On 10/22/53, CSNY 4254 of known reliability, furnished NY SA E. K. DEANE & SE P. G. MITCHELL a typewritten letter dated 10/17/53 from the subject to the "Daily Worker" inquiring as to the subscription rates for the paper.

This letter was obtained from 35 E. 12th St., N.Y.C. This building was occupied by the following organizations, which were all under the control of the Communist Party: Publishers New Press, Inc. ("Worker" and "Daily Worker"); Morning Freiheit Association ("Morning Freiheit" and "Jewish Life"); Workers' Bookshop; F & D Printing Co.; 12th - 13th Realty Corporation. Strict care must be exercised so that the existence of this important source of evidence will not become known to any outside agency. It is also to be noted that because of the nature of this source of information it will be impossible to re-contact the source regarding information furnished.

This typewritten letter reads as follows:

October 17, 1953

I would like to subscribe to your newspaper. Will you please inform me of the rates as soon as possible. ?
