning them out illegally with the blessings of the CIA!

Of all the dangerous elements that exist in our society today, the most subversive would have to be any organization found arming the extremist elements—of either side—with modern weapons for possible civil war.

In this light, brought to the public's attention for the first time anywhere, is SAGA's *l'accusat*. The CIA is responsible for arming far-out extremist groups in their preparation for civil conflict which could ultimately produce chaos in America. The CIA has, indeed, been covertly bankrolling the manufacture of thousands of revolutionary automatic weapons in secret plants under the very noses of high state and city officials.

While the Administration, Congress and various law-enforcement groups have worked for years for some sort of gun-control legislation, the shocking truth is that the Central

Further, the U.S. military has been an unwitting source of arms to these same elements which, together with CIA-supplied arms constitutes one of the gravest threats to the country today. . . .

The shabby building at 15036 E. Procter Ave. in the City of Industry (a Los Angeles suburb), looks like any of a score of other small manufacturing plants in the area. It could turn out lamp shades, dog collars, aluminum awnings, or can openers. Maybe it has at some time. But for years it was one of several factories where a mysterious Peruvian named Juan Erquiaga, a 50-ish beetle-browed gun genius, churned out machine guns illegally . . . with the blessings of the CIA.

The Erquiaga Arms Company sought anonymity and got it for years. It was organized and designed so skillfully owners of neighboring plants did not know what was being made next door. "Point, I think," guessed one neighbor.

But behind the exterior of normalcy and calm there was furious activity. Machine gun parts were stamped and tooled. Ammunition clips were shaped and welded. Barrels were chambered and stocks were fitted.

Every employe of the plant was a guard. There was a loaded gun behind every door, under every lath, always near at hand. And over this busy, deadly business presided Juan Erquiaga, a major league merchant of death whose goods were for sale to the highest bidder. Or to whoever the CIA said "Sell!"

Born in Lima, Peru, he studied at the Escuela Militar (military school) there and from 1940 to 1944 according to police records served in the U.S. Army as a second lieutenant. Returning to Peru, he was graduated from the Politecnico Principal del Peru as a tool designer. But after having tasted life in the U.S. and realizing he could ply his trade more rewardingly here, he came back to the States and became a naturalized citizen in 1956.

A genius with guns, he had trouble with language. "I spent many hours learning English so I could communicate my ideas to others," he once recalled.

And he had ideas, plenty of them . . . and all of them lethal. Even before he came to the U.S., Erquiaga invented many types of weapons. Once here as a citizen, he put his fearsome talent to work by opening a firearms manufacturing shop in South Gate, another Los Angeles suburb.

Military rifles were his specialty . . . modifications of old guns that under his magic touch could fire faster and deadlier than their inventors had ever dreamed. Luger customers from South and Central America, where the winds of revolution blow constant and hot, competed with homegrown kook organizations, such as the Minutemen and California Rangers for his products.

Two years later, Erquiaga smelled bigger game. Fidel Castro was on the rise in Cuba and he needed mon like Juan Erquiaga. Fidel waved money under Erquiaga's bulbous nose and the Peruvian reacted like a starving tiger smelling fresh meat.

Castro gave him some cash and lots of rank. He made Erquiaga commander of his ordnance department. When the Cuban Communist swept dictator Batista out of power and into exile, Erquiaga stayed on. Fidel promised him new glory and he delivered, making Juan a minister of public works. Erquiaga was riding high with the rebels. But then—in 1956—he found it expedient to flee Cuba.

"I do not like to talk about those days. I . . . we . . . were betrayed," he said later. What betrayed him was a love not for freedom but for money. The big loot was not in Latin America but in southern California, where blazing sunshine fails to illuminate many dark plots and counterplots.

Erquiaga came back to the Golden State via Mexico, where he took a brief fling at making machine guns for anti-Castro forces. He never had any political convictions cash couldn't change.

By 1962 Erquiaga was back in the big league, this time in El Monte, not far from the scene of his earlier success as an arms maker for the malcontents. Once again he was turning out fast-firing rifles. But within three months he was into something deeper and deadlier.

In the City of Industry plant, he was grinding out 20,000 machine guns. And what guns! Feather light (six pounds loaded) and of his own design, the Erquiaga weapons are chambered for 9 mm parabellum ammo, carry 32 rounds and fire 1,300 rounds per minute. They combine full and selective automatic firing. The action is inertial, or "blowback."

Judd Smith, a California journalist and small arms expert, says they out-perform existing U.S. military submachine guns both in terms of rate of fire and accuracy in short and prolonged bursts.

"The most notable feature of them is that the muzzle doesn't climb uncontrollably during sustained bursts, permitting amazing accuracy," Smith says.

Erquiaga proudly pointed out that the muzzle is prevented from climbing by a special device of his own design affixed to it. "Other similar devices have been designed by the U.S. Army, but none has ever proved as effective as this," he boasted with some justification.

Juan Erquiaga had a good thing going for him and he knew just how to keep it rolling . . . deep underground. Business was great. Even if Juan did not have the right permits hanging on his factory wall, he had something better—several things, in fact.

One was a contract for 500 machine guns signed by Manuel Roy, leader of Junta Revolucionaria Airia Cubana (JURIC), an anti-Castro outfit then trying to oust Fidel, with the CIA picking up the tab.

A prominent Cuban exile now living in Los Angeles boasts that he personally delivered \$50,000 advance cash to Erquiaga as part of \$250,000 put up by the CIA. The 500 machine guns were to be the first of thousands.

"I was working for the CIA," the exile brags. "I made the payoff. No, I'm not certain where the guns were supposed to go. But I was hoping they were scheduled for anybody fighting Fidel."

... unexpectedly, after years of full blast operation, the roof suddenly fell in on Juan Erquiaga. By now, he was a flush business man with a wife and 10 children living at 550 Charleston Ave. in the comfortable L.A. suburb of La Puente. Once again Juan Erquiaga blew the whole setup because next to his love for guns came his love for money.

Not satisfied with his CIA payoffs, he tried to pick up some extra cash on the side. Reliable sources say his wonder guns began to end up in some peculiar hands. At the same time, he began to modify M-14 rifles into full automatics for the extremist National States Rights Party, a particularly vicious anti-Negro, anti-Jewish guerrilla gang which has its headquarters in Birmingham, Ala. It requires its members

to wear white shirts, black ties, black Sam Browne belts, black trousers, and an arm band emblazoned with a thunderbolt insignia.

As recently as Sept. 1, 1968, the white supremacy outfit waged a gun battle against Negroes in Berea, Ky., leaving two dead, several injured, and 13 charged with murder.

The States Rights Party had a large following in California, some of whom had big mouths and whose bragging fell on the ears of an alert but anonymous local police officer. He promptly turned in a report on Erquiaga's activities and it came to the attention of Attorney General Thomas Lynch.

Attorney General Lynch, who later engineered legislation outlawing private armies in California, ordered a raid. Los Angeles county and state (plus federal) officers swooped down on the Erquiaga plant, armed with a search warrant signed by Judge Fred W. Raab and issued to Deputy District Attorney Maurice Oppenheimer.

It was a big raid which netted only little fish—the big one got away.

Sheriff's deputies grabbed 373 automatic weapons (which they still have as evidence), and 100,000 rounds of ammunition. Erquiaga's wife said he was in Panama. Police said he had hightailed it for Guatemala, where machine guns are very much in demand and where assassination has claimed 4,000 lives (including the U.S. Ambassador and two U.S. military attaches stationed there). It is possible Erquiaga, Castro's on-again, off-again employee, may have found work there in the current guerrilla war being waged against the government.

However, Erquiaga, still wanted in Los Angeles, has never been seen since in the States. His disappearance opened some startling revelations. Among them, these—

A possibility that President Lyndon Johnson personally knew about the plant and its operation. A former aide who lives in Pico Rivera, Calif. told a reporter he presented an Erquiaga Special to the President "as a favor to Juan."

Malcolm F. Warner, then supervisor of the L.A. Bureau of the Internal Revenue Services Alcohol and Tobacco Tax Division, charged with enforcing the Federal Firearms Act, said he didn't have any knowledge of Erquiaga's wrongdoing. Juan, he said, had a federal permit.

True enough, admitted the sheriff's office, but Erquiaga did not have state authorization for the manufacture, possession, sale or transportation of such weapons.

Clearly, the CIA had slipped up. Perhaps Erquiaga did not have local permits because he had a local record. Incidentally, it was revealed by the IRS that Juan had been arrested in Lynwood, Calif., for making machine guns without any kind of permit in 1953 and that for four years he had been a fugitive. He gave himself up, paid only a \$500 fine and was back in business until the big raid.

Lowell Knudson, another Erquiaga associate at the gun plant, was convicted of possession of illegal firearms and fined a mere \$100 and put on probation for three years by Pomona (Calif.) Superior Court Judge Howard McClain.

But that didn't end the Erquiaga case. At least 100 of his guns vanished to reportedly reappear in a secret San Fernando Valley cache to become the nucleus of still another illegal operation—this one run by the Minutemen.

Lloyd Pullen, of Long Beach, a 20-year-old one-time lieutenant of Minuteman National Commander Robert DePugh, revealed to this writer that the extremists were unable to buy enough automatic weapons in any single market, open or underground.

They were forced to go into manufacturing, Pullen said. The ex-Minuteman, who has now formed his own "home defense" unit with the backing of some John Birch Society members, declared he broke with DePugh because the national commander "was too kooky, a real Nazi bastard." Pullen had no connection with the guns.

The underground gun-making remained secret for some time. Then, early in 1968, DePugh and some of his cohorts allegedly attempted to hold up a bank in the Northwest as "part of a guerrilla warfare training exercise."

He was indicted Feb. 20, 1968, by a grand jury at Seattle, Wash., on a charge of conspiracy to commit bank robbery. The U.S. Attorney at Seattle won the indictment but now refuses to reveal details of the case, refusing to answer written or telephone requests for particulars. Why he shrouds the case in mystery at this point cannot be determined.

DePugh is now wanted by the FBI and is the object of an international manhunt. Presumably, he fled the U.S. by way of Canada, a la James Earl Ray. But he has communicated with newsmen. He sent a letter, saying in part:

"We are fugitives, not because we made machine guns, or robbed banks, or kidnapped little girls. We are fugitives because we openly opposed traitors in our own government. We are not criminals—we are political refugees."

He is going to have a tough time convincing a jury of that when he is caught; for he has a long record and has led a rough guerrilla outfit not noted for its bravery. In 1966, a Minuteman testified during a trial on a firearms count that DePugh's men once discussed assassinating Sen. J. William Fulbright, chairman of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, and a scheme to put cyanide gas in the air-conditioning ducts at the United Nations building in New York.

...with their own means for transportation and their possession of automatic weapons.

Though the Minutemen are now deeper underground than ever, they occasionally break out in wild, mindless riots. At Voluntary Conv. on Aug. 24, 1968, six men described by the FBI as "secret, extremist and anti-Communist" shot it out with Connecticut state police in a pre-dawn raid on an encampment of pacifists.

Masked and armed, the Minutemen broke into a training camp. They wore old Army fatigues and carried bayonet-tipped rifles. FBI men had alerted the state troopers and both were waiting for the attack.

"When the Minutemen were spotted," said State Police Commissioner Leo J. Mulcahy, "we identified ourselves and the firing began."

Six persons (four readers, one state trooper and a woman resident of the camp) were wounded, none fatally.

The fact the readers carried only bayonet-tipped rifles indicates they are low on the totem pole when it comes to being combat-equipped. Because subversives are experiencing no trouble in getting automatic weapons straight from CIA factories and, indeed, from Uncle Sam's arsenals.

Shortly before Christmas last year (1967), Marine Corps officers at Camp Pendleton, Calif., discovered that 18 M-79 grenade launchers, each capable of destroying tanks and armored cars, had vanished from the military post. It was a serious, though not highly unusual, theft. In the hands of extremists, they could be devastating.

Word was flashed to the FBI, the National Guard, the CIA, Naval Intelligence, and police units the length and breadth of the country. The 18 grenade launchers joined an alarming list of guns and ammunition currently being stolen on an almost continual basis from military installations all over the United States.

The reaction of Lt. Col. G. W. Ferguson, spokesman for the Marines at Camp Pendleton, was almost one of resignation. "There are 43,000 Marines, plus special units of the Navy and Army, in training here," he said. "We cannot search each and every one of them each time he goes out of the gates. Weapons and ammunition can be stolen anytime some guy decides to walk off with them and go over the hill."

