Dear Walt:

'Tis the time of year to put all things aright. In this spirit let me run through a list of unrequited bits and pieces. Would you be so kind as to provide the Committee with the following:

- 1) A statement on the relationship of Humphrey Evans to the Agency. Humphrey Evans is the author of The Thought Revolution and Escape from Red China. Could you also provide us with information and/or files on Tung Chi-Ping and Robert Loh. These two men were the subject of Humphrey's books.
- 2) Access to the files on the Vietnam Council on Foreign Relations. We would like to know the relationship, if any, of the Agency to the Council including whatever assistance the U.S. government may have provided to the publication and distribution of the Viet Nam Magazine.
- 3) A statement from the Central Intelligence Agency on the actual intelligence value of the information provided by Penkovsky. What did he tell the U.S. government that he <sup>it</sup> didn't know? How valuable was that information? What difference did it make?
- 4) Information on or access to the files on Lem Jones Associates, Inc., of 280 Madison Avenue, New York, New York. This firm released the various bulletins of the Cuban Revolutionary Council in the 1960's.
