Dear Mr. Mankin: Enclosed are two copies of a memorandum in the se Harvey Cowald case dated April 10, 1964, classified "Secret." The enclosed memorandum deals with the comments and speculations of one Elizabeth Catlett Mora, a naturalized Mexican citizen of American origin who is presently a member of the Communist Party of Mexico. In regard to Mora's remark concerning the importance of locating press references to Gevald's activiti in New Orleans, Louisiana, before he went to Russia, our report dated March 9, 1964, at New Orleans, Louisians, sets forth the negative results of our review of New Grienns newspapers for the period immediately prior to Gawait's Investigation departure for France on September 20, 1959. has previously established that Govald received his passport on September 10, 1969, at Los Angeles, California, and was discharged from the Balted States Marine Corps in California on September 11, 1959. You will observe that Mora has been ill and, because of her illness, our source has been unable to obtain additional data concerning her comments despite persistent efforts to this end. Our source is still hopeful of developing further details and additional information will be furnished to you as it is developed.

For your information, copies of the enclosed memorandum have been furnished to the Central Entelligence Agency in view of its interest in Oswald's activities while in Russia. (21)

NOTE:

The enclosed letterhead is from Mexico City. It sets forth speculations of Mora that Oswald could be linked to Mexico only through his activities prior to going to USSR in 1959. Mora indicated that tie in to Mexico may lie in press references to Oswald's activities in New Orleans for the few days he was in that area prior to going to Russia in September, 1959, when he was 19 years old. She also said that Oswald knew Mary Louise Patterson, (an American negress presently attending the Friendship School in USSR) when he was in Russia; hence we are furnishing copies of letterhead to CIA. Our sources in contact with Mora (the highly placed Mex-18 and Mex-19) anticipated spending a few days with Mora, who has been ill, during first two weeks of April however, they cannot assure us that Mora will be well enough for recontact as she has been ill for a long time.