Each week a long list of stolen arms is circulated to police and military intelligence officials who are no longer surprised to see on it such items as the grenade launchers, or even machine guns. These losses are rarely made public.

Nor is news of their recovery—if any—broadcast. In fact, police and the military go to extraordinary, and sometimes ridiculous lengths to cover them up.

While Lt. Col. Ferguson admitted the 18 M-79s had vanished, the civilian police who recovered them denied they were ever stolen!

Lt. Col. Ferguson declared that credit for their recovery should go either to the Santa Ana Police Department or to the Orange County Sheriff's Office; he

couldn't be sure where they were, but the Marine stockpiles were captured less than 60 days after the M-79s were stolen and returned to the USMC. But official spokesmen for both civilian police departments, one of whom was in charge of his unit when the case broke, denied any knowledge of the affair.

"If any Marine weapons were stolen, that would be a federal case," one high ranking civilian cop said. Pressed for details, he insinuated the whole matter was now FBI-controlled and refused to discuss it further.

Not all thefts from the military are state-wide. Recently, the Post Office Department in San Francisco, through which most Vietnam mail passes, announced that it had spot-checked packages being shipped home from the war zone. What postal inspectors found shocked them to the core. . . . M-16 rifles, grenades, live ammunition, even live, dismantled machine guns! They did not reveal the names of the senders or the potential receivers. They did not even report what means they were taking to prevent future shipments.

In fact, the cloak of secrecy which surrounds illegal weapons activities is being drawn tighter and tighter, sometimes with embarrassing results.

This past summer, as the nation braced itself for an outbreak of civil violence and a possible race war, Los Angeles Police Chief Thomas Reddin told a press conference he had definite information that well-armed guerrilla groups existed in his city.

Los Angeles, still shaking from frequent shoot-outs in Watts and the assassination of Sen. Robert F. Kennedy, reacted nervously to the news. So did Chief Reddin and sources above him.

Before the day was out, he called two other news conferences—the second to explain what he meant by the first announcement, and the third to deny his original statement. At least one Los Angeles radio station broadcast all three of the chief's statements consecutively. It made highly interesting, if confusing, listening and left people wondering who had slipped Reddin the word.

When Watts did explode with another gun battle not long afterward, it left Angelenos more confused than ever. Three civilians were slain and 41 persons, including six cops, were wounded. But a news blackout was imposed. "Who shot whom and with what?" demanded *The Los Angeles Times*, a newspaper with nearly 1,000,000 daily circulation.

One of the less confused persons in Los Angeles was Celes King III, head of the L.A. Chapter of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People.

A calm, collected, moderate leader of the black community, highly respected in all civic circles, King declared L.A. had a right to not only be confused but to be scared. The city, he said, was then, and is now, in a "touch and go" situation. "It could explode any minute," he said.

"There are more guns here than in Saigon," he said flatly.

King added he was considering only registered guns. The number of unregistered weapons, including fully automatic firearms, was beyond his speculation.

Many of them, he believes, come from an active gunrunning operation which flourishes between Arizona, Nevada and California. In the two previous states they are easier to obtain than in California. Hand-guns are bought cheap there, run into California by car and plane by both white and black gunrunners, and then sold at tremendous profit to buyers who want to avoid a five-day waiting period and a police investigation.

Until May 1968, it was possible to buy a fully automatic machine gun without registering it in accordance with federal law.

Thanks to Uncle Sam's generosity, it was possible for subversive groups and individuals to purchase them over the counter for as little as \$59.

Thousands of them are now secretly owned by individuals and groups all through the United States, the IRS admits, as it futilely pleads for the owners to come into government offices and pay a \$200 fee to register each one. Few have done so, an IRS spokesman admits, recalling sadly, "I think there was one fellow. He said he wanted it for a wall decoration. Anyway, he paid the \$200."

The story behind their manufacture and sale is both fascinating and shocking, many of the details still hidden by embarrassed government officials.

It begins in Phoenix, Ariz., where on a quiet street in a nondescript building a small organization called the Spitfire Manufacturing Company set up shop some time ago. Its purpose was to make and sell a featherweight, .45 caliber carbine as a "sporting weapon."

At \$99 each retail, they were something of a sensation among certain "sportsmen." Anti-Castro Cuban groups, planning on hunting big game on their native island, snapped them up. After all, there's no law against non-citizen Cubans owning sporting guns.

So groups like the recently reborn Bay of Pigs Brigade and Exilo Cubano hurried to their local gunshops and stocked up. Then many of them took to the mountains and deserts to practice hunting maneuvers which, strangely enough, included ambushes, patrolling, scouting, and wild charges which are not ordinarily associated with California jackrabbits and coyotes. Such critics stood in little danger because the Cubans sometimes accidentally used each other as targets.

Minutemen, black nationalists, and paramilitary "home defense" troops eagerly bought the lethal little Spitfires. And all because they, like the Cubans, knew something it took Uncle Sam many months to learn.

The "sportsmen" learned that what one branch of the government considered a simple carbine, but which actually resembles a submachine gun, could be made fully automatic merely by depressing the safety lever at the same time the trigger was pulled!

"That thing," said a disgusted IRS man charged with enforcing the law against illegal machine guns, "doesn't bear the slightest resemblance to a sporting gun."

Then, requesting his identity be protected, the IRS man disclosed that

capacity. In fact, Elm told unemotionally that the company was set up financially by the House Small Business Administration loans section in Washington. The guns were never supposed to be put on public sale. Something got loused up."

The HRS man said "another agency had asked that the company be established. It was concluded he was referring obliquely to the CIA. If so, it duplicated to some degree the Erquias case."

The operation was brought to a screeching halt July 7, 1968, when the HRS ordered the registration of the Smiths. The plant itself was reportedly shut down in May. HRS sources said "some arrests" had been made but because a trial is pending no more information would be made public. When this writer attempted to learn further details, he received unsolicited long distance telephone calls from HRS headquarters in Washington and California demanding to know "why" he was gathering facts.

A recent 104-page report on "Firearms, Violence and Civil Disorders," prepared by Arnold Katz of the Stanford Research Institute for the National Advisory Commission on Civil Disorders, does not concern itself with machine guns or other fully automatic weapons.

The report cost its sponsors—two of the nation's largest firearms manufacturers, Winchester and Remington—\$35,000. It concludes that "guns have not played a major role in America's urban riots to date, but exaggerated press reports of rioters using guns have apparently frightened many citizens into arming themselves for future disorders."

This report may be correct with regard to the frightened citizens (though there is no concrete evidence), but is inaccurate on the subject of urban riots. The Stanford Research Institute study, which is addressed to the White House as the word on firearms, violence and civil disorder, is convinced that reports about civilians using firearms (not to mention machine guns) during urban riots is pretty much accurate.

It will be very difficult to convince Cleveland, Ohio, Police Chief Michael Blackwell of that.

He told Mayor Carl Stokes on July 30, 1968, that if the mayor had not ordered white policemen out of the violence-torn eastside area of the city earlier in the month that the officers "would have walked into a slaughter."

Chief Blackwell said there was evidence that black nationalists who ambushed police, touching off a savage gun battle that killed 10 persons, had "tripod military type machine guns" and would have used them had the white officers not been withdrawn.

The chief disclosed that police informants saw at least one machine gun and that the black nationalists had stitched ammunition belts which would have been useful in any other type of weapon.

"They (Cleveland officers) should thank their lucky stars they were pulled out. There were machine guns up there waiting for them," Chief Blackwell said. Then he declined to amplify the disclosure. Once again the curtain was drawn around the subject of machine guns and a news blackout was on.

However, Chief Blackwell did say that he didn't know where the machine guns are now. Nonetheless, his own intelligence unit recovered 15 high-powered weapons, including one machine gun, from the charred ruins of an apartment house in which a black nationalist died in the gun battle, according to an Associated Press report from the embattled city.

Where might these lethal, high-powered weapons have been obtained? They could have been bought from the CIA's underground factories, or they could have been stolen from the military, or they could have even been purchased from the Army, indirectly. According to the Stanford Research Institute's report, the U.S. Army has indeed been duped by extremist groups in the past into indiscriminate selling of weapons.

Admitting deep concern over the proliferation of paramilitary organizations, the Stanford report says the Civilian Marksmanship Program administered by the Secretary of the Army in conjunction with the National Rifle Association sold excess military firearms and ammunition at reduced prices to not only the all-white Minutemen but in 1967 to a group called RAM (Revolutionary Action Movement). RAM is the parent organization of UHURU, the Afro-American Youth Association, Afro-Student Association and the Black Panther Party. RAM is aligned with the Communist Viet Cong under leadership of the notorious Robert Williams, a fugitive American now in Peking, China.

The House Committee on Un-American Activities considers RAM one of the most dangerous radical groups in America.

The purchases of these military arms were made by subversives of every stripe who formed phony gun clubs which then joined the NRA (which has since repudiated them and set up a careful screening process).

Lamentably, the five-month, \$35,000 study concludes also that "there is no information as to who is buying firearms by age group, sex or race, or the declared motivation for purchase . . ." The report also says "adequate information is also not available as to the number of guns stolen or transferred annually, the number of guns in the inventory of individual possession in each state or city, or the number of guns currently being sold to residents of each state or city."

The Stanford Research Institute "estimate" is that individuals possess at least 115 million firearms—maybe as many as 200 million, or one for every man, woman and child in the U.S. Considering the number the Stanford Research Institute does not know about, as for example military thefts, there's no doubt about it.

If motivation for buying weapons is a mystery to Stanford's learned scientists, they might do well to consult some of the 115-to-200 million owners. Today, in an America rent by turmoil and conflict, where there is at least one gun for every man, woman and child, there is great fear that extremist activity will precipitate a virtual civil war. And if the extremists

start shooting for keeps, they will do so with sophisticated weapons sold to them by the CIA factories (that may still be going today, or with modern weapons supplied by an unwitting military establishment.

Little wonder, then, that so many people feel uneasy about the gun situation today. They've been reading about RAM and they've been reading about the Minutemen . . . and wondering what other extremist groups are stockpiling weapons, just waiting for their day . . .

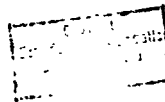

5. It is requested that Mr. and Mrs. Gallo be met at Kennedy Airport by a welcoming officer, and that they be given all possible help to facilitate their going through customs, I & NS, etc. Every possible courtesy should be extended them.

6. Mr. Gallo knows both Earl Williamson and Harry Mahoney of WH/COG by their true names. Their names may be used as bona fides by the welcoming officer.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

SUBJECT: Operational Meetings with Manolo Ray

1. Manolo Ray arrived in Washington, D.C., by air from San Juan, Puerto Rico, on 20 March 1967 on a personal business trip. At the request of AMBADGER he phoned the writer and we met for approximately 1 1/2 hours in the bar of the Hotel Ambassador in downtown Washington. This meeting was followed by a luncheon meeting on 21 March at the Occidental Restaurant. Ray returned to San Juan on 22 March. The following are the highlights of our conversations.

a. Ray claims he has "lost access" with the MIG pilot whom he had previously reported as a defection target. He no longer has any means of contacting him or of knowing his present whereabouts or attitude.

b. He claimed he does not have any direct communication--or access--to any significant military or government officials in the Castro regime.

c. He still maintains his half hour radio broadcast over Puerto Rican radio stations. This program is prepared by his people and the radio time donated so the cost is minimal.

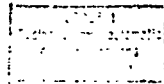
d. Although he maintains contact with active members of his "movement" they have no present or projected plans for "action" except in the propaganda field.

e. His business in the prefabricated housing field is progressing satisfactorily. He has obtained private financing to start a prefab plant in Santo Domingo and recently visited Panama where the prospects are good.

2. Future Plans:

a. Ray mentioned that his organization plans to send a representative to Mexico City before the end of March to talk to Gustavo Arcos' sister who recently left Cuba. Ray is

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anxious to do everything possible to assist Arcos in obtaining his freedom but admitted he had no commo or means of making contact with him in prison.

b. Ray is interested in expanding his propaganda radio broadcasts. He spoke in terms of renting time on a U.S. short wave station to beam broadcasts to Cuba. This would be done at his own expense. He also mentioned that during Reid's former administration in the Dominican Republic he had been promised a site and permission to set up a short wave station for Cuban broadcasts. He may explore this possibility with Balaguer's present government during one of his business trips to the D.R. I suggested he sound out other stations in L.A. to see if he could get some free time and replay for his Puerto Rican material and have since mailed him via AMBADGER a list of stations in L.A. who are known to have accepted and used other Cuban exile tape broadcasts. At my suggestion he prepared a brief outline of what he would like to do in the radio/propaganda field and what he would hope to accomplish.

