Unsub entered captioned FDIC insured bank (Charter 3806-7 dated 5/1/68) at 6:58 P.M., 10/31/69 and brandished a sub-machine gun, an automatic weapon, from under dark blue raincoat. Unsub announced holdup with "give me all your money!", followed by similar demands for money. Also threw two blue bags onto a desk near the entrance, directing tellers to fill bag. A drive-in teller cage at the rear of the bank, in addition to four teller cages in lobby of bank, were emptied of currency, including \$1,000 in bait money consisting of 200 \$5.00 bills. Bait money identification to be made available from microfilm records later as records under time lock.

Loss audited at \$15,211.00.

No cameras or alarms in bank. No customers in bank at time of holdup. Unsub exited through rear door and entered 1960 Chevrolet, 1969 Illinois license NW 5044, stolen 10/30/69 at O'Fallon, Illinois, near Lebanon, Illinois.

Unsub described as white male, 5'7", 140 pounds, 25-27 years of age, bushy mustache, wearing dark blue raincoat and sunglasses. Unsub was calm and deliberate.

ARTHUR JOSEPH BERNE is reportedly an officer of the East St. Louis Steamfitters Local #439, AFL-CIO. In this capacity, he obviously would wield considerable power since the Business Agent determines "who works where". The Business Agent also appoints the steward on the job site. He does no work but supposedly checks on the various jobs from time to time. His salary is lucrative and is paid from the dues collected from the membership. It has been rumored that BERNE is also a power in Laborers Local #100, AFL-CIO, in East St. Louis.

ARRAHAN KAUFFMAN is a long-time associate of ARTHUR BERNE. He was close to the late BUSTER WORTMAN and his syndicate. Actually, KAUFFMAN formerly operated the kitchen at WORTMAN'S Paddock Club which was a gathering place for the hoodlum element from all over the East St. Louis area. KAUFFMAN was also a "bag man" for WORTMAN before he died. Therefore, KAUFFMAN enjoys the complete confidence of BERNE. KAUFFMAN is now in his sixties and in poor health. He is said to have cancer.

BERNE is also known to be very close to the St. Louis hoodlum, LOUIS SHOULDERS.

Very little has been heard lately relative to the ROBINSON brothers, RICHARD and PAUL, in connection with prostitution activity along the Collinsville Road area bordering St. Clair and Madison Counties. They are occasionally seen in the Greater East St. Louis area, however, as is BOB CHAPMAN, an associate.

Since BOSS RANDOLPH took over the East St. Louis Police Department, very little is heard relative to police corruption. RANDOLPH, a one-time FBI Agent, has gained the confidence of most East St. Louis residents by cracking down and reshuffling some elements in the department. There is no question but that RANDOLPH has cleaned up the department.

The description of the bank robber at the Lebanon Trust and Savings Bank, Lebanon, Illinois, 10/31/69, would seem to closely resemble WILLIAM MC MERTREY (phonetic), Belleville area man who is known to the Alcohol and Tobacco Tax Unit of the Treasury Department.

FRANK KOCOT, owner, Frisco's Tavern, 13th and Natalie, East St. Louis, is still taking bets on horse racing. He often uses the "Chicago Tribune" newspaper as a racing form.





HEGE stated a check of the records of the company disclosed this ticket had been used, therefore, it was assumed the individual using the name of JERRY STAHL had actually made the flight to Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. HEGE stated his employee, E. J. BENNETT, was on duty on November 1, 1969, and might recall STAHL.

On November 5, 1969, E. J. BENNETT, Eastern Airlines, Woodrum Field, informed he could not recall the individual flying from Roanoke, Virginia, to Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, on November 1, 1969, on Flight Number 734, using the name of JERRY STAHL.

On November 5, 1969, BETTY WRIGHT, Agent, Air Travel Insurance, informed Policy Number 22399224 was written through the use of the machine at Woodrum Field. She informed a check of their copy of this policy disclosed it covered a flight from Roanoke, Virginia, to Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, on November 1, 1969, and the name JERRY STAHL - WAYNE E. SINN. 

