On July 9, 1968, MEX 156 advised he had reviewed passenger manifests of flights from Tijuana, Baja California, to Mexico City. The manifest for flight 111, Aeronaves de Mexico, Tijuana to Mexico City, April 12, 1968, bears the name "JOSE TRAFICANTE." Immediately below this name is the listing of another person only as "TRAFICANTE." This is assumed to be subject and his wife.

The following information was furnished on a confidential basis by ALEJANDRO CORTINA, Assistant Manager, Hotel Maria Isabel Mexico City:

According to records of the Motel Maria Isabel, Mr. and Mrs. SANTO TRAFFICANTE, 740 Northeast 155th Street, Miami, Florida registered at that hotel on April 12, 1968. They did not have a prior reservation. Upon registering they agreed to depart before April 19, 1968. They were listed as American citizens. They were assigned Room 1401 at 175 pesos (\$14 U.S.) a day. They

departed on April 19, 1968.

Apparently upon registering subject/made a cash deposit of 2480 pesos (\$198.40 U.S.). This was probably a \$200 cash deposit reduced by the hotel's rate of exchange. When he checked out on April 19, 1968, he was reimbursed the sum of 659 pesos (approximately \$52.80). The remainder was expended in daily charges of 175 pesos and other normal charges such as in the tobacco shop, valet service and telephone calls.
