Re Dallas airtel to Bureau, 3/23/62.

Referenced Dallas airtel set forth information to the effect that a Ft. Worth gambler, J. B. KING, JR. had advised Dallas informant DL-149-C, that Federal authorities were putting heat on the Police Department and KING mentioned to informant that several "higher ups" in the Ft. Worth Police Department have been stating they were going to see SA MYERS' boss in Dallas to get him to "keep his nose out of their business."

On April 4, 1962, SA B. TOM CARTER and SA EARLE HALEY were at the Police Department in Ft. Worth in connection with another matter. CATO HIGHTOWER, Chief of Police, invited the Agents into his office. He stated he wanted to pass on some information to these Agents.

HIGHTOWER pointed out his Department had been under fire from the state grand jury which recently convened and from the local newspapers. Both had charged "irregularities" in the Police Department.

HIGHTOWER stated there was a group of policemen in his Department who were causing trouble by advocating a change in all the ranking officers. He stated Patrolman L. R. DORSETT was the leader of the group and mentioned Patrolmen J. M. STEVENSON, EDMONDSON, and COLE as being known members of this group. He also stated there was an insurance salesman by the name of SAM LUCARIELLO, 3954 Garrison, who was a member of the group. He pointed out he had succeeded in getting an informant into this group. He stated some of his officers say DORSETT is "psycho" because of allegations he has made. DORSETT in November, 1961, alleged there was a communist clique in the Police Department. On another occasion DORSETT stated there was a nation-wide narcotic ring operating between Los Angeles, California and Carswell Air Force Base, Ft. Worth and on to Chicago, St. Louis
