1. It is requested that the attached application for Health Insurance be given to Harold R. NOEMAYR for completion. NOEMAYR may retain the covering memorandum which outlines his coverage. The completed forms should be returned to Headquarters for processing. The premiums will be deducted from NOEMAYR's salary. Headquarters will notify NOEMAYR when his policy is in effect.

2. Please explain to NOEMAYR that this plan covers basically two types of health insurance. 1: the normal hospitalization explained in paragraph 3 of the attachment which includes in- and out-patient care, surgery and maternity. The allowable expenses covered under this section are immediately reimbursable within the limits of the plan. 2: the major medical benefit plan described in paragraph 4 covers miscellaneous medical expenses not normally connected with hospitalization such as doctors' office visits, doctors' home visits, prescriptions, injections and medications given by doctors, X-rays and other laboratory work done in connection with diagnosis or treatment, etc. The insured pays up to \$100 of such allowable expenses under this category for each member of his family. If expenses exceed this \$100 for any person during the calendar year, then the policy will pay for 80% of their additional expenses. In connection with this phase of the plan, it is suggested that NOEMAYR be advised to have his family keep a detailed record of all medical expenses incurred by each member of the family.

A RESUME OF THE USE OF A "NOTIONAL COVER" EMPLOYMENT

Harold K. Noema Jr

10 April 1960

1. The following "notional cover firm" was established in April 1957 and backstopped mail-cable-telephone checks:

A few hundred business cards were printed up both in Washington and locally in Havana, Cuba for my use. It was agreed that stationary would be printed up and some correspondence should be initiated from Havana. The business cards were first used in May 1957 in Havana; renting an apartment, purchasing furniture, automobile, and among friends and acquaintances. It was later used as a developmental recruitment approach with known communists in Havana - details set forth with each case reviewed here.

2. Generally, it is believed that this cover held up well with Latinamericans in Cuba, Mexico, Costa Rica, Panama. It was received with some curiosity by some Americans living abroad in these countries, and was often questioned "Well, what do you do?" Actually, university background in economics made it possible for me to answer and converse professionally, and only difficulties ever encountered with with two persons who were in a position to appeal to my firm for services. This, of course, made it obvious that I had to be prepared at all times to actually render some service or present a valid technical reason for not being able to do so. To my knowledge, this cover firm has never been compromised as such, and it has only been seriously challenged on one occasion. This was a newsmen in the Sierra Maestra in Cuba and will be set forth in detail.

3. It would be impossible, of course, to remember and record every "brushing" acquaintance that has been given this business card. But the well known and more important ones are listed for Cuba as follows:

Spanish Cuban, about 50 years old, a former "Prío man" (Carlos PRIO Socarras). Was a police Lieutenant and anti-communist strongarm man. Also worked for the Military Attache (US) in Havana. Was recommended for recruitment as a spotter in 1955, but not favorably received because "new blood" was sought.

Angel BOAN Acosta:
Present address unk.

Met in Guatemala in February 1954. Cuban exile. BOAN was a news and radio announcer in Guatemala not a communist, but enjoying entre'e with them. Was later encountered in Havana in 1956 and in 1957, employed by our station as one the AMPHODARCH project. He was later terminated and now believed to have been re-activated in Havana.

4. On 11 March 1958 I went into the Sierra Maestra mountain range of Santiago, Oriente Province, on an assignment as observer with the Fidel CASTRO Ruz revolutionary movement. CASTRO "cleared" me for this assignment and was given my business card. It was also considered operationally advantageous to "drop a hint" to CASTRO from another direction as to my true mission. He was a very shrewd photographer and an observing person. We became very close during those weeks and he eventually drew me aside and told me that he wanted to bring me in contact with some friends of his in Washington who would like to talk to me concerning the military and intelligence aspects of CASTRO's movement. While I do not think that he strongly doubted my cover firm, he seemed to recognize my approach as more for military intelligence than journalism or economics.