CLINTON ALLEN BRAMLET, 13 South Stanley Road, Cottage Hills, Illinois was interviewed concerning his possible involvement in burglaries which occurred in the Alton, Illinois area. Prior to interview, BRAMLET was furnished a waiver of rights form which he read, stated he understood, and then signed.

BRAMLET stated that he had worked for McDonnell-Douglas Aircraft for approximately 11 years as a sheet metal worker, and that he had worked on the first shift, that is the day shift during this period. He advised that in the Fall of 1969, that he, in the company of ROBERT LEE COURTOISE and GEORGE ROTHWEILER, both former employees of McDonnell-Douglas, had gone to Tallahassee Florida area on a restaurant venture and had attempted to open a restaurant known as the Fountains Restaurant. BRAMLET stated that he had contributed \$1500 of his money for this restaurant, and that he believed ROTHWEILER had contributed a substantial amount of money from ROTHWEILER's retirement money which he obtained from retirement at McDonnell-Douglas. BRAMLET stated that although he had known COURTOISE for approximately 15 years, that he had only known ROTHWEILER approximately six months prior to going to Florida. BRAMLET stated that inasmuch as the restaurant venture was unsuccessful, that he had returned to the Cottage Hills, Illinois area and has been engaged in the construction of private homes since his return.

BRAMLET stated that he had lived in the Alton, Illinois area for most of his life, and that he was familiar with the area of Bunker Hill, Illinois as well as the Alton, Illinois area, but he denied any knowledge of or participation in the robberies of the First National Bank of Bunker Hill, Illinois, the Bank of Alton, Alton, Illinois, nor of the robbery of the Godfrey State Bank, Godfrey, Illinois.

BRAMLET advised that he had been arrested only once, and that was in the company of ROBERT COURTOISE, when both had stolen a farm tractor in 1968 in the Bethalto, Illinois area, but served no time for this theft.

BRAMLET advised that he had borrowed \$13,000 to build his house at 13 South Stanley Drive, and that he was attempting to build another house in the Cottage Hills area

ROBERT LEE COURTOISE, residing 210 Cooper Street, East Alton, Illinois, was interviewed at the offices of the L. A. Barton Construction Company, Alton, Illinois. At the outset of the interview COURTOISE was advised that this was in regards to his activity and possible involvement in bank robberies in the Alton, Illinois area. Prior to interview, COURTOISE was furnished a waiver of rights form, which he read, stated he understood, and then signed. COURTOISE furnished the following information:

COURTOISE advised that he had been working for approximately 5 - 6 years at McDonnell-Douglas Aircraft Company, St. Louis, Missouri, as a fiberglass worker and that in the Fall of 1969, he, in the company of CLINTON BRAMLET, had gone to the Tallahassee, Florida area with a former supervisor at McDonnell-Douglas Aircraft, GEORGE ROTHWEILER, and that he had performed numerous odd jobs for ROTHWEILER as they were attempting a restaurant venture and the restaurant was known as the Fountains Restaurant in Tallahassee. He advised that at the first part of the year, 1970, that he had returned to the Alton, Illinois area and had been working for the L. A. BARTON Construction Company and part of the time had worked at a Deep Rock service station, and later was employed for a brief period of time at a Moto Service station in Alton, Illinois.

COURTOISE related that he had lived in the Alton, Illinois area most of his life and was familiar with the areas around Bunker Hill, Illinois, but he specifically denied any knowledge of or participation in the bank robberies of the First National Bank of Bunker Hill, Bunker Hill, Illinois, or the Godfrey State Bank, Godfrey, Illinois.

COURTOISE related that he had only one serious incident with the law, that being in Bethalto, Illinois in 1968 when he, in the company of CLINTON BRAMLET had been arrested for the theft of a farm tractor, but he did not serve any time for this arrest.

On 2/8/71 JAMES POE, who is incarcerated at the Illinois State Penitentiary, Menard Branch, Chester, Illinois, was interviewed by the writer. POE was interviewed because of the fact he has furnished information to Agents of this Bureau in the past after being arrested on local charges.

