## WEEKLY SUMMARY

MM 833 PCI advised on 10/10/62, that JOSEPH INDELICATO (Miami file 92-404) had four visitors at this residence on that afternoon. From automobile license numbers and descriptions furnished by informant, it appears that these visitors were MILTON and EDWARD SEINFELD, owners of the Admiral Vee Motel; MARIO TALUCCI, maitre de at the Embers Restaurant, Miami Beach, Fla., and an unknown male.

The Miami Herald Newspaper of 10/11/62, reported that on 10/10/62, Circuit Judge PAT CANNON, at Miami, threw out the only conviction ever secured against ELUM CAUDELL (Miami file 165-6) in 19 trials on charges relating to bookmaking. CAUDELL drew a 1 year sentence 9/18/61, for malicious destruction of telephone equipment. A jury found him guilty of cutting wires leading to three bookie telephones as law enforcement officers broke into a store room at 9435 N. W. 17th Avenue, on 12/14/60. According to the news article, Judge CANNON ruled that Criminal Court Judge JACK FALK should not have permitted the jury to hear the testimony of a state attorney's investigator ED MC COLLUM. CANNON, according to the newspaper, said MC COLLUM's testimony that he had arrested CAUDELL five times in cases where phone

equipment was damaged, was irrelevant. CANNON said CAUDELL should have a new trial.

MM 509-C on 10/2/62, advised that the chief dispenser of football parlay cards at Miami Beach is MILTON SPITZER; that SPITZER has JACK RAMOS handling the cards at Alfie's Sundry Stores; JOE ZABLO is distributing them out of George's Newstand, Miami Beach, and that he has as other distribution points, the Plaza Hotel, Miami; ed Fla., where sizable poker games are being operated and at BEN HUSICK's (Miami file 162-80) South Beach Democratic Club, Miami Beach, (Miami file 165-177)

This source advised that JERRY FISHMAN (Miami file 166-43) and an employee of HYMAN MARTIN (Miami file 92-218) is now frequenting the Patio Bridge Club, Miami Beach, where he plays a card game called 'Million", with JIMMY COPPOLA, brother of MICHAEL COPPOLA (Miami file 92-101).

In addition this source advised that JERRY ZAROWITZ (Miami file 165-75) returned to Miami from the Lake Tahoe, California, area and is again betting heavily on sports.

MM 509-C advised further that a great deal of remodeling is going on at the old La Scala Restaurant, Dade County, Fla., and that JAMES PALMAISANO (Miami file 92-503) and ANTHONY RANDAZZO (Miami file 92-403) are 2 of the principals who are going to reopen the place, which they hope to also use as a center for gambling and bookmaking operation.