United Press International. This was his first trip into the Sierra and he was very green for camp life and had no knowledge of Spanish or their history. It was a simple matter to give him a hand in everything and become his interpreter during the entire assignment. This gave me a lot of access persons and information that I would normally have to struggle for - but eventually, his being a veteran newsmen - he recognized my approach as something more than journalism. He put it in a few words, saying that I was entirely too thorough - too many field trips, too many technical photographs, etc. He came out and asked if I did belong to my true organization. It became necessary to become very convincing here, and I think that I did eventually allay his suspicions.

5. On December 29, 1958, I returned to Havana for a second assignment in the Sierra Maestra which was interrupted by the fall of the BATISTA regime. During a period of three weeks, the following persons were given the business cards:

KAPPES is now employed with Harry Wassel & Associates in Havana - he was then in Havana in the employ of Fidel CASTRO as an Underwater demolition expert and was in the process of sabotaging the Cuban destroyer "Jose Marti". He had lost his contact with the movement and did not speak Spanish - I helped him make contact and remove the explosives - he remained in Havana. (This has been reported complete with photographs.)

Worked about 4 months in 1957 and assisted in setting up escape route for him - rather, one of his leaders - thru the Costa Rican Ambassador and the Brazilian embassy.

Both are AMPHOTERES and are currently leaders in the Directorio Revolucionario (DR). I also met the brother Pedro PUENTE Blanco in Miami - he is currently an official in the FEU.

Cuban, about 28-30 years old, was secretary of organization (?) in the Juventud Popular Socialista (JSP) in Havana. The cover firm was utilized during a lengthy developmental approach. He originally engaged as my translator for a short story of mine which was published 9 Sept 1957 issue of Bohemia. He was eventually approached on the possibility of working for a local survey on "economic" aspects of "labor supply" in Cuba. He resisted all approaches. He was later arrested by the Buro de Repression de Actividades Comunistas (BRAC) and interrogated. During body search, my PSI business card turned up - he told the simple truth about our relationship and to our knowledge nothing ever came of the incident. (This was learned through our liaison contacts with Cuban BRAC.)

White, Cuban, originally from Guantanamo, Cuba. Employed as small parts actor on CMQ TV and was strongly indicated as high level intellectual crypto-communist. Travelled behind curtain once. I cultivated BRAIDMAN over long period and eventually used the "survey" pitch. He refused because the Cuban Buro de Investigacion had his residence under surveillance and were questioning or searching his quarters regularly.

HEGARTY is scheduled for a medical release about 29 Feb 60 and should arrive in Mexico about 20 March. After a few weeks overlap, NOEMAYR should depart for Hqs about 1 April 60, ready to go to work. According to Charlotte he prefers to take no home leave.

Apparently Mr. Gomez has been working with the Covert Training people in an attempt to place him in that type of activity in a cover status. Per Col. King on 10 Feb Covert Training indicated that they had no interest in subject and Col. King requested the above information for use in his contact with Col. Baird in a further attempt to place NOEMAYR with OTR.

1. Reference is made to our telephone conversation on 10 February 1960 regarding the possible use by your office of Subject. Attached for your information are some facts concerning his personal and operational background.

2. NOEMAYR has successfully worked for KUBARK under deep cover for eleven consecutive years. All operations officers handling subject and his training officers at Headquarters have commended his operational capability and achievements. He received an official commendation from the agency for his work in Cuba.

