REBUTEL JULY 10 LAST GRANTING AUTHORITY TO REENTER ARMY LOUNGE. *U*

CG 6533-C MET WITH GIANCANA AFTERNOON OF JULY 11 LAST AND HELD DISCUSSION OF HOUR DURATION DURING WHICH TIME IT WAS LEARNED GIANCANA HAD PLANS TO LEAVE CHICAGO EITHER LATE EVENING OF JULY 11 LAST OR DURING DAY OF JULY 12 LAST. GIANCANA ADVISED INFORMANT THAT HE HOPED TO RETURN TO CHICAGO BY THURSDAY, JULY 16 NEXT IN TIME TO CELEBRATE BIRTHDAY AND INVITED INFORMANT TO JOIN HIM ON THAT OCCASION. ADVISED INFORMANT THAT IN EVENT HE IS UNABLE TO RETURN BY JULY 16TH HE WILL MAKE CONTACT AS SOON THEREAFTER AS HE RETURNS TO CHICAGO. NO INDICATION GIVEN AS TO WHEREABOUTS OF GIANCANA THIS TIME. *U*
