

On 4/26/68, WILLIAM F. ALEXANDER, Assistant District Attorney, Ballas Gounty District Attorney's Office, Ballas, Texas, was contacted on another investigative matter by SA CARL L. CURTIS, JR. During the course of this contact, ALEXANDER asked if MARK LANS was of any interest to the FBI. He was

advised by SA CURTIS that any FBI interest in LANE was unknown to him. ALEXANDER then commented that he had known for several years that a photograph of LANE as the subject of a masochist rite was in existence and that he (ALEXANDER) has acquired this photograph recently from an undisclosed source in New York.

ALEXANDER continued that MARK LANE had been critical of Dallas authorities and the FBI and had caused a lot of trouble for Dallas authorities. He stated that if MARK LANE should return to Dallas he would be confronted with this photograph.

SA CURTIS viewed that photograph which depicts a man nude, with his arms taped behind him, sexually aroused, and his sex organs being tortured.

A photograph of MARK LANE contained in Dallas files was viewed by SA CURTIS who states that if the man in the photograph exhibited by Mr. ALEXANDER is not MARK LANE, such individual bears definite similarities to him.

Copies of this communication are furnished the New York Office for information as that office was formerly the office of origin in the LANE case and may have some knowledge of the existence of a photograph of LANE as described above.

The foregoing information is furnished for the information of the Bureau, and New York and New Orleans and will not be submitted in LHM for dissemination, UACB, as to disseminate such information it is felt contact with ALEXANDER would have to be made as he indicated he was exhibiting the photograph "confidentially" To indicate to ALEXANDER that this bureau had an interest in MARK LANE is not considered advisable, inasmuch as ALEXANDER was a somewhat controversial figure in connection with the investigation concerning the leak of information to the press concerning OSWALD's diary during the course of the assassination investigation.