POE advised that he is separated from his wife, DIANE POE. He advised that she is presently running with her brother, RICHARD BARKER, and a fellow from Kentucky. He stated they have been stealing state aid checks and cashing them in Illinois and possibly Missouri.

POE advised that DIANE POE, RICHARD BARKER, and the fellow from Kentucky, have been stealing from freight cars in the area of Mitchell, Illinois. He stated the thefts are from the area of Horseshoe Lake near gate to Granite City Steel sportsman's area. He advised they have been replacing seals on freight cars after they have broken the seals and checked the freight car to determine what merchandise is contained therein. He advised that the seals that they used are being obtained from a railroad transfer terminal on Route 111. He advised that a trailer is used for the office and is usually not locked. POE stated he knows for a certainty this is where the seals are obtained by his wife and her accomplices because he has stolen them from there himself in the past.

POE advised that THOMAS FLAUGHER or PLOYER (ph) from the Madison-Granite City, Illinois area was cashing cashier's checks from the First National Bank of Grafton about one year ago and indicated that an individual by the name of JIM HAMPTON had been convicted in Oklahoma on Federal charges in regard to this same group of checks which FLAUGHER was cashing. He advised that FLAUGHER is also associated with his wife, DIANE POE.

POE also advised that BARKER and FLAUGHER were robbing cars in Missouri and transporting them to Illinois.

He stated that this information goes back possibly about two years because the cars they were stealing were 1966 models or older and they were replacing the serial plates on the cars for serial plates they obtained by buying junk cars and transferring the serial plates to cars they had stolen.

POE advised that he has some acquaintances with individuals comprising burglary ring in the St. Louis, Missouri area, but has no specific information regarding burglaries committed by the group. He advised that he was well acquainted with MARVIN LYNWOOD EYK and JAMES LLOYD MC BRIDE. He advised that MC BRIDE was in the penitentiary with him at Jefferson City, Missouri. He stated that both EYK and MC BRIDE and other burglars in the area were working largely under the direction of BAY ADAMSON, who lives presently in St. Louis, Missouri, and who was editor of the prison newspaper at Moberly, Missouri. He advised that ADAMSON handles dope, is involved in prostitution and other illegal activities, and controls MC BRIDE and others by supplying them with narcotics.

POE stated that ADAMSON dealt with TERRY (LNU), a Negro narcotics pusher, who was killed in St. Louis, several months ago. POE described TERRY as ADAMSON's "hit man".

POE advised that ADAMSON tried to set up BAY EVANS, a burglar who is presently incarcerated at the Menard Branch at one time. EVANS is a member of a family involved in burglaries in the St. Louis, Missouri, and Illinois area. POE also advised that BILL POLITA (ph) and BILLIE WINSLOW were associates of EVANS as was EYK and MC BRIDE.

It is to be noted that ADAMSON is engaged in a printing business in St. Louis, Missouri, and information has been received in the past that ADAMSON has been involved in the handling of counterfeit securities.

POE was interviewed regarding his knowledge of various bank robberies and bank burglaries, including the burglaries of the New Athens Savings and Loan Association, New Athens, Illinois, 4/10-13/70, and the robbery of the Lebanon Trust and Savings Bank, Lebanon, Illinois, 10/31/69. He advised that he had no specific information regarding any bank burglaries or bank robberies in the area.

Recontacts with Lieutenant DON SANDIDGE and HAROLD "BUD" GALLOWAY, Alton PD, checks of records of the Alton PD and Madison County SO, and checks with other area law enforcement agencies have developed no information as to the possible identity of JIM NEVILLE.

COATNEY advised that if someone had named him (COATNEY) as being involved in a bank robbery it is possible that the individual had him confused with a BILL COATES who lives in Alton. He stated that the police have occasionally pulled him in for questioning when they had heard that a robbery was committed by COATES and thought that the source meant COATNEY.

COATNEY further advised that a JIM WHITE of Wood River, Illinois, is reputed to have robbed a bank in southern Illinois about four years ago and is reputed to have robbed a bank in southeastern Missouri about three years ago. COATNEY believes that WHITE may have also been involved in robbery of a bank in upper Alton.