3. WH Division has several motives for wishing to bring NOEMAYR to Headquarters for a tour of duty.

a) After having lived and worked for so long under deep cover without being able to mingle freely with Americans he needs to return to the United States for mental and physical readjustments for himself and his family. The fact that his wife has not been able to become an American citizen and that his children have not had an opportunity to live in the States has been of understandable increasing concern to NOEMAYR. This, combined with the stress of his double life required by his deep cover position and his non-association with anyone except his Case Officer with whom he can discuss his work and problems has been making him increasingly more tense during the last year or two. NOEMAYR is an extremely capable Operations Officer and WH Division earnestly believes that it is KUBARK's responsibility to bring this man and his family to the United States for two years. Your cooperation in this effort is being sought.

b) NOEMAYR, even though he has received Headquarters covert training, still needs to be closely associated with Headquarters for a tour to acquire additional background on operational techniques and approaches and to be exposed to Headquarters' activity and thinking. This experience is requisite to making a well-rounded intelligence operator out of NOEMAYR and will certainly affect his future usefulness to KUBARK.

c) A Headquarters tour will enable NOEMAYR's wife to become a United States citizen and permit his children to receive, at least, a part of their education in the States.

4. WH Division plans to bring NOEMAYR to the States the end of March 1960 in his capacity of a Career Agent. At that time a cover will be arranged for him which will be consistent with his Headquarters assignment. Appropriate cover will be decided upon only after consultation with your office if you decide to use NOEMAYR.

5. As a Career Agent, NOEMAYR will continue to be funded under LIENGE, his present project. All funds required to support NOEMAYR and his activity will be charged to this project against the WH Division allotment. In addition, WH Division will handle all administrative problems connected with NOEMAYR, such as renewal of the project, covert income tax returns, cover, etc. after coordinating such action with your office.

6. WH Division has confidence in NOEMAYR and believes he can be of value to CRR in its training program. The Mexican desk will be glad to work closely with you in the handling of NOEMAYR if you so desire. NOEMAYR is enthusiastic about his impending Headquarters assignment and is anxious to start work immediately upon return to the United States.

7. If you desire any additional information on NOEMAYR, I will be happy to make it available on request.

I. PERSONAL

NOEMAYR was born on 20 June 1922 in De Kalb, Illinois. He had five years experience in General Air Force intelligence work. He was discharged from the Air Force on 18 February 1949. He attended the University of Costa Rica for three years then transferred to the University of Habana. NOEMAYR speaks fluent Spanish.

He was married to Argentina CORDERO of San Jose, Costa Rica, on 17 December 1945. His wife hopes to obtain her U. S. citizenship when NOEMAYR is transferred PCS to the United States. They have two children.

III. CONTRACT

NOEMAYR was first placed under contract by KUBARK on 1 June 1949. He is now under contract as a Career Agent. He is a GS-12.

IV. COVER

NOEMAYR is operating under a notional cover. He supposedly was sent by the "Public Surveys Institute" of Dallas, Texas, into Mexico to investigate the prospects of establishing a Mexican affiliate. He supplements his income by free-lance writing. He actually has had articles published in Bohemia and Boys Life. Subject can show these articles to support his cover. On one operational trip he took photographs which appeared in the New York Times and the New York Daily Mirror. To further cover his sources of income NOEMAYR has let it be known that he owns property in Costa Rica and in Cuba and that rentals provide him with monthly income. When Subject returns to the U. S., WH Division will request Cover Division to assist NOEMAYR in establishing a new, back-stopped cover which can be used during his tour here.

V. TRAINING

NOEMAYR received covert training at Headquarters during October and December 1953 in all phases of basic tradecraft. He was rated above average by all three of his instructors.

NOEMAYR was given additional covert training in May 1958.

VI. OPERATIONAL BACKGROUND

NOEMAYR was first recruited in Panama in November 1948 and transferred to Costa Rica under the HUMANOID PROJECT. He successfully directed and exploited a high-level penetration of the Costa Rican Communist Party. Among other accomplishments he recruited two mail intercept agents, processing the take himself, and recruited three additional agents. He also set up safe houses and was in charge of the monitoring post in a technical surveillance.

In early 1953 he was transferred to the PBSUCCESS Project with additional duties as cutout under Project ESCROW.

In 1954 he transferred to Cuba under Project AMPHODARCH. He went under cover as a student since he had one more year of academic work to finish in order to receive a B.A. in Economics. In Cuba he worked on penetration of the Communist targets at the University of Habana. During the same period he was also in contact with subversive oppositionist elements.

