Dear Mr. Innes:

This has reference to your letter of December 18, 1963, re: Lee Harvey OSWALD, Internal Security - R, your file reference 163-364.

2. Enquiries conducted in Montreal revealed that Mr. Aurelien CHASSE was unable to add anything further than that which was contained in his letter to the United States Secret Service. Mr. CHASSE stated that the first paragraph of his letter was a summarization of all the information he had obtained from the press and from word of mouth, and he was unable to name anyone who could furnish definite information regarding OSWALD's appearance in Montreal, apart from Mr. Jean Paul TREMBLAY.

3. Regarding the information given by Mr. Jean Paul TREMBLAY, Mr. TREMBLAY stated that on the day he was given the pamphlet by the person who he positively identifies as Lee Harvey OSWALD, he also saw approximately six other people handing out leaflets. Mr. TREMBLAY is uncertain about the dates the incident took place but believes it occurred in August. Photographs of persons participating in the Quebec - Washington - Guantanamo Walk for Peace in Montreal on the 7th and 8th of June 1963, were shown to Mr. TREMBLAY, who positively identified two of them as being engaged in distributing leaflets on the day in question. One of the persons he positively identified was the same woman described in your memorandum. The other person identified by Mr. TREMBLAY is believed to be Fred MOORE, of San Antonio, Texas. He could not identify any of the other people in the photographs as being present that date nor could he point out the person who gave him the leaflet and who he believes to be OSWALD.

A check of our records reveals that some of the Americans taking part in the Quebec - Washington - Guantanamo Walk for Peace were Neil HARWORTH, Co-Secretary of the Committee for Non-Violent Action; Bradford LITTLE, 35, of New York; Scott HERRICK, 37, of Norwich, Connecticut; A.J. MUSTE, National Chairman of the Committee for Non-Violent Action; George WILLOUGHBY, Chairman of the Executive Committee of the Committee for Non-Violent Action; Fred MOORE Jr., of Fillmore, California. These persons were seen driving a black Henney limousine bearing 1963 Connecticut licence number CD 726. Indications are that a 1948 or 1949 green Plymouth bearing 1963 Connecticut licence plate number 489-453 may have also been used by this group.



5. Additional enquiries in Montreal failed to reveal anyone who could state that Lee Harvey OSWALD had been in that city during the summer of 1963.
6. Although Mr. TREMBLAY believes this incident took place in August of 1963 judging by his identification of the photographs, it would appear that he actually saw them in early June of 1963.
7. An album containing photographs of participants in the Quebec - Washington - Guantanamo Walk for Peace is attached hereto and the persons TREMBLAY identified are persons listed as number 1 and 2 in photographs number 1 and 2. Photographs of the automobile bearing Connecticut licence plate number CD 726 are contained in photographs 9 and 10. Please return album when same has served its purpose.

ReBuairtel 12/13/63 captioned "Lee Harvey Oswald" and your letter 1/22/64 captioned "Assassination of President John F. Kennedy, 11/22/64, Dallas, Texas." [re information from Mr. Jean Paul Tremblay that he received in Montreal in August, 1963, a pamphlet entitled "Fair Play for Cuba" from an individual he believed was Lee Harvey Oswald.] (c)

Pursuant to instructions in Buairtel 12/13/63 you should prepare an appropriate letterhead memorandum in this matter suitable for dissemination, omitting the Bureau property stamp. Include in letterhead memorandum the contents of the letter received by Secret Service from the Bureau of Customs in Montreal which was later furnished to the Bureau by Secret Service. [Also set forth in letterhead memorandum the results of the RCMP inquiry conducted in this matter. Bureau is enclosing three sets of photographic prints made from the RCMP album furnished by your letter of 1/22/64 and you should make one set an enclosure to each of two letterhead memoranda for dissemination to the President's Commission at the Bureau. The third set of prints is for your file.] (c)

The album of photographs of participants of the "Walk for Peace" loaned to you by the RCMP is enclosed for return to RCMP. (c)

Secret Service on 12/11/63 furnished us with copy of a letter of 11/29/63 from U. S. Bureau of Customs in Montreal, Canada, which reported that Jean Paul Tremblay, Investigator, Customs and Excise, Montreal, advised that he had received a pamphlet entitled "Fair Play for Cuba" in Montreal in what he believed was August, 1963, from a man whom he believed was Lee Harvey Oswald. (c) determine if Oswald was in Montreal at alleged period. RCMP inquiry negative but they did furnish the Legat with a photo album of individuals participating in a "walk for Peace" in Montreal on June 7 and 8, 1963. Mr. Tremblay stated that the individual he believed was Oswald was seen by him on the same day he saw six other individuals handing out "Cuba" literature. He has identified by photographs two of the individuals as passing out literature on the day in question! According to RCMP, however, Tremblay could not point out in these photos the person who gave him the pamphlet and who he believes to have been Oswald. We know that Oswald was at work in New Orleans on June 7, 1963, from time punch cards of the William B. Reily Company, New Orleans. Commission will be furnished letterhead memorandum from Legat on receipt of Bureau.
