

At 11:15 a.m. on November 12, 1975, Cartha DeLoach, former Assistant to the Director, telephonically advised me that he was interviewed under oath by Mike Epstein and David Boshong of the Senate Select Committee on November 11, 1975. He advised that he was represented by Charles McNellis, an attorney in the Washington law firm of Edward Morgan. The testimony was recorded by a stenographer and principally dealt with general guidelines Mr. DeLoach used in briefing various Attorneys General concerning FBI work. They also inquired concerning the Counterintelligence Program in that they asked him if he had ever briefed Ramsey Clark regarding the Counterintelligence Program. Mr. DeLoach described that portion of the interview as a "political tug of war" in which Epstein attempted to have him say that Ramsey Clark had not been briefed, and Boshong attempted to have him say that Ramsey Clark had been briefed.

Mr. DeLoach said that he testified that he had briefed Ramsey Clark regarding the Counterintelligence Program and also briefed Clark regarding wiretaps and microphones at Clark's specific request. Mr. DeLoach was asked whether he had written a memorandum regarding that briefing, but he could not recall specifically whether the memorandum was prepared. He did say that it was the practice for a memorandum to be prepared recounting conversations with Department officials. The Committee representatives then advised Mr. DeLoach that they had asked for such documentation from the Bureau, but a memorandum indicating DeLoach had briefed Ramsey Clark regarding the Counterintelligence Program was not received among the documents furnished by the Bureau. Mr. DeLoach requested me to advise the Bureau that in view of such a memorandum can be located, it should be forwarded to the Committee.

Memorandum to Mr. Adams
Re: Senate Select Committee

Mr. DeLoach was asked whether anyone from the Bureau had alerted him to the possibility that he would be asked concerning briefing Ramsey Clark and whether anyone had suggested to him what his response should be. He denied that such was the case, but did say that he had received a telephone call from Assistant Director Wannall asking him the question whether DeLoach had briefed any Attorneys General regarding the Counterintelligence Program.

Mr. DeLoach was requested by the Committee to return on Tuesday, November 18, 1975, at 2:30 p. m. for additional interview at which time the subject will be the Southern Christian Leadership Conference and Martin Luther King.

Mr. DeLoach said that a Mr. Wallach of the Committee's staff described a memorandum which he claimed that DeLoach had prepared regarding Jack Anderson and the Warren Commission. Mr. DeLoach said that he could not recall such a memorandum.

Mr. DeLoach requested that the Bureau make available a Bureau representative for consultation at 2:30 p. m. on November 18, 1975. Mr. DeLoach said he made this request because he was uncertain as to the scope of the testimony he might be asked to give regarding Martin Luther King. In response to his question, I told Mr. DeLoach that information concerning certain confidential sources involved in the origination of the investigation of Martin Luther King has not been discussed with the Committee staff, but limited discussion has been had with Chairman Frank Church. I told Mr. DeLoach that inquiries concerning the informants involved in the basic information in that case should not be answered due to the sensitivity of the information.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. That the Intelligence Division determine whether there is a memorandum describing a briefing of Ramsey Clark by Mr. DeLoach concerning the Counterintelligence Program.

I would appreciate your asking the Bureau to provide to the Committee by the end of next week all memoranda and any other materials pertaining to:

1. Project CHATTER and any other programs involving research, experimentation, or use of drugs for interrogation purposes.
2. An August 11, 1950, meeting at the Naval Medical Research Institute (NMRI), Bethesda, Maryland, attended by Cartha DeLoach and/or Donald J. Parsons, which pertained to a CIA project on narco-hypnosis and an NMRI project on the surreptitious administration of speech-inducing drugs.
3. Information about speech-inducing drugs which was made available to NMRI and CIA following the meeting described in item 2 above.
4. A study by ONR on a projected research contract designed to improve the performance and reliability of the KEELER polygraph which was transmitted to the FBI following the meeting described in item 2 above.
5. The FBI's comments and recommendations on the study described in item 3 above which were transmitted to ONR.

The results of any investigations or inquiries conducted by Mr. Parsons pertaining to the possibility of securing volunteer federal prisoners for drug testing by NMRI following the meeting described in item 2 above.