In May, 1957, Chief CI/ICD recommended that NOEMAYR be considered for spot assignments of making recruitment pitches throughout Latin America to CP targets. This recommendation was made after Mr. Paul Burke, Deputy Chief CI/ICD, had an informal discussion with NOEMAYR on 9 May on this subject. Mr. Burke believed NOEMAYR would be an effective recruiter and NOEMAYR expressed an interest in such assignments.

In May, 1958, he volunteered to go to the rebel mountain headquarters of Castro, in Cuba, to obtain information for KUBARK. He received a commendation for his work during this special assignment.

NOEMAYER was transferred to Mexico on 7 June 1958 where he has been handling Communist Party penetration agents and informants.

He spent January 1959 in Cuba on a TDY assignment similar to that he undertook in March of 1958, and for which he received his commendation.

VII. OUTSTANDING PERFORMANCE AND COMMENDATIONS

On 1 May 1953, NOEMAYER was in charge of an attempt to physically penetrate the home of Manuel MORA Valverde, President of the Costa Rican Communist Party for the purpose of obtaining documents which could be used to prove the Communist Party's control over the Partido Progresista Independiente, a front which had been organized to participate in the 1953 elections. When the sub-agent who was to actually perform the penetration failed to appear, NOEMAYER, realizing the urgency of the operation, voluntarily and on his own initiative made a successful surreptitious entry, removing approximately 85% of the PPI documentation plus Communist Party documents. On 24 July 1953 the President of Costa Rica signed a bill outlawing the PPI. The participation of NOEMAYER in the campaign to prevent the PPI from becoming a legal party is considered to have been instrumental in its success.

In May 1959 NOEMAYR was awarded a monetary bonus of \$300.00 in recognition of his outstanding services on behalf of KUBARK in the Sierra Maestra area during the early part of 1958. For his outstanding performance on this assignment and his great devotion to duty, NOEMAYR received a personal commendation from General Caball. In early January 1958 NOEMAYR volunteered to undertake a mission to contact Cuban rebel leader Fidel Castro in the Sierra Maestra mountains in Southeastern Cuba. He spent approximately three weeks in the mountain hideout of Castro's headquarters during which time he even joined them in an actual attack on the town of Manzanillo.

1. Field traces reveal the following on the CORDERO Calderon family:

- a) Federico was born on 29 March 1912, has been living in Panama for several years, and is currently employed at the Union Club in Panama City;
- b) Antonio had been living for several years in the Pacific Banana Zone city of Quepos, Costa Rica. Recently, he was placed in jail in San Juan de Tibas (a suburb of San Jose) on a charge of robbery;
- c) Marie was born in San Jose on 7 February 1920 and was a militant communist prior to and during the 1948 Costa Rican Revolution. After the revolution, he left the Party voluntarily, but was reported to have been actively sympathetic towards communism for the past ten years. Another source reported this month that Marie is visited regularly by communists, who leave printed propaganda with him;
- d) Andruval was born in San Jose on 12 November 1925 and is currently living in San Jose, employed as a shoemaker in a shop owned by a communist. He is reported to be sympathetic to communism;
- e) Angela Arrieta was born in San Jose on 15 March 1915, now living in Mexico with her husband who is a PERDUE citizen. They own a house in San Jose, in which Marie (see c. above) now lives;
- f) Linda was born in San Jose on 27 February 1923, is married (common law) to a Spaniard, and has resided in Spain for many years;
- g) Consuelo is living in New York City, working in a beauty parlor; There are no available traces on Rosita or Isabel.

2. Discrepancies will be noted on the vital statistics as opposed to those in reference; Costa Rican Civil Registry files are the Station's source. The Registry had no file on either Rosita or Isabel. Station files, inquiries to Station assets, and an investigation conducted by HUSBURBY accounted for the narrative portions of the traces. The above traces include all of the information available to the Station.