3. Ray mentioned that he thought someone should utilize Pardo Llada, who now lives and works on a newspaper in Cali, Colombia, in propaganda activity against Castro.

4. He did not ask or hint for any financial assistance for his organization.

5. We discussed briefly the Olympic Games to be held in Winnipeg, Canada, this summer. AMBADGER had asked him to bring up the subject. I told him in essence that we were not interested in inducing the defection of any athletes but that if he received any information indicating that any of the Cuban officials attending the games might be disaffected we would be interested in checking out any leads.

6. In general Ray was as usual pleasant, friendly and talkative. It is evident that he is now concentrating on earning a living for himself and his family. However, at the same time he maintains a keen interest in Cuban

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developments; hope to maintain somewhat of a name for himself and his organization in exile circles by a limited amount of propaganda activities and stands ready and willing to help in any major plans if and when they should ever materialize.

7. Regular contact will be maintained with Ray in Puerto Rico by AMBADGER who Ray speaks highly of and is pleased with the handling arrangement.

MIG-21--Defecting Pilot--et al.


1. In lengthy discussions on this point it developed that Ray has been unable to obtain any more pertinent information since he first called the matter to AMBADGER's attention almost two months ago. The basis of the "Mig Plot" is a tip he received from an inside contact which was brought to him by someone exiting Cuba. Ray considers the inside contact reliable but prefers not to identify him. Ray has not been able to determine if the inside contact is personally in contact, or can arrange contact, with the Mig Pilot who reportedly is fed up with the situation in Cuba and plans to defect with his airplane whenever he has an opportunity. The "tip" Ray received was to this effect i.e., that there is a Mig Pilot who is disenchanted and plans to defect with his plane. One point Ray was specific on was that the plane was described as "one of the smaller Migs" and according to Ray it is not a Mig-21.

2. After Ray's original contacts with AMBADGER on this subject (wherein the plane was apparently erroneously identified as a MIG-21) Ray claims he sent a message to the inside contact requesting the complete details we had asked for. He has received no reply. In response to my request at the meeting on 13 October 1966 he told me at our subsequent meeting on 15 October that he attempted to reach his inside contact by phone but was unsuccessful. He was urged to continue until he reached the party and to obtain as much detail on this matter as possible so we could hopefully clarify the situation. He assured me he would follow-through on this and report to AMBADGER. (It seemed pretty obvious to me after two discussions with Ray on this subject that he has no direct means of reaching the original reporting source on the "Mig Plot" and consequently may never be able to verify the original "tip" and obtain further details.

3. In any event I outlined for him in general the U.S. Government interest in obtaining a modern version of the MIG-21 and the financial and other rewards available to a pilot who would bring one out. I emphasized that any activity along this line would have to be strictly Ray's and the JURE's operation and done through his contacts and sources reiterating again that therefore it was essential that he confirm the plane, model, pilot, etc. reported to him to determine if the operation was feasible.

4. We spent sometime discussing his "image" both inside Cuba and with the exiles. He agreed that at the present time it could hardly be lower and something rather dramatic was needed to improve it. We both agreed that if he could pull off a successful operation to defect a MIG-21 pilot with his plane it would do much to restore his and the JURE's name and prestige.

5. Although Ray is obviously far removed from the action agent (the pilot), if such exists, the idea of the operation intrigues him and he will undoubtedly do everything he can to stimulate some action. Any further information developed by him will be forwarded to us through AMBADGER.

SUBJECT: Manolo RAY

1. The following are the highlights of meetings held with Manolo RAY in San Juan, Puerto, Rico, on 13 and 15 October 1966. The matter of the possible defection of a MIG-pilot previously reported by RAY has been covered in a separate memorandum:

Personal Situation:

a. RAY has an engineering and planning office in San Juan which he shares with Emilio Guede, a personal friend and JURE colleague who is in the publicity business. RAY said he just signed a contract for the planning of a commercial development site in San Juan, from which he will realize several thousand dollars profit. His principal (and pet) project is the promotion and attempt to raise through private funds the financing of a plant to mass produce low-cost prefabricated housing designed by him. He claims with an investment of \$200,000 he can mass produce prefabricated homes to sell for \$3,000 which would be ideal for Puerto Rico's needs.

Recent Trip to Santo Domingo:

b. RAY said his recent trip to Santo Domingo was strictly for business purposes. He hopes to start a small project in Santo Domingo to produce prefabricated housing. The small project he has in mind can get underway with an expenditure of \$80,000, which he feels confident can be raised in Santo Domingo. He said he naturally talked with some people in the government about Cuba and the JURE, but that the government must become stronger and more confident before there would be any possibility of obtaining their assistance--or blessing--in conducting any activities against Cuba.

MIG-21, Defecting Pilot, et al.

c. This matter has been covered in a separate memorandum.

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Internal Contacts.

d. One gets the impression that RAY lives somewhat removed from the actual realities of the Cuban internal situation. He has a tendency to compare the internal situation today with that which existed in Batista's time when he (RAY) was one of the leaders of the 26th of July underground resistance movement in Habana. RAY maintains direct personal contact with many new arrivals seeking asylum both in Puerto Rico and the U.S. and also undoubtedly receives a certain amount of general information and gossip from other JURE contacts and supporters. He claims to have many friends and former associates inside, which is probably true, but does not have any regular or secure means to communicate with them. It appears obvious that these friends and contacts are not working together, if at all, and that he has no cohesive resistance group or force as such inside.

I questioned him about several personalities such as Carlos Franqui, Pedro Miret, Emilio Aragones, and others. He had no specific information at all on their activities in recent months but said he "could get it if you want it." In summary on this point, it would appear that RAY and the JURE maintain no regular contact with any internal "supporters"; that he undoubtedly still has many former friends and supporters inside but just what they would do-- or how far they would go--to support him is a moot question.

JURE Propaganda Activities.

e. The JURE, Manolo RAY, Emilio Guede, and others, have a half-hour weekly program which is carried on 4 different Puerto Rican radio stations between 6:30-7:30 PM each Sunday. This program, which is taped in advance, features commentaries on news and events in Cuba, interviews with recently arrived refugees, and other items of current interest regarding Cuba. The program is composed without cost and all radio time on the 4 stations is donated free of charge.

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Future Plans.

f. RAY is a man who is relaxed, is now engaged in making a legitimate livelihood for himself, his wife and three children but still seriously dedicated and motivated towards seeking the overthrow of the Castro government. He has a realistic outlook to a considerable degree, although as mentioned in paragraph d., above, his viewpoints on the reality of the internal situation in present day Cuba are somewhat naive. As an experienced resistance organizer and fighter in the 26th of July movement against Batista, he knows the value of propaganda in preparing the general populace for resistance. He also knows that propaganda is useless and counterproductive without follow-up positive results. He speaks of continuing his local radio broadcasts (which he readily admits are useful only to maintain some spirit amongst the exiles for possible future use), and at some later date--he has no timetable--hopes to obtain facilities in Venezuela, Puerto Rico, or some other site where he can beam broadcasts into Cuba. His intention being to follow-up the broadcasts with action. He speaks again of clandestine entry into Cuba himself to contact sources within, prove to people that there is a resistance movement, and to form a nucleus for later action. He openly admits the blunder of his last "publicized" return and that if it is done again it must be completely clandestine and unannounced. He seems to have no fear of returning and claims he still has plenty of friends who would hide and help him. He made an off-hand reference to the Agency furnishing him assistance to enter clandestinely at some future date. He was told that his sources in Miami surely knew of several "family run" operations which could take him successfully to Cuba if and when he was ready to return.

Financial Situation.

g. RAY made no request for financial assistance and from all indications is doing fairly well in his local business.

2. RAY plans to travel to the U.S. in early November for about two weeks and said he would visit JURE representatives in several large cities, including D.C. He will be in touch

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with AMBADGER who will be vacationing in the U.S. at that time and hopefully they will be able to get together with the writer while in D.C. In any event, RAY obviously likes, respects and accepts AMBADGER as our go-between in San Juan and I believe he will keep AMBADGER posted on most of his activities.

3. Manolo RAY, as exiles go, certainly seems like one of the better of the lot and contact on the scene by AMBADGER on a regular basis should be adequate to keep up with his activities. Occasional contact by an Agency staff officer, however, could be useful in keeping AMBADGER's relationship fully alive.

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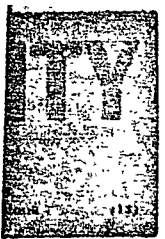
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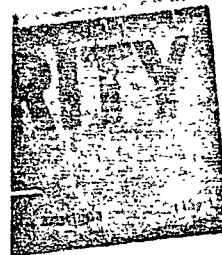

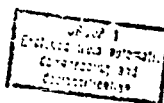
SUBJECT: AMBADGER/Manolo RAY

FILE

1. AMBADGER phoned this A.M. to tell me that he had met again with Manolo RAY on the night of 3 September. He said RAY claimed he had passed the word to his inside ~~control~~ ^{contact} (who is either the MIG pilot or the man in contact with the MIG pilot) by telephone to tell the pilot to proceed with his defection plans. AMBADGER still does not know the name of the MIG pilot or any further details concerning RAY's plans.
2. AMBADGER has another meeting scheduled with RAY on 10 September at which time RAY has promised him biographic data on two of his alleged internal contacts which emerged (??) recently after RAY's meeting with Garcia Bango in Madrid.
3. RAY still plans a seminar for JURE supporters for early October, date as yet undetermined, in San Juan. JURE supporters from Mexico, other Latin American countries, and the U.S. will be invited.
4. AMBADGER plans a two-week vacation in early October, but if RAY follows through with the seminar AMBADGER will remain in San Juan until it ends.

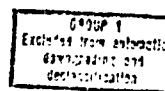

SUBJECT: Manolo RAY / File

1. During a brief TDY stopover at Headquarters on 23 August 1966, QUSPORT-1 said he had talked with Manolo RAY in San Juan, Puerto Rico on 22 August. According to QUSPORT-1, RAY had no additional pertinent information concerning his alleged inside contacts or his recent meeting with Garcia Bango in Madrid, Spain. RAY continues to insist that he has inside support in Cuba and contacts who are anti-regime and prepared to assist him when needed. He did not reveal to QUSPORT-1, however, who the people were or where they are located.

2. RAY told QUSPORT-1 that he wanted very much to see the writer concerning a delicate operational matter. When pressed by QUSPORT-1 RAY said he had access to a MIG pilot in Cuba who was ready and anxious to leave Cuba and was willing to fly out a MIG aircraft. RAY did not mention the name or location of the pilot or the model MIG aircraft he was flying. Neither did he discuss his ways and means of communication with the pilot and how he had determined the pilot's intentions to defect with his airplane. RAY told QUSPORT he wanted to discuss the matter with the writer. He admitted that a MIG aircraft might not now have as much value to the U. S. because of the recent access to a MIG-21 in Isreal but that it would have tremendous propaganda value if a Cuban pilot defected and brought out a MIG. He said he particularly wanted to discuss the matter with the writer because if the operation were successful he did not want Manuel Artime and the MRR or any other exile group taking credit. He wanted to make sure that he and his group received all the propaganda advantage which he would in turn exploit internally as further evidence to his supporters inside that the JURE was active on the island. RAY in the latter part of the conversation on this subject when he learned QUSPORT-1 was coming to Washington the following day, asked him to check with the writer to determine if it was OK for him (RAY) to discuss this subject with AMBADGER. (AMBADGER is the man who was recently introduced to RAY in San Juan by Harry Mahoney as the man who would insure that any information RAY wanted passed to the Agency would reach them.) QUSPORT told RAY that if he did not receive a phone call from him before the evening of 20 August he should give AMBADGER all the details.

3. I told QUSPORT to phone RAY and assure him that I wanted him to pass all the details to AMBADGER even though according to QUSPORT-1's arrangement this was not necessary. QUSPORT-1 was unable, however, to reach RAY by phone during the afternoon of 20 August.