In response to a Senate Select Committee request, a letter and letterhead memorandum dated 11/17/75 were prepared furnishing the Senate Select Committee information pertaining to name-check requests involving various news media personnel, Congressmen and other individuals which requests were made at the request of the White House. Since this material impacted on the White House, SA Paul V. Daly of this Division contacted assistant Counsel to the President James Wilderotter on 11/19/75 and advised him of the material which was being furnished to the Senate Select Committee. He was generally briefed on the content. Wilderotter stated he had previously discussed this material with Michael E. Shaheen, Jr., Special Counsel for Intelligence Coordination in the Department and given authority for the material to be transmitted to the Committee. He, however, requested that in view of the contents of the material the White House be immediately furnished a copy of the material being transmitted. Wilderotter requested that he be kept advised of any material of a similar nature which impacted on the White House which was being furnished to Congressional Committees.

The Intelligence Division was advised of Wilderotter's request that copies be furnished to the White House and stated that they would insure this was done.

Purpose is to advise of information furnished the Senate Select Committee (SSC) regarding subject in light of attached newspaper article in which Abernathy, President of the SCLC, states he was subjected to more severe attempts by the FBI to discredit blacks than was Martin Luther King and in which he claims a member of the SSC showed him numerous FBI memoranda dealing with himself. Also to recommend liaison contact with the SSC in attempt to ascertain facts of this matter.

It is noted that in response to voluminous SSC requests for material on Martin Luther King, Jr., and the SCLC many documents were furnished containing references to Abernathy. In a few instances the SSC asked for and received specific data regarding Abernathy.

Attached article makes reference to a number of Bureau memoranda allegedly seen by Abernathy, including one by former Vice President Agnew, in which Abernathy was described as one of the worst of the agitators and trouble makers and in which Agnew desired to know if the Director had any information in subject's file with which to embarrass him.

Our files contain no such memorandum, however, the attached memorandum of the Director dated 5/18/70 records a conversation between Mr. Hoover and Agnew that date in which Mr. Hoover referred to Abernathy in similar terminology (paragraph one lines four and five of attached memorandum). This memorandum was furnished the SSC by Bureau memorandum

Other documents furnished the SSC regarding Abernathy are: (1) Bureau letter to Atlanta 7/14/64 requesting information concerning Abernathy's escapades (2) FD-302 containing interview of Abernathy after King's assassination and (3) Correspondence with Pittsburgh office regarding counterintelligence activity against Abernathy, including copy of congressional record 5/6/68. (All attached.)

In addition the SSC asked whether Abernathy was ever the subject of electronic surveillances (a charge also made by Abernathy in the attached article).

[REDACTED] Abernathy was subject of active Bureau investigation following his assumption of the presidency of the SCLC in the spring of 1968. That investigation was closed in 8/74.

None of the attached documents furnished the SSC concerning Abernathy is classified and Legal Counsel Division concurs with Intelligence Division, that if a representative of the SSC exhibited such documents to Abernathy no violation of Federal laws is involved. Such action by the SSC, however, might constitute a breach of agreement between the FBI and the SSC which, in essence, is that information furnished the Committee is to be in confidence and not disclosed to unauthorized individuals.

RECOMMENDATION:

If approved, that a representative of the Legal Counsel Division, through liaison contact with the Committee, ascertain the facts of this matter.

Abernathy Claims He Was Top Target

Was FBI 'More Severe' on Him?

KANSAS CITY (AP) — Civil rights leader Dr. Ralph David Abernathy says a number of FBI memos, including one by former Vice President Spiro T. Agnew, convince him he was subjected to more severe attempts by the FBI to discredit blacks than was Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

Abernathy said a member of the Senate Intelligence Committee, which disclosed on Tuesday illegal FBI attempts to discredit King, visited him last week and showed him numerous FBI memos dealing with himself, King and the Southern Christian Leadership Conference.

He said one memo was from then-Vice President Agnew to the late FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover.

ABERNATHY said that in the memo Agnew "stated emphatically and clearly that he considered me to be one of the worst of the agitators and troublemakers and wanted to know of Mr. Hoover if there was anything that could be done, if they had any infor-

mation in my file that they could use to embarrass me, embarrass my family in an effort to destroy my effectiveness, because I was most effective with the masses, the ordinary people."

