assisted in the murder (apparently a reference to the assassination). The British reported that Sergievsky appeared nervous and spoke of
having been given powdered poison when 11 years of age, which had the
effect of inducing an oxygen starvation of his brain. He also spoke of experiencing mental blanks and to have undergone a brainwashing pro-
cess in which a form of semihypnosis was induced by smoking disguised opium cigaretts. Sergievsky asked the British for asylum which was