4. About 8 p. m. on 20 August I received a collect phone call from AMBADGER from San Juan. AMBADGER was very excited and said he had to see me right away. After he settled down a bit he told me he had just left RAY and his two local lieutenants Emilio GUEDE and Arturo VILLAR (the so-called triumvirate of the JURE). He said RAY had contacted him and the four of them discussed the possibility of defecting a Cuban MIG pilot and having him bring out his plane. In essence and from what I could discuss over the phone the details were substantially the same as those given to me by QUSPORT-1 earlier in the day. AMBADGER said he needed my guidance right away and further urged me to come to San Juan to discuss the matter with RAY who was pressing AMBADGER to see me. He said he had agreed to see RAY later that night. I told AMBADGER I could not make the trip in the next few days and that further there were a few basic facts I needed to convince me that RAY really had the potential to pull off the operation. I told AMBADGER to see RAY later that evening and to try and determine the following:

- a. Name of the MIG pilot.
- b. Military field where he is stationed.
- c. Type MIG he flies.
- d. RAY's commo if any with the pilot.
- e. Estimated timing for the defection, i. e. . has the pilot indicated he was ready to defect and awaiting instructions, etc.

I asked AMBADGER to phone me if he could develop any further information. AMBADGER phoned Mr. Mahoney on the afternoon of 24 August to report he had attempted to obtain further details from RAY following his conversations with the writer but that RAY had replied he did not know the name of the pilot or other details of the operation. (See Mr. Mahoney's memo attached)

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5. As soon as time permits I plan a short trip to San Juan to see AMBADGER and to sit down with RAY and try and clear up many of the obvious questions concerning his Madrid/Cuban internal contacts and the MIG pilot.

SUBJECT: MIG 21

1. Approximately 2030 hours on 23 August 1966 DC WFL C. Williamson called me to report that he had just received a call from AMBADGER from San Juan, Puerto Rico. AMBADGER had a report from AVBANG that agents of his inside Cuba were prepared to fly a MIG 21 to the United States. Williamson asked AMBADGER for more information, but AMBADGER claimed that he did not have any additional details. In view of AVBANG's previous reluctance to source his information there is always a certain skepticism about AVBANG's claims of accomplishments. Williamson told AMBADGER to find out from AVBANG the who, where, how, what, when, and how and to report back. AMBADGER stated that he did not have this information but they planned to go ahead with the operation. Williamson told him that if a Cuban pilot wanted to fly a MIG 21 to the U.S. we could do nothing to stop him.

2. At 1400 hours on this date AMBADGER called me to report that he had discussed Williamson's suggestions with AVBANG who had replied that he honestly didn't know the name of the pilot or the details of the operation. In short, he had been informed by a contact of his in Cuba that some of his people were going to steal a MIG 21. AMBADGER commented that AVBANG did not appear to be evasive or reluctant to discuss the matter but apparently didn't know the details. In any event, AVBANG stated that they were going ahead with the operation and planned to "do some damage" before they left and AMBADGER asked for my approval. I told AMBADGER that I could not approve anything like that and thought that the chance of losing the aircraft outweighed the possible gain. I suggested that if they were going ahead with the operation anyway it would be of more value to just get the aircraft. AMBADGER replied that AVBANG appeared adamant in this respect and wanted to be certain that if the operation was successful that he be allowed to take all the credit for it. I replied that if in fact he was responsible for the operation he could have all the credit.

3. I have called Lt. Col. Norman H. Stazer, Yellow Sands Office, U.S. Air Force, extension 3207 and informed him that there is the possibility of a MIG 21 pilot defecting to the U.S. with his aircraft. He in turn has alerted the Southeast Air Defense Command who will be on the alert for such a possibility.



1. The following information supplemental to references was acquired during two station meetings with AMBANG-1 (21 and 23 June 1967) and several meetings with QUERTEL-1 during the same period.

2. AMBANG-1 expects that Subject (201-772270) will be returning to Cuba in the near future. (In relation to the return of Subject to Cuba, Subject told QUERTEL-1 on 12 July that he had received permission to return and had discussed this with AMJMSH-1 earlier that same day.) Although AMBANG-1 expressed doubts concerning the character and general reputation of Subject, he nevertheless felt that Subject, in conjunction with his brother (201-772272), had potential for contact within military circles inside Cuba.

3. In general no definite plans were made during the conversations between AMBANG-1 and Subject in Madrid. However, various means of communication were established for future contact:

A. Mail. AMBANG-1 gave Subject three different mail drops in the United States (New York, Miami, and San Juan, Puerto Rico) for his correspondence to AMBANG-1 from inside Cuba.

B. Telephone. In the event that telephone contact is desired, Subject is to call heretic "Berrita" FERRERIGUEZ, who resides in Miami and is the daughter of the former owner of the Portage Cigarette Company in Cuba. FERRERIGUEZ in turn is to contact AMBANG-1. (continued)

C. Personal Meetings. The following plan was established for personal meetings. Subject will send a picture of a boat that is utilized by INDER for excursions to AMBANG-1 via mail drop. It appears that INDER has boats which are rented to sportsmen for deep sea fishing trips. AMBANG-1, in turn, will attempt to procure a boat identical to that in the picture sent by Subject. Accordingly, on given instructions the boat rented by INDER will depart from a point in Cuba, heading for another port in Cuba. All official Cuban Government communication regarding the clearances necessary for the INDER boat will be made by INDER prior to the departure of the boat. The INDER boat would then depart Cuba, heading out to sea ostensibly destined for Havana. The two boats (the INDER boat and the identical boat acquired by AMBANG-1) will rendez-vous on high seas and make appropriate exchanges; then the INDER boat will return to its port of destination.

D. Contact with 301-736492. In San Juan the contact between AMBANG-1 and 301-736492 will be made through "El Sordo", who is a cousin of Subject's family and resides in San Juan.

4. AMBANG-1 commented that he had a 102-foot boat which he is willing and intends to use against Vidal. He lamented the fact that approximately \$80,000 worth of arms had been lost in Santo Domingo as a result of the insurrection in that country.

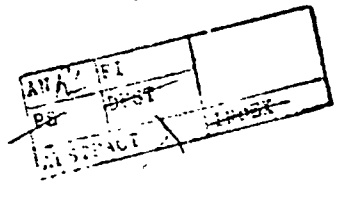

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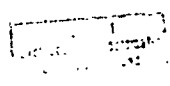

SUBJECT: IDEN A

1. IDEN A telephoned IDEN B on 15 June 1966 who asked him to come to Madrid as soon as possible so that he could be back in San Juan before the 25th of June. The implication was that IDEN A should be back in San Juan in time to talk to a PBRUMEN who was with the PBRUMEN delegation to the Tenth Central American and Caribbean Games. (IDEN C, was a delegate to the Games).
2. IDEN A and IDEN B developed a plan that involved two action agents already inside PBRUMEN. One was to assassinate AMTHUG either by rifle fire or remote controlled radio activated explosives while the other agent was to establish a military base in the central part of PBRUMEN. Station Madrid spoke with IDEN A who reported that he believed AMTHUG would topple within the next few months and that he already had a group inside PBRUMEN.
3. IDEN A was interviewed upon his return to San Juan where he reported that he did not have any firm evidence that AMTHUG would topple within the next few months but only that he intuitively believed that AMTHUG's downfall was imminent. He based this on reports that things were getting worse in PBRUMEN and that the people were ready to revolt. He also based it on the fact that he now has two action agents of the same caliber as AMLASH inside PBRUMEN who are ready to do his bidding.
4. IDEN A's 'agents' inside PBRUMEN are probably IDEN C, who might cooperate with IDEN B but not necessarily

with IDEN A. Further there is no firm evidence that IDEN C is against the present regime in PERUMEN. IDEN D is another possible contact. Again, other than some unsupported allegations there is no independent firm evidence that IDEN D is anti-regime.

5. IDEN A also claimed in Madrid that IDEN E had sent him a message and that he was considered a potential ally. He explained this in San Juan by saying that during a press conference his name had been mentioned and that IDEN E replied that he considered IDEN A to be his friend. IDEN A rationalized that if IDEN E had not wanted to indicate in some way that he was "with" IDEN A he would have taken this opportunity to blast him.

6. I debriefed IDEN A on his Madrid trip and intentions generally before I introduced him to AMBADGER/1. I had first asked him if he would mind reporting to us via a trusted PERUMEN exile now living in San Juan and, after I had identified AMBADGER/1, he replied that he knew him and respected and liked him. The three of us had a meeting and it was agreed that IDEN A would keep AMBADGER/1 completely informed of his plans and that AMBADGER/1 would convey them to me in PERPRIME. IDEN A refused to reveal the identities of his agents inside PERUMEN despite strong pressure. He also stated that IDEN F and IDEN G would have to know about his arrangement with AMBADGER/1 and with KUBARK. IDEN F and IDEN G, together with IDEN A, are the triumvirate of the JURE.

SUBJECT: Meeting with AMBANG-1, 28 April 1966

1. On 28 April 1966 the undersigned, using the name Andrews as in the past, contacted AMBANG-1 (201-239298) at the Hotel Sheraton in San Juan, Puerto Rico. The following points were discussed, in addition to matters pertaining to a projected meeting of Cuban exiles, covered in a separate memo.

a. AMBANG seemed much less aggressive than when I used to talk to him a year and a half ago. He seemed dispirited about the exiles and their chances of ever doing anything to settle affairs in Cuba.

b. The exiles do not seem to have any plans for doing much of anything. AMBANG-1 agreed that the overthrow of Castro will probably come from the inside, and that the exiles will have little influence on the move that accomplishes it. AMBANG-1 feels this is not all to the bad since, as he says, there are a number of good men in Cuba in important posts who have gotten sucked bit by bit into support of communism but are really not communists. I told him I believed the US would probably be willing to deal with such persons if they achieved the overthrow of the regime and that the US would probably oppose a wave of vengeance against "decent revolutionaries". I told him this because I thought there was some chance he might spread it about and the word might get back to "decent revolutionaries" in Cuba.

c. In general, AMBANG-1 had less information on the purge situation than I did. He told me that relatives of Gustavo ARCOS (201-205568) in Puerto Rico had been in telephone contact with the family inside

Cuba about 25 April, that Arcos was as of that date still in prison but the charges against him were thin and it was hoped he would be out in a few days. (This means there was at least one more telephone call than we knew of previously, and this has probably served to increase the pressure on Arcos). I asked AMBANG-1 if his contact with Arcos in late 1964 might not have been responsible for the arrest. AMBANG-1 said he did not think so. We talked some about the symbolic value of the Arcos family and I expressed a strong interest in Arcos's welfare and in getting the latest news about him. I did this on the chance that AMBANG-1 might assume Arcos had been our agent and we were concerned about him. I do not know if he will actually construe my remark in this way, however, but it seemed like an opening to use an important exile channel as a possible deception mechanism. AMBANG said he does not believe there is any truth to the charge of financial dishonesty levelled against Arcos.

d. Rene RODRIGUEZ Cruz (201-224329): AMBANG-1 regards him as a compulsive, capable of doing harm to anyone, including Fidel Castro. AMBANG-1 knows him quite well but does not know his associate, Carlos Laplace, who shows up in Mexico from time to time.

I raised the matter of Rene RODRIGUEZ merely to sound AMBANG out, but it may be he thinks we have some special interest in him.

e. About Osmani CIENFUEGOS (201-270164), AMBANG stated he was a member of the PSP in the middle 1950's. He is a competent architect but otherwise a person of limited capacity. He is not a member of the inner circle of the Old Guard PSP and never was. He got involved with the PSP out of opportunism, he is a schemer, self seeker and very unreliable.

f. I told AMBANG I had heard Emilio Aragonés had been arrested. AMBANG was surprised and said he would inform me if he heard anything about it. I raised this to supplement rumors I am trying to spread through exile mechanisms.


g. AMBANG stated that Pedro Miret (201-169120) is a man of slight capacity who would not be to upset of the Castro regime fell so long as he did not get his throat cut in the progress. I expressed a great deal of interest in Miret, asking especially why he should have been selected to make two recent trips to Moscow. AMBANG did not have any idea. I raised the subject of Miret, again, to put him into the exile rumor mill as a person of special interest to the US, and thus to flesh out some of the other parts of our program.

h. Armando Hart (201-222675), according to AMBANG, does not have the qualities of an administrator but he is very good at situating himself politically, organizing politically and, in general, wheeling and dealing. He is NOT under his wife's thumb, as many say. AMBANG regards Hart as a much more decent person than Aragones and to be well placed in Aragones's old job because he does not have notoriously close connections with any of the personalities or factions within the 26th of July crowd but gets along with them all.

i. Concerning the differences between the city and sierra fighters in the 26th of July, AMBANG stated they are real and that the city group fought and suffered much more.

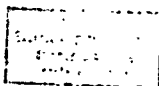
j. AMBANG believes this is not the time for the US or exiles to make menacing gestures against Cuba, for this would merely provide Castro with distractions from internal problems and perhaps enable him to rally popular support.

