On the evening of 4/2/64 MEX-18 and MEX-19 orally furnished the writer with the following information in further clarification of the information furnished by the informants concerning the statements made by REVA BERNSTEIN as previously reported (100-2363-33, 34).

Informants advised that at the time of the HELEN TRAVIS case (Mexico City file 100-1403) in October and November, 1962, REVA EERNSTEIN had advised the informants that she picked up mail for the FPCC at a post office box across the border from Detroit (probably at Windsor, Ontario, Canada, although the informants could not be positive that the box was located in Windsor, the box, however, was definitely located in Canada). BERNSTEIN advised the informants that she picked up propaganda material printed in Cuba and sent to that Canadian address and brought it to the United States. occasion, however, the propaganda was voluminous and was contained in a "large box" so that when BERNSTEIN went to pick it up at the post office, the Canadian postal employee questioned her closely concerning the contents of the box. When the Canadian postal employee showed such an interest, BERNSTEIN claimed that she became frightened and told the posal employee that the box did not belong to her. (2/4)

The Friday or Saturday night following the assassination of President KENNEDY, representatives of the RCMP (previously described as the Canadian "secret service" but which the informants stated that BEANSTEIN referred to specifically at one time as the "Royal Canadian un-Mounted Police") called BERNSTEIN by phone from Canada and stated they wanted to talk with her regarding the receipt of mail in Canada. Informants advised that both BERNSTEIN and her husband, JOSEPH BERNSTEIN, are Canadians by birth and although naturalized