Abernathy also said the FBI not only tapped his telephone and bugged his hotel rooms, but also bugged his home.

"I really think that I have been subjected even more severely to what Dr. King

was subjected to," the 45-year-old SCLC president said yesterday at a news conference. He was here to speak at the Robert F. Kennedy Memorial Symposium at the University of Missouri-Kansas City.

HIS COMMENTS came when he was questioned on the FBI efforts to discredit black leadership. This included a letter to King which King interpreted as suggesting he commit suicide.

Abernathy said King was aware of the FBI campaign to discredit him and the SCLC movement, which he then headed, but did not attribute the letter to the FBI.

Abernathy said he and King thought the letter came from the Ku Klux Klan or the John Birch Society.

In Memphis, the Rev. Samuel B. Kyles, who was with King before his assassination in Memphis in 1968, said yesterday that the disclosure "calls for a whole new look at the investigative process that went into the King murder."

Kyles is head of Operation PUSH — People United to Save Humanity.

Vice President Spiro Agnew called. He said he wanted to talk to me about something to see whether I could be of some assistance. He said he was really concerned about the continuing inflammatory pronouncements of Ralph D. Abernathy. I commented that he is one of the worst. The Vice President said he has seen some of the background material on him and he knows what that is, but it is beyond the pale as far as executive use is concerned. He said in view of what went on in Augusta and other places, it is important to have the information that revolved around this; the involvement of these people, what information we have, whether fleeing from looting or what is going on. He asked if there is any information available.

I told him we are working on these at the present time, both in Augusta, Atlanta, and Jackson, where the recent demonstrations have taken place. I said we have pretty well concluded our investigation at Kent State University as to the shooting and, as always happens, we found a considerable amount of firearms in the dormitories and rooms of the students, whether they used them or not is a question; some say there was sniping and some say there was not. I said the same is true at Jackson as there are allegations of sniping at the troops before they fired and denials. We are interviewing all the individuals who had any knowledge, students, et cetera. I said the problem at Kent was they closed the university and the students departed for all parts of the country, but we finished the preliminary report on that and will finish today the final report on Kent, while at Atlanta, Augusta, and Jackson, it will probably be another week before we will have the preliminary reports. I said it is six of one and a half dozen of another, as you can't say it is proper to shoot, but we found at Kent that they were throwing 7 pound rocks at the soldiers and they hit one Guardsman in the back and knocked him down. There is just so much a human being can stand, and it is the same thing here at Maryland University. I said the National Guard is on the campus and they propose to

have a demonstration today and the Guardsmen are present, but they have been blocking Highway No. 1 most every day. I said very fortunately, they have arrested and charged three of the leaders for the damage done to the Administration Building when they went in the other night and broke the furniture, et cetera.

The Vice President said what he wants to be able to do is bring out some facts the media conveniently overlooked. I said they never give the things that are being done constructively, many times by students, to try to prevent this, but they emphasize all the things these jerks are doing.

The Vice President said he saw a picture about Augusta showing some of the Negroes jumping out of store windows with loot and booty and fleeing and you never hear anything about that. He said whatever I can give him that can ameliorate some of the impact; that he understands some of these things are wrong and we are probably going to find some of the shootings showed too much force, but none the less, the people have to understand the very thrust of the newspaper articles is that a bunch of police shot down six Negroes and what happened before -- why did they shoot at them -- not just because they felt like killing people. I said they were severely provoked at Kent and we will finish Augusta, Atlanta, and Jackson this week.

I told the Vice President I was sending to him Wednesday, the material Kent Crane asked for, which gives in summary the material we have sent in detail.