REFERENCE(S)

1. At an operational meeting on 8 July 1959, HERNANDEZ/ told HUSKAW that he was aware of the efforts of Mario CORNEJO Calderon to re-enter the PVT, presumably on ODONNE's behalf. Without waiting for a reply, HERNANDEZ/ then pleaded with HUSKAW to stop these efforts for the following reasons:
 - a) while handled by HERNANDEZ several years ago, HERNANDEZ/ often had operational meetings in HERNANDEZ's home. On occasion, HERNANDEZ/ would be entertained by HERNANDEZ's wife and mother-in-law until HERNANDEZ's arrival for the meeting. HERNANDEZ/ has harbored a deep fear for years that Subject (HERNANDEZ's brother-in-law) might have seen HERNANDEZ/ enter or leave the meeting site, or that HERNANDEZ's wife, a Costa Rican national, might have (wittingly or otherwise) exposed HERNANDEZ/ to her brother.
 - b) HERNANDEZ/ who knows CORNEJO personally, claims that CORNEJO was probably a poor choice for a party penetration, since he was known to be actively sympathetic to the PVT for the past ten years. In addition, HERNANDEZ/ doubted that CORNEJO had the necessary qualifications of intelligence and discretion to perform in the capacity of a penetration agent.
2. HERNANDEZ denied any knowledge of a penetration attempt, and assured HERNANDEZ/ that no action would ever be taken to challenge HERNANDEZ/'s position. At an operational meeting with the project case officer later the same evening, HUSKAW expressed deep concern over HERNANDEZ/'s state of mind concerning CORNEJO, and tacitly advised against CORNEJO's entry, if it were within the Station's ability.
3. Regardless of the validity of HERNANDEZ/'s allegations, it is quite apparent to the extent and the Station that HERNANDEZ/ is upset and worried about the possibility of CORNEJO entering the PVT and discussing with other party members, details of HERNANDEZ/'s past activities and contacts. As a supplementary factor, it was also felt that CORNEJO's extremely limited ability, potential, and access would not be worth the security risks involved. In the interest of security and agent morale, the Station decided to stop CORNEJO's penetration attempt, diverting him temporarily, to provide a fuller coverage on communist labor (CCTC) activities, and to perform spotting tasks for the Station.
4. At a contact on 13 July 1959, HERNANDEZ set up a contact plan, and instructed CORNEJO in the Station's wishes. CORNEJO assented without question, and a meeting with the Station has been scheduled for 3 August 1959.
5. An investigation of the CORNEJO family is being conducted by the Station.

1. Attached is a cover review of the notional cover under which Harold E. ROEMAYR, the principal component for Project LINDOR, has been operating. This analysis was mainly written by ROEMAYR, himself, with additions made by the Station. It is requested that this review be sent to Cover Division for their study.

2. The following constitute the basis for which the Station is requesting that Project LINDOR be renewed for the period 1 May 1959 through 30 April 1960:

a. As this is a support project for the maintenance of Harold E. ROEMAYR, an outside case officer whose responsibilities comprise the running of operations currently in progress against the Communist movement in Mexico, there is no direct product derived other than that obtained from projects LICHHEART, LIMAD and LIFER.

b. As of 1 January 1959, Project LINDOR was transferred to a case officer under official cover at the Station, and must, therefore, not be included as one of the operations under the direction of ROEMAYR.

c. ROEMAYR has continued to manage operations under his control very satisfactorily and fully justifies the expenditure of KUBARK personnel, time, funds and the security risk involved. (For production specifics, consult reviews for projects LICHHEART, LIFER and LIMAD.)

d. Operations under jurisdiction of this Project are the primary projects possessed by the Station against the Communist movement and are based on Priority A requirements of the Station's Related Mission Directive.

e. This Project has continued to satisfy those requirements necessary to maintain an outside case officer under the Communist penetration program.