2. I believe that later in the summer it might be a good idea to have another talk with AMBANG to keep up with exile thinking, and feeding more deception thoughts.

SUBJECT: Manuel [✓] RAY

1. The Subject telephoned Rafael GARCIA-BANGO Dirube on 15 June 1966 who asked him to come to Madrid as soon as possible so that he could be back in San Juan before the 25th of June. The implication was that the Subject should be back in San Juan in time to talk to a Cuban who was with the Cuban delegation to the Tenth Central American and Caribbean Games. (Jorge GARCIA-BANGO Dirube, Rafael's brother, was a delegate to the Games.)

2. The Subject and Rafael GARCIA BANGO developed a plan that involved two action agents already inside Cuba. One was to assassinate Fidel Castro Ruz, either by rifle fire or remote controlled radio activated explosives while the other agent was to establish a military base in the 'central part of Cuba'. Station Madrid spoke with the Subject who reported that he believed Fidel CASTRO would topple within the next few months and that he already had a group inside Cuba.

3. The Subject was interviewed upon his return to San Juan where he reported that he did not have any firm evidence that CASTRO would topple within the next few months but only that he intuitively believed that Castro's downfall was imminent. He based this on reports that things were getting worse in Cuba and that the people were ready to revolt. He also based it on the fact that he now has two action agents 'of the same caliber as AMLASH inside Cuba' who are ready to do his bidding.


4. The Subject's 'agents' inside Cuba are probably Jorge GARCIA BANGO Dirube, who might cooperate with his

The Subject rationalized that if LLANUSA had not wanted to indicate in some way that he was 'with' the Subject he would have taken this opportunity to blast him.

4. I debriefed the Subject on his Madrid trip and intentions generally before I introduced him to AMBADGER/1. I had first asked him if he would mind reporting to us via a trusted Cuban exile now living in San Juan and, after I had identified AMBADGER/1, he replied that he knew him and respected and liked him. The three of us had a meeting and it was agreed that the Subject would keep AMBADGER/1 completely informed of his plans and that AMBADGER/1 would convey them to me in Washington. The Subject refused to reveal the identities of his agents inside Cuba despite strong pressure. SUBJECT: AMBADGER-1

1. On this date, Subject called me from San Juan, Puerto Rico to report on his meeting with AMBANG-1 on 13 July. AMBANG-1 remained adamant concerning his refusal to reveal the names of his sources inside Cuba. However, AMBADGER-1 believes that AMBANG-1 is in a better frame of mind than previously and he needs some added push to reveal the names.

2. AMBADGER suggested that Growery come to Puerto Rico to give AMBANG-1 that added push. AMBADGER-1 said that AMBANG-1 speaks fondly of Growery and he believes that Growery might convince AMBANG-1 to reveal the names. Alternatively, AMBANG-1 and AMBADGER-1 could come to Washington, D.C. for discussions with Growery.

3. I agreed to write AMBADGER-1 the details of processing his wife's citizenship. AMBADGER-1 wants to process his wife's citizenship in Montreal. I also agreed to look into the matter of transmitting money to his mother in Cuba at a rate of exchange more favorable than one to one.





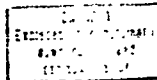

I told AMBADGER that he should be firm with REY and likened it to a blind date, i.e., it could be a beautiful romance if both sides cooperated but it would be a very bad date if he wanted it to be a one sided affair. AMBADGER is having lunch with REY this afternoon and will write me the results by airmail.

Dear Harry:

Here goes my first promised weekly report. I do not know how good they will be or what good will they do, I will just keep my fingers crossed and hope for the best.

Yesterday I got together with M.R. on the three questions and the results were completely negative.

On the first question about the Mexican visa he was as softly mad as he can get. He said that that was no way to start a relationship that was supposed to be of mutual cooperation and trust. That he was not an informer, paid informer that is, but somebody willing to give honest cooperation for the mutual benefit of the common cause. That a few days ago he sent a cable informing about the arrival of a certain person in Madrid that was believed to be of no use to us but that he knows or believes to be on the fence and ready for an approach. That if this was the way he was going to be treated by us he was perfectly willing not to continue as he had no doubt he could find other people in the government willing to listen and cooperate in more reasonable grounds. He mentioned the risks he took in Havana by meeting Jim Neal (I don't know if I got the name right) when he was Minister of Public Works with Fidel as to show his willingness to cooperate but refuses to do so on unequal grounds or without due consideration. After quietly blowing off steam for a while we went on to the second question of the Radio broadcast plans: He says that the material will be recorded here in San Juan but broadcast from outside U.S. I asked him from where and he just smiled and said, That is the other matter we have? The other matter were the addresses: His answer was that this was the same as if he had given us who his contacts in Cuba were and that he had already refused to do this. I explained as you suggested that this was for the purpose of keeping him advised of any information we may pick up regarding those addresses he did not accept this as a valid enough reason for him to furnish the addresses.

After this I went back on the three questions but he was firm and refused to budge. I believe that he is trying 1.- To obtain recognition or some kind of a commitment that will bolster his position in the already shaky position he holds at this time. 2.- To justify to himself and his followers however few they may be, that he maintains

an independent position in accordance with his stated views on this matter.
3.- He may also be feeling us out in this first interview to study our reactions and see what course to take in future meetings.

At the end of our meeting he stated again his willingness to work with us for mutual benefit and hoped that future meetings would bring a better understanding.

Although at this stage I am not very optimistic I believe nevertheless that we should keep punching to see if something can be accomplished in future contacts. Next will be Friday 8.

Your comments or suggestions before the next meeting will be most welcome.

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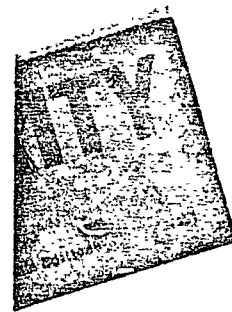

2. According to information dated August 1963, from a member of a group of Cuban emigres trained in the techniques of information collection who have provided useful information since 1961, Subject was designated chief of intelligence by the National Direction Abroad of the Junta Revolucionaria Cubana (JURE, Cuban Revolutionary Junta), an anti-CASTRO Cuban exile group. Source said the intelligence group had been created in March 1963 on the orders of the national chief of the JURE, Manuel RAY Rivero (aka Manolo RAY), for the purpose of infiltrating JURE members into the various organizations which operated in the Miami, Florida area, as well as into agencies of the United States Government; further, that in April 1963, RAY had issued orders to infiltrate a trusted JURE member into this Agency in order to learn the details of any plans with regard to Cuba. The JURE also intended to introduce into Cuba leaflets containing information of a derogatory nature regarding the United States Government. Included in these leaflets was Subject's manifesto against the United States Government and against this Agency.

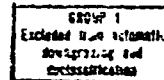

2. Manuel RAY Rivero was born on 13 June 1924 in Havana, Cuba of a middle-class family. RAY attended the University of Havana, where he received a degree in engineering. After graduation, he worked as a civil engineer in Havana until 1948, when he was awarded a scholarship to the University of Utah in recognition of his outstanding work; however, he did not receive a degree because of failure to submit a required thesis. He later became president of the Havana Society of Civil Engineers and worked on the Hotel Hilton project in Havana until 1957.

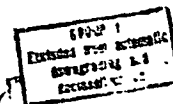
3. RAY was unknown politically until April 1957 when he joined the anti-BATISTA Movimiento de Resistencia Civica (MRC, Civic Resistance Movement). By August 1957 he had become the secretary-general of the MRC in Havana Province and was a member of the provincial directing committee of the "26th of July Movement" headed by Fidel CASTRO, and was responsible for coordination between the two groups. Under RAY's leadership the MRC was the largest and most important organization supporting the "26th of July Movement" during the last two years of the revolution. Although the MRC concentrated mostly on propaganda and logistic support, it did organize its own sabotage and action groups in late 1958.

4. RAY became a close confidant and advisor of CASTRO during 1957 and, in January 1959, was appointed Minister of Public

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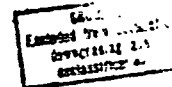

After the arrest and imprisonment of Huber MATOS in October 1959, RAY made his concern known to CASTRO and was subsequently dismissed and replaced by a Communist. He believed this would give more unity to their cause and insure against blatant failures. He was highly critical of both the invasion attempt of 1961 and with himself for giving his approval to the operation. RAY felt that his new organization would be able to avoid similar failures. So much has been said about him, pro and con, that I will confine my comments to my own personal impressions.

He is short, unimpressive and insignificant in appearance. He strikes me as intelligent, sincere, intense, and well-intentioned. He speaks very quickly and is hard to understand. He makes his points with conviction but his remarks have very little ideological content and on occasion are confusing. I know of his reputation of being able to inspire both strong loyalties and strong dislikes among Cubans, gained mainly as a result of his roles in the anti-Batista struggle and at the beginning of the Castro regime. These considerations aside, to me he seems like a pleasant but uninspiring individual, nothing more.

Manuel Ray Rivero, leader of the Junta Revolucionaria Cubana (JURE, Cuban Revolutionary Junta), will arrive in Miami from Puerto Rico on 31 July 1965 to meet with the Miami council of JURE.

Field Comment: The position of JURE within the Cuban exile community was weakened after Ray failed to keep his widely-publicized promise to land in Cuba by 20 May 1964. Since then the organization has been relatively inactive. Recently Ray has been making an effort to again establish a strong JURE. On 22 May 1965 he gave a lecture in Miami to JURE delegates from Tampa, Orlando, and Miami, in which he stressed the need to raise money for the organization. The feeling of some members who attended the lecture was that it was rather late to start asking people to contribute money to the JURE. A meeting of delegates of the JURE was held in Tampa, Florida, from 3 to 5 July 1965 to discuss the program and future plans of the JURE. On 5 and 6 July Ray held discussions with representatives of the Segundo Frente Nacional del Escambray (SFNE, Second National Front of the Escambray), concerning a unification of the two organizations.

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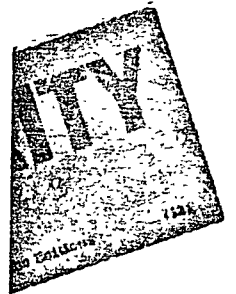

RAY CLAIMS THAT HIS PLAN IS IN AGREEMENT, OR HAS BEEN COORDINATED, WITH UNNAMED AMERICAN OFFICIALS WHO OPPOSE "CIA POLICY" REGARDING CUBA.

1. Further to our telephone conversation of 16 June we should like to clarify that whereas it is true that we had, and to a limited degree have, contact with Manuel Ray, who apparently bought some of the arms impounded by the California authorities in the Erquiaga plant, we are in no way connected with Subject. Ray purchased these weapons strictly on his own initiative. He was neither counselled to do so by us nor have we ever referred him to Erquiaga. Furthermore this Agency has no connection whatever with any of the individuals mentioned in the paragraph 1 listing of reference. What little contact we maintain with Ray is mainly within the context of our general interest in keeping abreast of Cuban exile activities. Our interest in Erquiaga, therefore, was in keeping with this general interest.

2. We are most appreciative of your Los Angeles office's efforts on our behalf. Should the FBI query your Los Angeles office about our interest and connections with Subject it is suggested that they answer along the lines set forth above. It is also requested that your office continue to keep us apprised of the current developments in this case.

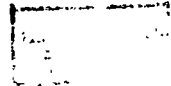

1. The following is meant to clarify ref. (a), and to bring you up-to-date. An unnamed source of FBI-LA advised that office that subject, then representing the last three of the above business styles, called on him in April and inquired as to the latter's ability to turn out vaguely described metal products, supposedly office equipment items. This presumably was a pretext as subject called again in May, then representing Communications Specialties, and asked if (this FBI) source could manufacture about 1,000 silencers, for use on 9 mm machine pistols, and meant (very confidentially) for a customer in northern California. Subject implied for himself an earlier association with Consolidated Electrodynamics Corp., a highly reputable scientific instrument manufacturer, and with Aerojet General Corp., which we know to be dabbling in ordnance specialties. Subject also made reference to some vague sales or business relationship with "the City of Commerce concern that was raided recently", undoubtedly Erquiaga Arms Co.

2. FBI-LA feels it must alert Customs on the off-chance that subject may be exporting this item, and also that it cannot afford not to advise the State of California Department of Justice, since mere possession of a silencer is a felony, and prior knowledge, in the event there was a major incident of any kind, would be difficult to explain.