The Vice President said he thought he was going to have to start destroying Abernathy's credibility, so anything I can give him would be appreciated. I told him I would be glad to. I said I was the only one who spoke out against Martin Luther King and I got hell, but I did not give a damn because it is more like bouquets than brickbats from some people. The Vice President said we can't let demagogues become martyrs and heroes. I said I had briefed the Appropriations Committee about his (King's) background and it has been effective recently because they have been trying

to make a national holiday of his birthday, and many of the congressmen who know the facts are opposing it. I said I did not put it on the record, but I told the Appropriations Committee about his Piccadilloa and his degeneracy as we had recordings, but it was never made public as I gave it off the record to the Committee and they have, in turn, briefed some of their colleagues, but I will see that he, the Vice President, gets the details even before we finish the report.

The Vice President said he would like to be thoroughly conversant with all of that because if the crisis comes where we need to throw it, he will. I told him I would get it over in the next 24 to 48 hours as to the high-lights. The Vice President thanked me.

Noting the apparent disreputable nature of the newspaper in question and its publisher, it is imperative that factual data be obtained from original sources. You are, therefore, instructed to furnish the Bureau information available from your files concerning Abernathy's reported involvement with a 15-year-old girl. You should also request the appropriate office to obtain full court records, including transcripts of testimony, so that the fullest facts obtainable may be in the hands of the Bureau. Of course, no action should be taken which might cause embarrassment to the Bureau. This matter must be handled in a most discreet fashion and your instructions to any offices being furnished leads in this matter should contain such caution. This matter should be handled on a need-to-know basis in your and other offices.

Reverend RALPH DAVID ABERNATHY, 690 La Verne Drive, N. W., Atlanta, Georgia, was interviewed at the Memphis Police Department at 10:55 p.m., April 4, 1968. Reverend ABERNATHY was advised of the Agent's identity and of the nature of the matter under investigation.

Reverend ABERNATHY, who described himself as Vice President at Large and Treasurer of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, stated he was Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.'s closest associate and stated that he and Dr. KING always shared a room whenever they travelled together. He stated that at about 10:30 a.m. on April 3, 1968, he and Dr. KING registered at the Lorraine Motel, Memphis, Tennessee.

Reverend ABERNATHY stated that on April 4, 1968, he and Dr. KING did not leave the motel and spent most of the day in their room, #306, which is located on the second floor of the motel. He stated that he and Dr. KING had been gone from their room for approximately one hour or less when they returned to the room at about 5:30 p.m. He said they got dressed as they were going to dinner at the home of Reverend BILLY KYLE and that at almost exactly 6 p.m. they started to leave the room. Reverend ABERNATHY stopped for a moment and Dr. KING walked out onto the balcony just outside the door to his room. Reverend ABERNATHY was still inside the motel room but could hear Dr. KING discussing the dinner engagement with other associates who Reverend ABERNATHY believes were standing in the parking area of the motel underneath and to the front of the balcony on which Dr. KING was standing.

Reverend ABERNATHY stated he heard what sounded like a firecracker and then heard the screams of persons to whom Dr. KING had been talking. Reverend ABERNATHY went then to the balcony and discovered Dr. KING lying there wounded in the right side of the face and neck. He said he believed Dr. KING attempted to speak to him but was unable to do so. Reverend ABERNATHY said he instructed someone to call an ambulance and then accompanied Dr. KING in the ambulance to the hospital where Dr. KING subsequently died.

I can only add that Abernathy apparently has little control over himself—he couldn't have control of the threatened booby trap merging on Washington under the banner of a poor people's march. But he can be used to exploit poor people.

Mr. Speaker, I place the May 2 editorial from the Montgomery Advertiser in the Record at this point:

THE LEADER OF THE GREAT CRUSADE

It is preposterous but unfortunately true commentary on the recent history of the most powerful country on earth that it is now receiving ultimatums from the likes of Ralph D. Abernathy.

Abernathy succeeded to the late Dr. King's mantle in the Southern Christian Leadership Conference by virtue of an association dating from the Montgomery bus boycott.

King was at least glib and adroit in the guile by which he managed to flummox an alarming number of Americans. But Abernathy is an unpolished and disreputable clod best remembered here for what may have been a record dash from his church office on the night of Aug. 29, 1958.

Panic-stricken and screaming, he was pursued by an irate, hatchet-wielding husband who had accused him of having a relationship with his wife more suited to the pages of Krafft-Ebing's Psychopathia Sexualis than a family newspaper.