f. There is no change anticipated in operational planning for the future of this Project, nor are there any changes believed necessary in line with altered political or operational conditions or any other changing situations.

g. During the period under review (1 May 1958 - 30 April 1959) funds obligated total U. S. \$22,270. It is requested that the same obligation be made for the period 1 May 1959 - 30 April 1960.

h. All commitments are contained in the contract for Harold E. ROEMAYR and in the oral agreements with subagents LILERSKY-1 and LINDOR-1.

i. LILERSKY-1 continues to serve as cutout for LINDOR-1, a high-level penetration of the Partido Popular (PP) and the Union General de Obreros-Campesinos Mexicanos (UGOCM), but changes are anticipated in this status. Since LINDOR-1's recruitment by LILERSKY-1 on 15 August 1957, LINDOR-1 has been handled by LILERSKY-1 in a loosely-controlled manner. LINDOR-1 still does not submit sensitive info on his organizations nor does he know that he is receiving funds monthly from an agency of COMINT. ROEMAYR is currently attempting to obtain a direct interview with LINDOR-1 - as arranged with LILERSKY-1 - in order to either establish direct control of the agent or, on the negative side, to determine if LINDOR-1 should be terminated. Thus far, LINDOR-1 has not appeared, for apparently valid reasons, at any of the scheduled meetings with ROEMAYR. When contact is finally established it may be that

LIBERT-1 will react negatively upon learning that he is and has been working for CEROX, but this risk is considered by the Station to be worth while because of the lack of production of LIBERT-1 during the past 18 months. If LIBERT-1 accepts direct control by EREZAYR, then LIBERT-1 may be separated from his present function and placed on a stand-by status for conducting new penetration operations to members of the Communist movement in Mexico.

J. LIBERT-1 has been placed on an inactive status until such time as her services may be required in new penetration operations. As such she does not receive a monthly salary, but merely spot payments and a Christmas bonus for occasional assignments performed by her.

3. It is therefore requested the Project LIBERT be renewed for the period and amount of funds as stated in subparagraph g, paragraph 2 above.

SUBJECT: Cover Review for Harold R. NOEMAYR

1. The leading factor that has been responsible for the maintenance of a suitable cover arrangement for NOEMAYR has been the flexibility and adaptability of NOEMAYR himself. Without this person's fundamental ability to mold his cover around his personal qualifications, the notional cover story would not have been adequate in Mexico. However, to date, this cover has provided the added backstopping needed to permit NOEMAYR to give a convincing appearance of being gainfully employed and with no apparent inference to CBYRKE connections.

2. When NOEMAYR originally was assigned to Mexico City, he stopped in Dallas, Texas en route here in order to visit the cover address of his supposed cover concern so that he could be aware first hand of the details surrounding this company. In November-December 1958 he became acquainted with several Texans who were considering business opportunities in Mexico and - although they were not from Dallas - was able to successfully convince them of the legitimacy of his business. In this case, as is usual with his general cover story, he also showed them published articles in Bohemia and Boys Life, written under his true name, to further illustrate his varied means of financial support.

3. As stated above, the notional cover firm alone would probably not satisfy NOEMAYR's cover requirements, but when combined with his actual writing activities, it furnishes a fairly well-rounded background story. Thus emerges the basic necessity for this type of cover: some large grains of truth mixed tastefully with the nebulous aspects of a notional story.