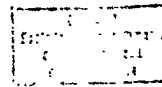

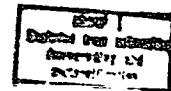

Mr. F: I just wanted to bring you up to date on Ori and Busch. Ori is on a hunger strike in the Orange County Jail. He's in pretty bad shape but everyone is pretty firm. He will be arraigned tomorrow. I have gotten in touch with a priest who is a friend of Jack Vaughan. He needs some way to save face. Busch told the doctors that if he loses consciousness to rush him to the hospital.

Mr. F: There's another way to save face. When arraigned tomorrow, have the judge order him fed intravenously. Put him in a prison hospital.

Mr. C: He wants a press conference in the jail, as one of his conditions for stopping his hunger strike. He says he has bombshell announcements to make re his involvement in CIA activities. I told Father Hays who knows nothing of this and told him Busch was a rather adroit fellow. Anyway, I wanted to warn you of the revelation. He said to me "I understand he wants to have his bail made once he's out of jail, and plans to make more statements. Well, hell, he can make any statement he wants to once he's out of jail."

Mr. F: The only trouble with this thing is that this guy is going to start talking about CIA and CIA hasn't got a tinker's damn of saying anything.

Mr. C: Oh, we'll do something about that. He's being arraigned tomorrow with bond being set at \$1000.

Mr. F: \$1000 is pretty cheap. In fact, it's an insult.

Mr. C: Well, they felt a little vulnerable so they are knocking it down. It normally is \$5000.

Mr. F: My feeling is that I'm sorry we're enforcing the law. He's a kook but a lot of these kooks could keep Fidel off balance.

Mr. C: It's a much higher price to pay in terms of propaganda loss.

On another subject,

Mr. F: We'll be sending you over a note about this but I got a call from Manolo Ray. The case is still under way, but he had an offer from someone in the local government to see what they could do to get the case dropped. I said that the USG was not going to get involved but if he had personal friends who could talk to the California authorities there, we would not interfere. You know who started this thing off? IN Our friends in the Treasury Department. The Nicholas tax unit. They are the guys that urged the California Authorities to take action.

Mr. C: Oh no. Really?

Mr. F: Yes, sir.

Mr. C: They told me that they have never had anything to do with this.

Mr. F: Maybe in Washington, but in California they are up to their ears.

Mr. C: I will take this up with them, not from the Cuba angle but on the basis of embarrassment to Costa Rica.

Mr. F: I also noted that the documents ~~out~~^{out} of Erquiaga's files had nothing to do with Costa Rica which bears out what Rey said about the papers not being in there. Once this thing is in court, the charges cannot be dropped.

Mr. C: When is this supposed to come to trial?


Mr. F: Well, it's a funny thing, but the defense keeps asking for postponement because his lawyers are afraid he'll be thrown in jail. Apparently he is a reasonably respectable businessman but he got caught-up with Erquiaga. Last time we heard, Erquiaga was in Peru.

1. The following will bring you up-to-date.
2. As we suspected (see LANJ 8557, paragraph 2), the Search Warrant signed 26 Mar 65 was predicated upon the testimony of Desmond O'Neill, Investigator, Alcohol & Tobacco Tax Division, US Treasury Department, given the same date, to the effect that "in pursuant to his authorized legal duties" he had observed 369 machine guns and one firearms silencer inside the building at 15036 Proctor Avenue, City of Industry, California, occupied by subject. Gene Price, Special Agent, (State of California) Department of Justice, testified also that he had probable and reasonable cause to believe that subject had machine guns in its possession.
3. The affidavit in support of the Search Warrant, the Search Warrant and its return with five pages of inventoried weapons were all filed on 5 Apr 65. On the 7 Apr 65 preliminary hearing of co-defendant Lowell V. Knudson, one machine gun, two silencers, and company books and records were introduced as exhibits. Several individuals testified, including a firearms expert and Gordon Ingram. Co-defendant Knudson was represented by Donald H. Kettner. After all witnesses were heard, Knudson was held to answer and ordered to appear for arraignment in Department A of the Superior Court on 22 Apr 65. He was released on his own recognizance.
4. On 22 Apr 65, Knudson was arraigned and trial was set for 14 Jun 65 at 0900. It will then be assigned to a particular Superior Court judge. (Superior Court, Case No. 303253).
5. Incidentally, there is a fair chance that the trial judge may be A. Andrew Hawk, former shipmate and good personal friend of both the Chief and Deputy Chief, LAPD. Judge Hawk is a former GAI officer, and assistant counsel for Union Oil Company, Los Angeles.

1. This Agency has received information from the Peruvian National Intelligence Service that Juan ERQUIAGA Aizcorbe, owner of the Erquiaga Arms Company, P. O. Box 3404, City of Industry, California, is currently in Lima, Peru. Subject held a meeting with the Peruvian authorities in which he stated that at one time he was an officer in Fidel Castro's Army, but resigned upon discovering that Castro was a Communist.

2. ERQUIAGA further indicated that he was currently attempting to relocate his arms company to Peru since the U. S. Government had denied him permits to export arms from the U. S. to various unspecified countries.

3. This Agency will continue to keep your office informed concerning the activities and plans of the Subject.

1. With reference to the above trace request on Subject the following is noted. On 2 April 1965, a felony complaint was filed by the California State Department of Justice against Juan Arzorbe Erquiaga and Lowell Knudson of the Erquiaga Arms Company accusing them of: a) possession of machine guns and offering them for sale, b) possession of silencers for machine guns. Knudson appeared for arraignment on this date with counsel and was released on his own recognizance. Erquiaga was not present and also on this date, a warrant was issued for his arrest. The case is scheduled to be tried in the Superior Court of Los Angeles on 14 June 1965.

2. The background to the above is that on 29 March 1965, California State and U.S. Treasury agents, on instructions from California State Attorney General Thomas Lynch raided the Erquiaga Arms Company at 15036 Proctor Avenue, City of Industry, California seizing 373 machine guns and some silencers. The raid was ordered by Lynch because the firm did not have a state license authorizing the manufacture, sale and transport of machine guns.

3. Extensive press coverage was given to the seizure, and Attorney General Lynch gave statements to the effect that the

was also reported that "private" sources of the Costa Rican military organizations in California. Knaulson publically denied this and stated the arms were purchased by the Government of Costa Rica and had been manufactured with ODACID approval. Some press releases noted the arms were actually destined for Cuban exile sources and bore the markings "JURE". Knaulson also stated that the Erquiaga Company possessed a Federal license which precepted a state license for manufacture of machine guns. According to the press, Erquiaga left the U.S. for Guatemala in early February 1965.

4. For Station information only: For some time in the past, KUSAM and ODACID had been aware that Manuel Antonio Ray Rivero, Cuban exile leader of the group, Junta Revolucionaria Cubana (JURE) had ordered arms from the Erquiaga Company and was seeking ways to export them out of the country. Moreover, it was known that Ray had secured the backing of the highest official circles in the Government of Costa Rica to set as consignee for arms order *La ERQUIAGA* *RECEIVED* In October 1964, ODACID requested a request from the Erquiaga Arms Company for an export license in which the consignee was listed as "Casa Presidencial, Costa Rica". *RECEIVED* San Jose was requested to confirm the transaction prior to issuance of any license.

5. At this juncture, in the official discussions which

were held with officials of the Government of Costa Rica, these were advised that ONYX was in no way involved in the arrangement for procurement of these arms and this was to be considered strictly an independent act on the part of Ray. It was explained that Ray would have to abide by all the legal export regulations for these arms ~~which~~ ^{and this} possibly would present difficulties. The decision as to whether or not to aid Ray was left completely up to the Costa Ricans, but it was noted to them that the consignment could well become a political hot potato for them in the future. CACID did not issue the export license and at the time it was believed that the Costa Ricans had withdrawn their sponsorship of the arms order. However, it subsequently came to light that the Costa Ricans in fact never did rescind the original purchase order, ~~from Erquiaga~~. (See para. 7 below)

6. 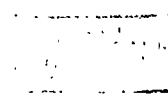

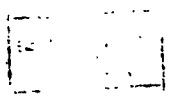
MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

SUBJECT: Conversation with ANBANG/1, 7 April 1965

1. Subject phoned (collect) from San Juan on the morning of 7 April 1965. The undersigned, whom he calls Antonelli, spoke with him. ANBANG/1 (A/1) wanted to know whether we had any further information on the status of the legal case arising from the seizure of the arms being manufactured for him by the Erquiaga Manufacturing Company. He was told that we had received further information indicating that the case was undertaken by the state authorities and that there were some irregularities involved in the search warrant. Under the circumstances, we plan to take no action to interfere with the legal process since it would appear that the manufacturer has a very good case, and since federal involvement with publicity hungry state authorities could lead to totally counterproductive publicity and complications. A/1 said he understood and agreed. He asked how long the matter might be delayed. He was advised that this would have to be checked with the manufacturer's attorney, but since the seizure took place, it would appear that the court would have to take prompt action to rule on its legality. He was told that a hearing was scheduled for 6 or 7 April on the matter.

2. He said that he had checked with his man in Costa Rico who had spoken with President Orlich and with Daniel Oduber. They had advised that they cannot receive the arms in Costa Rico at the present time because of publicity and scandal raised by the opposition. They are willing to consider the matter later. A/1 said that the manufacturer had been unable to locate in his files the original purchase order for the arms which was signed by Oduber. A/1 said that he has a signed copy in his possession. He was advised not to use this without checking with Oduber since its use might hurt Oduber's chances of winning the presidential elections. A/1 said he would not use this paper since he agreed that the friendship of the PLN is more important, even than the arms, which are the key to his current plans. He praised the PLN's past support and said he did not want to risk losing this support.

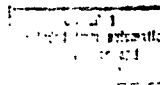

1. AS BEST WE SEE IT, SEIZURE REPORTED IN REF (C) IS LONG STORY. ACTUALLY OUR DELAY IN REPLYING TO REF (B) WAS PURELY DISCRETIONARY, SINCE THE WIND HAS BEEN BLOWING STRONG ON THE WEST COAST WITH TREASURY (ACCOUNT THE KENNEDY ASSASSINATION), AND WITH CALIFORNIA (THEN) ATTORNEY GENERAL (WHOSE PRINCIPAL WOPPIES SEEMED TO BE FASCISTS AND RIGHT-WINGERS) AGAINST GUN MANUFACTURERS, DEALERS, ETC. AS A CONSEQUENCE, IT SEEMED THAT ERQUIAGA'S PROBLEMS WERE INEVITABLE, THOUGH POSSIBLY NOT ALTOGETHER DESERVED.

2. SEVERAL MONTHS AGO, NEW CALIFORNIA ATTORNEY GENERAL LYNCH (ROSK, HIS PREDECESSOR, WENT TO STATE SUPREME COURT) HAD STATE

DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE LAUNCH SERIES OF INVESTIGATIONS, GETTING INTO THE SAME ACT THAT SENATOR DODD WAS INITIATING AT FEDERAL LEVEL. SOME TREASURY PEOPLE, PIQUED BY SUBJECT'S HAVING OBTAINED A LICENSE TO MANUFACTURE, APPEAR TO HAVE BEEN WILLING TO ASSIST STATE AND COUNTY AUTHORITIES. UP TO THE TIME OF THE RAID, THE LOCAL SHERIFF'S STATION DIDN'T KNOW ANYTHING ABOUT SUBJECT.

3. THE 26 MAR 65 RAID WAS UNDER THE AEGIS OF THE CALIFORNIA (STATE) DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE. THE GUNS WERE BOOKED INTO THE LOS ANGELES SHERIFF'S OFFICE. PRESUMABLY TITLE IS STILL IN SUBJECT. DISPOSITION WILL PROBABLY BE DETERMINED BY THE COURT, AND MAY WELL BE RETURNED TO SUBJECT.

4. IT DOES NOT APPEAR THAT THE SEIZURE WAS WELL THOUGHT OUT. HOWEVER, WHAT SEEMS TO BE POSSIBLE BUT NOT SIGNIFICANT CONTACT WITH SEVERAL RIGHT WINGERS IS BEING BLOWN UP INTO JUSTIFICATION FOR THE RAID, WITH OMINOUS REFERENCES TO PRIVATE ARMIES, AGAINST WHICH THERE IS A BILL IN THE STATE HOPPER.

1. Subject phoned (collect) on 1 April to determine what information I had arrived at concerning the seizure of arms being made to his order by the ERQUIAGA Manufacturing Company.


2. I told him as far as we were able to determine on the basis of incomplete information that the arms had been seized by the State of California and that their legal right to effect the seizure is open to question. I said I could not give him more definite information because we are awaiting word on the specific statutory authority for the seizure.

