that he had seen a copy of
the release letter and under-
stood it.

Mr. [REDACTED] Blair said that
his assignment in Mexico
had ended in February, 1962.
He said that he had been
involved in technical opera-
tions and saw the unilateral
telephone taps. He said that,
in addition to the liaison
taps, the Mexico Station had
extensive unilateral telephone
coverage on the Soviet and
Cuban Embassies.

[REDACTED] Blair said that
[REDACTED] had overall
responsibility for planning
and directing Cuban Operations
when [REDACTED] Blair was there. At
that time [REDACTED] Blair saw
the photo operations.

[REDACTED] Blair said that there
was only one photo base on
the Cuban Embassy. He was

responsible for this base.

Employee [redacted] was the outside man who ran this base.

[redacted] BLAIR said that there was some other type of technical operation in that base but he does not remember any details about it.

BLAIR [redacted] picked up the production from this base and turned it over to [redacted]

Mr. [REDACTED] said that the main thing to remember about the Mexico station was that it was very busy and active, and was almost entirely concerned with counter-intelligence.

~~BLAIR~~ said that Win Scott was a "great manager" who was "hyper-dedicated and very demanding." He said that Win Scott's files were probably better than anything I had heard about them. He said that Scott had a very efficient registry system for the files. He said that the files were easy to work with and were extensive. He said that Scott would not tolerate incompetence or lack of thoroughness.