4. The exact manner by which NOEMAYR achieves this impression is as follows:

a. He mentions that his cover firm has sent him into Mexico to investigate the prospects of establishing a Mexican affiliate. NOEMAYR's absences from Mexico (once in July 1958 for consultation in Washington and again in January 1959 on TDY to Cuba) are thus explained as added surveys of this nature outside of Mexico - thus providing the pattern of flexibility in movement.

b. To implement his income, NOEMAYR has taken up free-lance writing and can prove his accomplishments by exhibiting his published articles. His home has office space that is surrounded by popular literature, manuscripts and other aids that a writer would normally possess.

c. To further cover for his source of income, NOEMAYR has let it be known that he owns property in Costa Rica and in Cuba (places where he was previously assigned - the Costa Rican property is actual) and that rentals provide him with monthly income.

d. NOEMAYR does not attempt, however, to mix with the American community in Mexico, but prefers to lend the general impression that he wishes to get "down to grass roots" in dealing with the native environment. His residence is situated in a middle to upper class neighborhood largely settled by Mexican families. He thus creates the impression of a slightly "bohemian" American writer who has adapted his life during long experience in Latin America, to local conditions.

5. For the remainder of his tour in Mexico (his first year will expire in June 1959), NOEMAYR believes that his present cover will be entirely suitable. However, should KURABK desire to continue the same cover arrangement for his successor - at the end of his normal tour - it is suggested that thought be given to the establishment of a registered affiliate of an American concern, with the accompanying requirement of securing the costly working papers necessary for regular employment in Mexico. This would be particularly of value if his successor should happen not to possess the type of back ground that would permit independent activity in support of his cover, as is writing in NOEMAYR's case.

1. As recorded in Headquarters files, NOEMAYR's brother-in-law, Mario CORDEO Calderon, Costa Rican, residing in San Juan Tibas, San Jose, Costa Rica, was once a member of the Costa Rican CP. Mario's first loyalty had been to the CALDERONISTA party, but since the latter was allied with the CP, a great deal of recruitment had taken place within the allegiance. Mario drifted from CP militancy shortly after the 1948 revolution.

2. If the organization so desires, all the factors are present for the recruitment of Mario and return to CP militancy with a low to medium level penetration as the objective. These factors are as follows:

a. Mario CORDEO has been caretaker and therefore living in NOEMAYR's house in Costa Rica for the past two years. On two occasions during visits in 1956 and 1957, NOEMAYR conversed at some length with Mario concerning the Costa Rican CP. Mario indicated very emphatically that he was disgusted with them (party leaders) because of the corruption.

b. Letters received from Mario during the past year have indicated no change in this attitude. Mario is extremely grateful to NOEMAYR for this period of residence without paying rent. (Mario is a shoemaker of humble means).

3. NOEMAYR is reasonably certain that Mario CORDEO would accept such an offer and could return to CP militancy without security problems. It is believed that with a little guidance and manipulation, Mario could become a medium level penetration with a relatively short time. While not having more than an elementary school education, Mario is a stolid type, sincere and determined in his own way. Once satisfied that he could improve his lot by this service, he would lend a steady and reliable service.



1. In answer to your queries of reference, we wish to direct your attention to FHB 20-620-1, dated 28 November 1958, which provides information on overseas medical benefits available from KUBARK. This new handbook should be of great help in the future on questions of this nature as it sets forth in one place KUBARK provisions for employee and dependent medical benefits, together with the procedures required.

2. Section 2a of the handbook specifically states that Career Agents, if they are full-time employees and citizens of PRPRIME, may receive all medical benefits available to Staff Employees. Section 3a also specifically states that Career Agents, if they are full-time employees and citizens of PRPRIME, are eligible to receive the benefits of the KUBARK dependent medical program.

3. We suggest that Subject forward to Headquarters receipts for his dependent medical expenses, together with a statement from his physician attesting to the nature of the illness, his diagnosis and treatment. Subject should also execute Form No. 1126 as requested in Section 5a of the handbook. We will submit the claim to the Office of Personnel for their review and determination of any allowable reimbursement.

Dear Mr. Noemayr:

Reference is made to your contract with the United States Government, as represented by the Contracting Officer, effective 1 June 1957, as amended.