3. He said that in view of this situation he will proceed on the premise that the arms will probably be returned and will continue efforts to arrange the exportation.

4. I told him that the seizure had caused quite a public stir in Costa Rica, and while we did not have all the facts, it might be well for him to check on the current climate there. He said he would.

5. He claims that he now has DR agreement to import the arms and that the question of re-export to Venezuela has been abandoned.

6. He will phone on 6 April to see if we have further information.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

SUBJECT: Communication from AMBANG, 29 March 1965

1. AMBANG (A) phoned (collect) from Puerto Rico on 29 March 1965. He said that the seizure of arms being manufactured for his organization by the ERQUIAGA Manufacturing Company in the Los Angeles area of California was very damaging to his plans. He said there were some 493 submachine guns being manufactured by this company. 20 of these are for replacements for possibly defective guns. He said each weapon is marked with a special mark and a serial number which will make them attributable to his organization. He further said that the guns were paid for except for \$9000. Erquiaga left California about a month ago with the job unfinished, and A said that they had been negotiating with Erquiaga's partner. He did not give the name of this individual. He said that there was some question as to how much was owed on the arms, but that the partner had agreed on the \$9000 figure.


2. A asked if we could arrange to have the arms released.

3. I said that I would have to look into the legal aspects of the problem since the question of the title and the charges under which they were confiscated would have to be clarified. I pointed out to A that if the title had not yet passed to him despite his payments, and if the charges under which the arms were seized are valid, he might have no other recourse than a civil suit against the Erquiaga Company to recover the money paid.

4. A was very insistent that he must have those specific arms because of the markings and the importance of the psychological effect that these would create.

5. I asked how long he would be in Puerto Rico and he said he would remain a week or ten days. I told him that I could not give him an answer at this time, and it was agreed he would phone me again on Thursday, 1 April.

6. Immediately after this conversation, I contacted Mr. Mayo Stunz in OO, who agreed to query his Los Angeles office immediately to find out the legal status of the seizure.

Seized M-1 Rifle Linked To Extremist Leader

INDUSTRY, Calif., March 27 (UPI) — A rifle belonging to the California leader of an "extreme racist" group was found today among hundreds of weapons confiscated by sheriffs deputies in a raid on a gun factory in this industrial suburb of Los Angeles.

State Attorney General Thomas C. Lynch said an M-1 rifle which records showed belonged to Terrell Eddy of San Diego, was among the weapons seized by 30 State agents and sheriffs deputies last night.

Lynch described Eddy as "the California leader of the extreme fascist National States Rights Party."

In addition to the rifle, 373 machine guns and 100,000 rounds of ammunition were seized.

Lynch said at least some of the weapons were destined for extreme right wing groups which have "private armies."

The M1 rifle, he said, was left at the Erquiaga Arms Co., apparently so it could be converted into a semiautomatic weapon.

Lynch said the group was "closely associated" with the Ku Klux Klan and had headquarters in Birmingham, Ala.

The raid on the arms factory last night was the culmination of several months of investigation. No arrests were made.

There were three employees present and they said the owner, Juan Erquiaga, left for Guatemala Feb. 6. Erquiaga was once a member of Fidel Castro's revolutionary forces in Cuba but has since become anti-Castro, the employees said.

The establishment had a Federal license to manufacture machine guns but lacked state authorization for possession, sale and transportation of weapons, according to Sheriff Lt. E. D. Villines. He said the factory started operations last October.

State Attorney General Thomas C. Lynch said, "speed was necessary in this raid since our office has definite information that some of these illegal weapons were intended for private armies in California."

L. V. Knudson, who said he had a financial interest in the arms company, denied the weapons were meant for private armies. He said they were going to the Costa Rican government.

Valley Raid Uncovers Giant Arms Arsenal

Linked To Secret 'Armies'

373 Submachine Guns Seized

About 373 submachine guns which State Atty. Gen. Thomas Lynch described as intended for "private armies" in California were seized late Friday in a warehouse in the City of Industry.

State agents assisted by sheriff's deputies, FBI and Treasury agents swooped down on the Erquiaga Arms Co., 15036 Proctor Ave., and confiscated the cache.

Agents counted 373 operable submachine guns which had been manufactured by the company. They also uncovered at least one silencer.

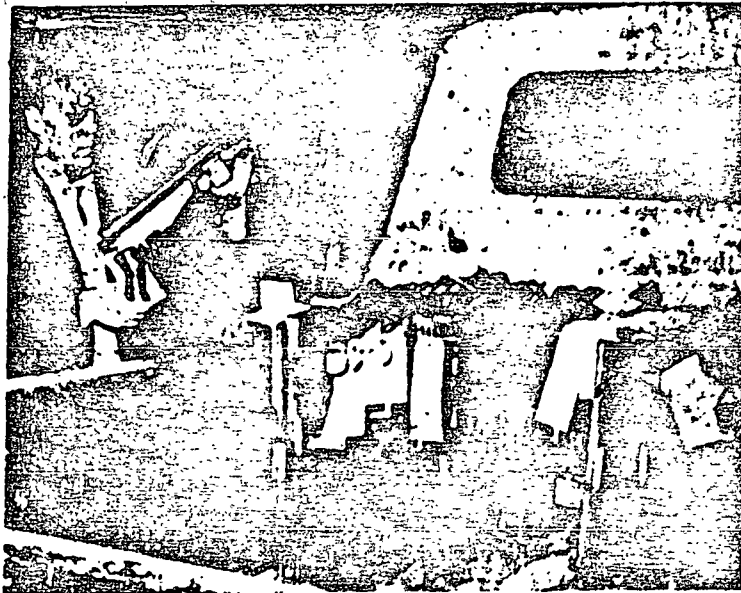
Speed Necessary

Lynch said, "speed was necessary in this raid since our office has definite information that some of these illegal weapons were intended for private armies in California."

A spokesman in the attorney general's office said the only known "private armies" in the state were the Minutemen and Rangers. He said the Minutemen have boasted of membership of more than several thousand.

Lynch recently proposed legislation urging the outlawing of extremist organizations.

A spokesman for Lynch said the company did not have a state license for the manufacture, possession, transportation or sale of machine guns.

Identify Owner

State agents said the company was owned by Juan Erquiaga, who was now believed to be in Guatemala.

According to the agents the seizure was the largest of its type in the history of the United States.

Sheriff's robbery detective Lt. E. D. Villines said the guns were a combination of a U.S. government issue .45-caliber "grease" gun and a 9mm British Sten gun.

The gun was described as a magazine-fed weapon made from stamped metal parts using a 30-round clip. It has a retractable wire stock developed during World War II.

Guns Described

The gun weighs six pounds, has a 300-yard range, firing 450 rounds per minute and is 24 inches long with the stock retracted, Villines said.

Villines said the guns were made to use 9mm ammunition. Several thousand rounds of that size ammunition were found at the plant and were left there since possession of ammunition is not illegal.

Nine mm ammunition is similar to that used in P38 German Luger guns used by German, NATO troops and is slightly smaller than American .38-caliber ammunition.

Hauled Away

Three pickup trucks were needed to haul the guns to the Sheriff's Department, where they will be stored pending further investigation of possible responsibility of the three employees found working when the raiders entered the plant. No arrests were made Friday.

The deputies and agents were armed with a search warrant obtained late Friday in Citrus Municipal Court.

Employees of the plant told the raiders they had not seen Erquiaga since Feb. 6, but that the plant had been in operation since last October. Villines said the plant had been under investigation several months by federal agents.

Minutemen Deny Purchase From Arms Company

Troy Houghton, Western area coordinator of the Minutemen, today denied published reports that his organization has purchased or contracted for any automatic weapon or weapons from the Erquiaga Arms Co. in the City of Industry.

State Atty. Gen. Thomas C. Lynch's men and deputies seized 77 machine-type guns and other weapons at the arms plant Friday. Lynch's men believed some of the weapons were destined for "private armies" and mentioned the Minutemen.

Terry R. Rody of San Diego also issued a denial that the Erquiaga Arms Co. has in its possession a machine gun alleged to belong to me.

"Any connection between myself and the arms company, or the modification of a particular sporting rifle, and at any time was there any discussion or mention of any other weapons in any form."

Owners of the plant said they had a Federal license to make machine guns for troops of Cuba's Fidel Castro in Costa Rica. The Costa Rican ambassador yesterday denied that his government had ordered any weapons.

Lynn D. Compton, chief deputy federal attorney, conferred with representatives of the attorney general's office and the attorney, and said the district attorney's office participated only in the preparation of

the search warrant in connection with the raid.

"We have requested that they furnish us with additional written reports," Compton said. "When we have received all evidence, we will evaluate it and determine what action is appropriate."

PERMIT REFUSED

A spokesman for Lynch's office said the company's export license, which had been applied for last Jan. 4, was refused by the State Department.

He said the firm had been cautioned four months ago that registration of any Federal licenses it was required to have state licenses.

And he added that alien guns — three were reportedly confiscated at the arms plant — were illegal in California.

Costa Rica Purchase of Guns Denied

The Costa Rican government Monday denied Lowell Knudsen's statement that it had ordered 500 submachine guns from his City of Industry plant for use by anti-Castro Cubans. Knudsen made the statement after federal, state and county officers seized 373 machine guns and other arms from the Erquiaga Arms Co. at 1906 E. Proctor Ave. Friday. Monday, Knudsen said he was starting court action to have the seized arms returned to the factory.

Earlier Monday, California Atty. Gen. Thomas Lynch reported the U.S. State Department denied another Knudsen statement that he was making the guns for Costa Rica with State Department approval. Instead, the State Department said a request from the company for an export license had been denied and the department had no intention of issuing the company an export license.

Arms Factory Raid Yields 373 Machine Guns

Investigators seized 373 machine guns late Friday at a City of Industry arms plant to prevent them from falling into the hands of private armies in California.

Armed with a search warrant, the raiding party entered the Erquiaga Arms Co., 15036 E. Proctor Ave., just after 5 p.m.

They found the machine guns stacked in racks, muzzles down. They also seized about 100,000 rounds of ammunition and three machine gun silencers which had been built inside empty beer cans.

Former Castroite

The raid was made by about 30 federal and state agents and deputy sheriffs. Atty. Gen. Thomas C. Lynch said.

The plant, reportedly owned by Juan Erquiaga, it was understood that he is now on a trip to Guatemala. It also was understood that Erquiaga once was a member of Castro's revolutionary

forces but is now strongly anti-Castro.

The search warrant issued by Municipal Judge Fred Rabb of City Municipal Court in West Covina charged that the company had no state permit for possession or sale of machine

guns. However, Atty. Gen. Lynch admitted the implications were much more serious and that there had been reports the guns would be sold illegally to U.S. citizens.

"Speed was necessary in this raid," said Lynch, "since our office has definite information that some of these illegal weapons were intended for private armies in California."

A spokesman for the attorney general identified such extremist organizations as the Minutemen and the Rangers as among intended recipients. Lynch has proposed a bill to the state Legislature urging that such organizations be outlawed.

The machine guns are about 20 inches long. They have a pistol grip instead of a stock, so one could easily

shoot. They fire a 9 mm bullet at a reported rate of 35 rounds a second.

When the raiding party entered the one-story plant, they found four employees there. The agents said George Ingram was the man in charge and that he informed them Erquiaga was out of the country.

Workers at an adjacent plant told reporters the machine guns were frequently tested in an area behind the arms plant, test rounds being fired into a barrel.

This news surprised Sheriff's Lt. E. D. Villines who led deputies on the raid. The plant is only two long city blocks from the City of Industry sheriff's office.

Each of the machine guns bore the marking "MURE" and below this, "MR64" and also the name "Erquiaga."

Although no arrests were made, Dep. Dist. Atty. Maugers Oppenheim, who prepared the search warrant and accompanied the raiding party, said evidence seized will be studied by the district attorney's office with a view to possible prosecution.

The raiders spent hours at the plant studying company records concealed beneath a man's papers and files.

Court Battle Looming Over Weapons' Seizure

Return Of Arms Sought

Authorities Study Action

A court battle looms over the return of 573 machine guns and 100,000 rounds of ammunition from an arms firm by state and local authorities.

The weapons and three operators used for testing them were seized last Friday at the Beckley Arms Co. in a raid ordered by California Atty. Gen. Thomas Lynch.

Charles Blake, Beale

Lynch said the weapons were destined for use by extremist groups and private military forces—among them the Minute-men and Rangers. The plant operator denies this.

