There follows a summary of information concerning developments in the above-captioned matter on 10/31/68:

RICARDO MORALES NAVARRETE advised SA GEORGE E. DAVIS, JR. on 10/31/68, that a friend of his, JESUS HERNANDEZ MEDINA, had been contacted by JESUS DOMINGUEZ BENITEZ at the Vivian Boatyard in Hialeah, Fla., where both BENITEZ and MEDINA are employed. BENITEZ was deriding in a general manner to several persons, including MEDINA, an individual whom he described as a no good informant and fink or words to that effect. Eventually it became known to MEDINA that BENITEZ was making reference to RICARDO MORALES NAVARRETE. MEDINA, because of his loyalty to MORALES, made an effort to elicit further details concerning this matter so that he might relate same to his friend MORALES. Subsequently MEDINA and BENITEZ met with two other defendants in the above-captioned matter, namely JORGE GUTIERREZ ULLA and AIMEE MIRANDA. Also present at a subsequent meeting was MARCELINO GARCIA, a confidant of ORLANDO BOSCH but not a co-defendant in this matter. Eventually in the late afternoon and evening of 10/31/68, a proposition was made to MEDINA that he volunteer his services to defense counsel of BOSCH as a prospective defense witness so that he could testify that MORALES' brother, who is commonly known as POOCHO MORALES, had told him that MORALES was currently employed by "the company". ("The company" is the term utilized by the entire Cuban exile community when making reference to CIA.)

*MORALES* informed SA DAVIS that he has never told JESUS HERNANDEZ MEDINA of his previous CIA affiliation and he desired to make JESUS HERNANDEZ MEDINA available to BuAgents for interview, which he did.