Effective 1 May 1958, said contract, as amended, is further amended in the following manner:

a. The first sentence of sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph four (4), entitled "Allowances," is revised to read as follows:

"In addition to the above payments, you will be entitled to an equalization allowance computed in conformance with applicable Government regulations and policies. (For your information, the equalization allowance for Mexico City is presently \$000.00)"

Cuban Asks to Be Shot For Plot to Kill Castro

HAVANA (AP) — A former Cuban army major has asked a revolutionary tribunal to sentence him to death because he agreed to shoot Prime Minister Fidel Castro.

"To the wall. To be executed, that is what I want," Rolando Cubelas told the tribunal yesterday.

He and six other Cubans are on trial, accused of plotting to assassinate Castro with the U.S. Central Intelligence Agency and Cuban exile leader Manuel Artime.

"I was the victim of my weaknesses and contradictions," Cubelas said. "I simply fell into the hands of the enemy."

"If I have to die, I will do it yelling, 'Viva la revolucion, fatherland or death, we will win.'"

Death Asked for Three

At the opening of the trial in La Cabana prison fortress, prosecutor Jorge Segura asked the death penalty for Cubelas, former Maj. Ramon Guin, Jose Gonzalez Gallaretta and Alberto Blanco Romariz.

He asked 30-year prison terms for Juan Alsina Navarro, Guillermo Cunil Alvarez and Angel Herrero Veliz.

Guin is charged with knowing about the plot, concealing it and spying for the CIA.

Cubelas testified that Artime persuaded him to join the plot during a meeting in Madrid on Christmas Day, 1964. He said that in February, 1965, Artime gave him a high-powered telescope and a silencer for his rifle, and he agreed to shoot Castro from a distance of about 800 yards.

'In Hands of Enemy'

"This was a cowardly act," he said. "I fell in the hands of the enemy."

Cubelas said the meeting was arranged by a Cuban resident of Madrid and by Odon Alvarez de la Campa, a former counselor to the Cuban embassy in the Spanish capital who defected in March, 1965.

About 500 persons, including Cuban and foreign newsmen, attended the session of the trial.

Schirra Ponders Settling in Perth

PERTH, Australia (AP)—American astronaut Walter M. Schirra Jr. says he is seriously considering settling in Perth when he is through with outer space.

Navy Capt. Schirra and Air Force Col. Frank Borman orbited around the capital of western Australia today, meeting political and civic leaders and other residents of the "City of Lights."

Perth is the site of a tracking station for U.S. space flights and puts on its lights when American astronauts fly over the area at night. Schirra during his six-orbit flight Oct. 3, 1962, radioed the station that he had spotted the lights during his second orbit.

Two Ex-Majors Arrested in Cuba As CIA Agents

HAVANA (AP)—Two former Cuban Army men, one of whom played a key role in Fidel Castro's rise to power, have been arrested on charges of counter-revolutionary activities for the U.S. Central Intelligence Agency.

The Interior Ministry announced last night that Dr. Rolando Cubela and Ramon Guin, both former majors, had been arrested for "actions which seriously involve them in counter-revolutionary activities" with the CIA.

Cubela, a physician, has been director of Havana's Fajardo Hospital. Before the overthrow of Fulgencio Batista's regime, he was a commander of Castro's guerrilla forces in the Escambray Mountains.

After Castro took over, he became first president of the Federation of University Students at Havana University.

No information was given on Guin.

1. Reference is made to your "Request for Information" dated 31 July 1964 concerning Subject.

2. The PRQ Part II on AMTRUNK-10 (201-142291) contains certain errors which are being struck: AMIASH-1 is not a Headquarters internal asset, nor is he running any internal group. The relationship between AMTRUNK-10 and AMIASH-1 is a personal one - they have been friends for many years. AMIASH-1 is not doing anything whatsoever at the present time inside Cuba which has anything to do with any KUBARK operation, plan, activity; in addition, he is not furnishing any Political or Foreign Intelligence. A FOA was requested on him in June of 1962 for recruitment as a possible defector. He returned to Cuba and has resumed his career as a surgeon. He is working with the cardiology department of the Manuel Fajardo Hospital.


