Reference information furnished on 12/8/61 advising that ABEL JOHN CHAUVIN was furnishing to local handbook operators the results of the New Orleans Fairgrounds Race Track.

PCI RAYMOND ROLLING advised on December 27, 1961, that this wire service of CHAUVIN was discontinued on 12/22/61. PCI advised that CHAUVIN suspects that this information was bootlegged to P. J. MARTINO on the Miss. Gulf Coast, Biloxi, Miss. ABEL JOHN CHAUVIN is the long time employee of the Nola Printing Company. P. J. MARTINO is a notorious handbook operator on the Miss. Gulf Coast and possessor of a federal wagering stamp. A new case is being opened to attempt to confirm this information.

PCI RAYMOND L. ROLLING advised 1/2/62 that he is now getting his race wire service from EDGAR BABCOCK.

EDGAR BABCOCK, Dixie Kitchen, 711 1/2 Metairie Road, a federal gambling stamp holder, advised that the results of the New Orleans Fairgrounds Race Track are furnished to him directly from the vicinity of the New Orleans Fairgrounds by a friend who goes to the track, observes the results of the races, and then calls him from a phone outside the track.

Investigation reflected that none of the above individuals possess federal wagering stamps. The baseball inning tickets are alleged to be drawn from a device similar to a punchboard on an imaginary game between teams of the American and National Leagues. These tickets are sold throughout the day in Meridian, mostly to Negroes and then sometime each day there is a machine from which colored balls are dropped into a trough representing nine innings of a baseball game. Winners are determined from use of this machine. The operation of this baseball inning ticket game may constitute a lottery which will bring it in the jurisdiction of the U. S. Treasury Department and the operators might be required to possess federal wagering stamps. By separate letter Mr. JAMES J. ENOCH, District Director, Internal Revenue Service, Jackson, Miss., is being advised of the above.