"We have engaged a law firm to act for a court order returning the weapons to our factory," said Lyle H. Knudson, who described himself as a partner in the arms firm and operator of the plant, however.

Lynch, however, was conferring with the district attorney's office to decide what action should next be taken.

Washington

The weapons were seized by raiders armed with a search warrant issued by Curtis Klum, chief court on grounds that the firm lacked state license for manufacture, possession, sale or transportation of machine guns. Antitiping activities, however, were the firm did have a federal authorization for such activity.

"We are licensed by the Internal Revenue Service and are working with the approval of the U. S. State Department in making these machine guns," Knudson said.

"We have a purchase order for 573 machine guns from the U. S. State Department," Knudson said. "We have a license for the use of these machine guns from the U. S. State Department."

It has never been my understanding that we needed a state license.

"This talk of our making guns for private armies is a lot of hogwash," Knudson said.

Lynch said that one weapon found at the plant was an M1 rifle owned by Terrell Eddy, whom Lynch identified as head of the California National States Rights Party. Lynch said the organization was anti-Mexican and anti-Jewish.

Lynch said the organization claims to be a political group, but actually is paramilitary. He said Eddy's rifle was at the arms company to be converted to increase its rate of fire.

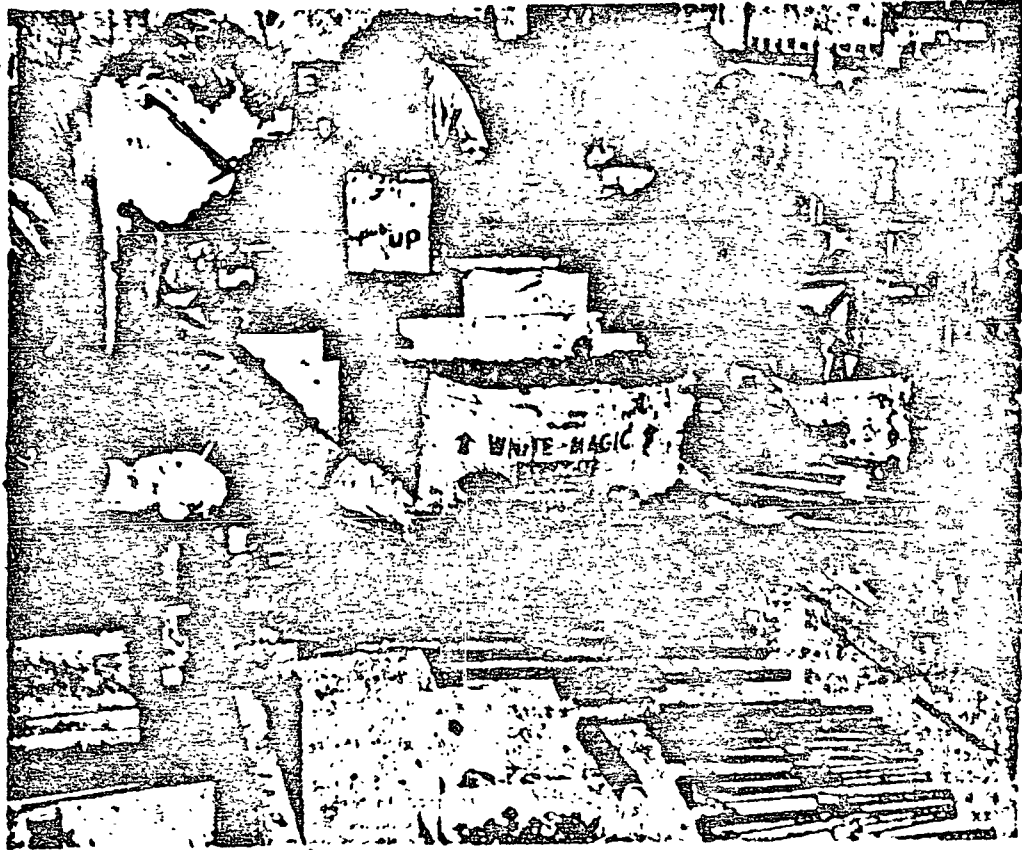
Said Knudson: "We receive M1 rifles from individuals all over the United States, which we modify for the M14 automatic version for the M14 approval. We have no orders from any groups."

Lynch, who has asked the state Legislature to outlaw the manufacture of paramilitary organizations, said the Minutemen are a national group whose members say they are arming themselves against the day of a Communist takeover of the United States. He said the Rangers are a similar organization, but apparently confine its activities primarily in California.

Lynch 'Up In Arms' Over 373 Illegal Machine Guns

A decision is expected today in the disposition of 373 machine guns confiscated from the Erquiaga Arms Co. in the City of Industry.

Deputy Dist. Atty. Lynn Compton said his office wanted to wait until all the evidence was available before deciding what to do.

State Atty. Gen. Thomas Lynch ordered the arms seized last Friday night because the manufacturer didn't have a state license for the possession or sale of automatic weapons.

He also charged that the weapons "were destined for the use of private armies such as Minutemen and the ultra-conservative Rangers."

Troy Houghton, western area coordinator of the Minutemen, today denied his organization has purchased or contracted for any automatic weapons from the arms firm.

Yesterday the U. S. State Department denied that an export license was granted to the company to deliver the new-type machine guns to Costa Rica and the federal officials said they "have no intention of granting such a permit."

Lowell V. Knudson, who operated the plant for Juan Erquiaga, said "the company has a large order for the machine guns for the army of Costa Rica. We wanted to have the job completed by April 1 and Costa Rica would pick up all the weapons at one time."

Knudson said "we are abiding by the Federal

Firearm Act . . . we have a federal license . . . and we believe this takes precedence over everything else."

He said he didn't obtain a state permit because "we believe we fall into an exemption in the state law."

When searching the premises last Friday, the investigators found a rifle which allegedly belonged to Terrel Eddy, leader of the National States Rights Party in California.

The attorney general said that correspondence was found indicating that Eddy's rifle was to be converted from an M-1 semi-automatic to M-14 automatic rifle.

(In San Diego, Eddy said any connection between himself and the arms company "concerned only the modification of a particular sporting rifle and at no time was there any discussion or mention of any other weapon in any form")

Knudson called it a "publicity deal and an attempt to link us with the rightwingers."

"Anyone can send us M-1 rifles for conversion to M-14 automatics, that's

our business."

He said he didn't know Eddy from any other customer of the plant.

Employees of the arms manufacturer said that Erquiaga is in either Costa Rica or Guatemala and has been out of the country since Feb. 6.

Lynch said his office informed the gun maker last November that regardless of any federal license he might possess, state permits were needed for the manufacture, possession or sale of machine guns.

Furthermore, Lynch said, "he was informed that silencers of any sort are totally illegal in California, and there is no provision in state law for their manufacture under any circumstances."

Three silencers were confiscated during the raid.

Gun dealers in Southern California called Erquiaga and Knudson "fools" who knew that if they "kept up their practice they would be knocked over."

The machine guns confiscated by the attorney general are similar to "grease guns" used by the

U. S. Army during World War II, and British Stearman guns

The gun was designed by Gordon Ingram, 4223 Wilkinson Ave., Studio City.

Employees and the sheriff's office say that it is an "outstanding weapon."

Last October Erquiaga said he hoped to manufacture 26,000 of the machine guns in 1965, and 20,000 assault rifles as well, for sale to South American countries.

The machine guns are chambered for the 9 mm parabellum bullets, carry 31 rounds, fire 750 rounds a minute, weigh 8 pounds and combine full and selective automatic firing. The action is inertia or "blow back" operated.

The Erquiaga Arms Co. which yielded 373 machine guns to a raiding party last week, was warned four months ago that it was operating without a state license. Atty. Gen. Thomas C. Lynch's office disclosed Monday.

The arms company did not respond to the warning, the attorney general said.

Lynch said he learned Monday that the U.S. State Department had denied a gun export license requested by the firm.

For Foes of Castro

An Erquiaga spokesman had been quoted as saying the State Department approved of the manufacture of machine guns because they would be supplied to anti-Castro Cubans.

A raiding party of 30 federal, state and local officials confiscated the automatic weapons and 100,000 rounds of ammunition Friday night at the company, 15036 E. Proctor Ave., City of Industry.

Meanwhile, suggestions that the machine guns might be destined for such extremist "private armies" as the Rangers brought a complaint from the Ranger Battalion Assn. of World War II, a legitimate veterans organization. The association said it is against extremist movements and opposes the use of the name, Ranger, by any other group.

Arms Plant: Costa Rica Denies Order

Ambassador Gonzalo Facio denied in Washington today that Costa Rica has ordered 500 automatic weapons from the Erquiaga Arms Co. in the City of Industry.

State officials seized 373 machine-type guns and other weapons there Friday night.

"The government of Costa Rica asserts emphatically that it has not ordered such weapons, and the published report is untrue," Facio said.

"If at any time the government of Costa Rica should need to purchase weapons, it would do so only through official US Government channels."

An executive of the arms company had been quoted as saying: "We have a purchase order from the Costa Rica government for 500 automatic machine pistols which we are filling."

Owners of the plant had said they had a Federal license to make machine guns for foes of Cuba's Fidel Castro in Costa Rica.

Meanwhile, State Atty Gen. Thomas C. Lynch planned to confer with the district attorney's office on possible prosecution of owners of the gun factory. Lynch said he believed some of the weapons were intended for "private armies" established by right-wing extremist groups.

The attorney general said possession of automatic weapons is illegal under California law. Most of the weapons seized in the raid were .30-caliber and combined characteristics of the "grease gun" and the Ben gun.

On 1 March 1965 Manuel Ray Rivero, leader of the Junta Revolucionaria Cubana (JURE, Cuban Revolutionary Junta), said that he and his group have no plans for action against Cuba at the present time. He and his group, according to Ray, have changed their plans completely with regard to the fight against Communism in Cuba. Ray believes that it would be almost impossible to use guerrilla tactics during the Castro régime; for this reason, he believes it would be preferable to begin operating clandestinely in the large urban centers and then slowly expanding operations to the rural areas of Cuba.

Asunto: ESTANCIA EN ESPAÑA DE MANUEL RAY DURANTE EL
MES DE FEBRERO.

El súbdito cubano MANUEL RAY, de 41 años, dirigente máximo de la organización anticastrista M.R.P., llegó a Madrid por el Aeropuerto de Barajas, procedente de París, el día 18 de febrero próximo pasado, saliendo por dicho Aeropuerto con destino a Nueva York, el 21 del mismo mes. Durante su estancia en Madrid se alojó en el Hotel Gran Vía de la Avda. de José Antonio.

Según los informes recogidos, uno de los objetivos de su viaje a nuestra capital, fue el de entrevistarse con un funcionario del Ministerio español de Asuntos Exteriores, con la finalidad de influir y activar la salida de Cuba de su secretario, el súbdito cubano ARTURO DIAZ, ex-Director General de Espeleología de Cuba, que se encuentra asilado en la Embajada del Uruguay en La Habana. ARTURO DIAZ está casado con la ex-esposa del ex-ministro fidelista AUGUSTO MARTÍNEZ SANCHEZ, que hace poco intentó suicidarse en Cuba.

Durante su estancia en Madrid visitó al súbdito cubano exiliado JESUS MANZARBITIA GURRUCHAGA, en su domicilio de la Plaza de España nº 12-59, teniéndose conocimiento que en el curso de la entrevista RAY - solicitó gestionase entre la colonia cubana de Madrid la obtención de ayuda económica para el movimiento contrarrevolucionario que RAY dirige.

Se supo, por otra parte, que RAY tenía la intención de entrevistarse con el vice-ministro 2º de Relaciones Exteriores de Cuba ARNOLD RODRIGUEZ CAMPS, - aprovechando la estancia de este último en Madrid, entrevista que no pudo efectuarse por razón de que el vice ministro salió de España dos días antes de la llegada de RAY a Madrid.

Según parece, RAY RIVERO es amigo personal de ARNOLD RODRIGUEZ, con quien estuvo preso durante el - mandato de Batista.

Por último se sabe también que en el tiempo que permaneció en Madrid RAY RIVERO, se relacionó con el súbdito cubano residiendo en Madrid FLAVIO LUIS LOPEZ LOPEZ, domiciliado en Viriato 69, quien le fue a despedir al aeropuerto de Barajas.

El citado FLAVIO llegó a España por Barajas el 31-12-61, fue interventor de la "Texas Oil Company" en Cuba y carece de antecedentes desfavorables.