The wife of his assailant told a Montgomery Circuit Court jury in November 1959 that she had submitted to unnatural sex acts with the Reverend before her marriage, beginning at the age of 15, and that "he never stopped chasing me" even after her marriage to Edward Davis. She had been a member of Abernathy's church.

On the day Davis accosted Abernathy in his office, armed with pistol and hatchet, Abernathy had called her. Mrs. Davis testified.

The jury deliberated only 10 minutes, obviously invoking the unwritten law, before acquitting Davis of attempting to do in the preacher.

Yet, basking in the reflected glory of King, Abernathy emerged from the revolting case unscathed in the eyes of SCLC.

In 1960, he was signally honored by Prime Minister Kwame Nkrumah, the subsequently deposed dictator of Ghana, by being invited to Accra for a "Conference on Non-Violence and Positive Action for the Security of Africa."

This was heady stuff for a man who, but for his color and the accident of time and place, would never have been heard from. But he was to go on to loftier things, despite his unsavory background, finally being elevated to King's throne after the tragedy in Memphis.

Monday he led the vanguard of a movement which is trying to intimidate Congress not only into massive redistribution of the wealth to the poor (along with the shiftless), but into changing foreign policy. Vietnam is only one item of the agenda of the amorphous mass which may number in the tens of thousands (hundreds of thousands, some say) who will attempt to immobilize Washington by late May.

In their initial protest Monday, the Abernathy-led extortionists denounced U.S. diplomatic and business ties with Portugal and South Africa. The United States must not be encumbered, the formal statement said, "with the support in any way of racist societies abroad."

Although Abernathy keeps mouthing the old line about non-violence, this is once again semantic camouflage for the demand of violence unless Washington—the President and Congress—knuckles under to every demand.

The testimony of the youthful victim, Vivian McCoy Davis, uncontradicted by Abernathy, is so filthy and perverted that I cannot—in good conscience—place it in the Record for our colleagues' examination.

This is to advise of information furnished to the Senate Select Committee (SSC) on 11/13/75, documenting information previously provided to the Committee indicating our Cointelpro efforts had phased down prior to formal discontinuance of the programs on 4/28/71.

On 11/7/75, Barbara Banoff of the SSC staff advised the Committee had reviewed the exhibits in the Petersen Report on FBI Cointelpros in an effort to determine if Cointelpro actions had been phased down as indicated by SA David Ryan in his deposition to the Committee in 10/75. Banoff stated SSC staff members had reviewed all proposals for Cointelpro action in the Communist Party and New Left programs, as reported in the Petersen Committee Report exhibits, and these verified the fact these two programs had been considerably phased down prior to 4/71. She stated the Petersen Report exhibits did not list the dates of activities for proposals in the Black Nationalist, White Hate, and Socialist Workers Party programs and requested this be furnished to the Committee. According to Banoff, this information would be broken down for each of the five programs to show how many actions were instituted in each quarterly period during the life of the individual programs, and that a chart would be prepared for the Committee's use.

After obtaining information from the IS-1 and the IS-2 Sections (enclosed), the requested data for the additional three programs was furnished to Banoff on 11/13/75. These charts do indicate the programs had phased down considerably prior to their formal termination in 1971.

This refers to your request for information concerning participation by the Customs Service in a covert foreign intelligence operation of the FBI which relates to "denied areas" immigrants to the United States who decide to return to their country of origin or to some other "denied area." I understand from our conversation that the intelligence manual of the FBI refers to a procedure in which the FBI would request Customs officials to examine or to facilitate the FBI inspection of the outgoing baggage of such individuals. This appears to be a clandestine effort to determine if such "defecting emigrants" are transporting the products or other evidence of espionage or if they are being coerced into leaving the United States.

As I mentioned in our brief telephone conversation yesterday, Customs has advised me that it has no program for assisting the FBI in the inspection of outgoing baggage and has not been approached, at the Headquarters level, for this type of assistance. Its concern is with incoming baggage, and Customs doubts that it could segregate a particular individual's outgoing bag for inspection.

The Customs Service acknowledges that an FBI request for assistance could have been made with an individual Customs official at the local office level without the knowledge of Customs Headquarters


