His articles in "L'Express" have been received from Legat. Paris, translated and copies thereof forwarded to the President's Commission. No active investigation being conducted on Buchanan, but information re his presence in the U. S. being furnished Legat for reference to the DSTIC which wants to know if Buchanan's articles were or were not written in Paris. If information shows articles prepared in Paris without visit to U.S. to get facts, Legat says **DST** may be able to take some discreet action to discredit or neutralize Buchanan.] Answers to Legat letters held up (C) pending receipt of translations of Buchanan's articles received in Paris 3-20-64 letter and of articles in "Die Welt" 3-17-64 and 3-19-64 which could be furnished to Legat, Paris, in one letter.
