Enclosed herewith for the Bureau are 11 copies of
an LHM setting forth results of the interview conducted on
12/5/68 with CARLOS TEPEDINO, as requested in ReBulet, 7/1/68.

During the interview of TEPEDINO on 12/5/68, his
relationship with CIA was discussed, and TEPEDINO advised that
he had no current working arrangement with CIA, nor has CIA
requested him to perform any missions since the plot against
CASTRO was uncovered in 1966. TEPEDINO said that he does
have periodically a social call from a CIA representative and
did mention that from time to time he is contacted by WILLIAMSON.

TEPEDINO stated that when the plot against CASTRO was
uncovered in the Fall of 1966, CIA dropped their relationship
with him, as the discovery of the plot and the subsequent
arrests in Havana and also the dismissal of the CIA personnel
in Madrid had proved most embarrassing to CIA. TEPEDINO also
stated that prior to the discovery of the plot, he was of
assistance to CIA because of his relationship with the foreign
service personnel of Cuba who were stationed abroad and also the
fact that he was trusted by certain individuals within the Cuban
Government in Havana. For example, he pointed out that he had
done personal favors for individuals within the Cuban Government.

and specifically mentioned ~~(S)~~ (U) [MARTA JIMENEZ] who, at that time, was with [the Cuban Delegation to the United Nations.] [TEPEDINO] ~~(S)~~ (U) stated that since 1966 he [has had no contact with any of ~~(S)~~ (U) the foreign service personnel of the Cuban Government either in the United States or abroad and] has had no working relationship with CIA, and he feels that his usefulness to the CIA, because of the incident, is now finished.

(U) ~~(S)~~ [TEPEDINO] was most cordial during the interview and at the conclusion, stated that if at any time the Bureau would have need of his services, he would be most willing to cooperate in any manner. [TEPEDINO] was advised that if any situation did ~~(S)~~ (U) arise in the future in which he could be of assistance, he would be contacted.

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
