SUBJECT: SENSTUDY 75

DETAILS: As a result of SSC request for certain documents, Steven Blackhurst, Assistant Special Counsel for Intelligence Coordination, DOJ, furnished eight documents to Bureau Supervisor, S. F. Phillips, for excision of informant or third agency information where appropriate. Six of the documents were returned by Mr. Phillips to Mr. Blackhurst on 5/14/76 with no excisions. It should be noted that among the six documents returned to Mr. Blackhurst on 5/14/76 was an FBI letterhead memorandum, 3/21/67 captioned, "Assassination of President John Fitzgerald Kennedy, November 22, 1963, Dallas, Texas." [Central Intelligence Agency (CIA)] clearance regarding this document had been previously received when the Bureau furnished this document to the SSC from Bureau files. SUBJECT: The Garrison Investigation of the
Assassination of President Kennedy --
Alleged CIA Connections with Garrison's
Suspects

SECRET

New Orleans District Attorney James C. Garrison has made numerous charges that several of his suspects in his investigation of the assassination of President Kennedy have had connections with the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA). There follows some of his specific allegations which we have learned about either from Garrison's public statements or from FBI sources and the known comments of the CIA with respect thereto.

1. Garrison claims that Lee Harvey Oswald did not kill President Kennedy but that the President was assassinated by five anti-Castro Cubans who were angered over his handling of the Bay of Pigs invasion. Garrison claims that the assassins were former CIA employees committed to an adventure in Cuba. Garrison has said that he does not believe the CIA planned the Kennedy murder, or knew of it beforehand, but that the CIA is making every effort to prevent his office from trailing or learning the whereabouts of the assassins as it is concerned about its own power. The CIA was quoted in the newspapers as stating that the organization would have no comment on Garrison's remarks. (Evening Star, 5/22/67) JAN 12 1971

2. Garrison has reportedly said that he has letters signed by CIA representatives or by Senator Robert F. Kennedy which authorize certain Americans to work with Cubans for the assassination of Castro. (FBI Memo 5/17/67)

3. Garrison reportedly believes that there was an anti-Castro training camp on the shores of Lake Ponchartrain near New Orleans which was operated by the CIA to train assassins to send to Cuba and that Oswald was once at the camp. This camp was reportedly run by an individual known as Richard Davis. (FBI Memos 4/6/67, 5/15/67)

To our knowledge, no information has been received from CIA concerning the alleged training camp or Richard Davis. An FBI memorandum of March 3, 1967, reported that the Bureau files contain no information indicating that Oswald had any connection with Davis. Davis has been described as a promoter and a hustler, who will do anything for money, and is often carried away with his own thinking. (149-4801)

4. Garrison claims that Oswald was probably a CIA agent who worked undercover with anti-Castro Cubans with the knowledge of Federal agents. Garrison claims that Oswald was recruited by CIA for an operation, approved by President Kennedy, the purpose of which was to assassinate Fidel Castro, and when Oswald assassinated President Kennedy it became necessary to show him as a Communist in order to conceal the original plan. (UPI 5/8,9/67, New York Times 5/10/67)

The Directors of the CIA and FBI testified before the Warren Commission that Oswald was never in the employ of their agency in any capacity.

5. Garrison has charged that the CIA gave the Warren Commission a fake photograph instead of providing a picture of Lee Harvey Oswald and a Cuban companion leaving the Cuban Embassey in Mexico City in 1963, because Oswald and/or his Cuban companion were CIA agents.
