GUS ALEX, AKA., AR. DAILY SUMMARY.

CG SIX FOUR FOUR THREE DASH C RECENTLY ADVISED THAT THOMAS MUNIZZO IS A CLOSE FRIEND OF ALEX AND THAT HE IS THE CONTACT MAN BETWEEN THE MAYOR-S OFFICE AND ALEX AND HIS HOODLUM ASSOCIATES FOR ANY FAVORS IN THEIR BEHALF.

MUNIZZO INTERVIEWED YESTERDAY AND ADVISED THAT HE IS A CLOSE PERSONAL FRIEND OF CHICAGO-S MAYOR DALEY HAVING BEEN ASSOCIATED WITH HIM IN POLITICS ALL HIS LIFE.

MUNIZZO SAID HE HAS KNOWN GUS ALEX AND ALEX-S FAMILY SINCE ALEX WAS A BOY AND THAT WHEN ALEX WAS ABOUT TWENTY YEARS OLD, HE WORKED FOR ABOUT SIX MONTHS AS A TRUCK DRIVER FOR HIS FATHER. HE SAID THAT SINCE THAT TIME HE HAS KNOWN LITTLE CONCERNING ALEX AND HIS ACTIVITIES. HE SAID THE LAST TIME HE SAW ALEX WAS ABOUT A YEAR AGO AT THE WAKE OF JOHN SORTINO, DECEASED BROTHER OF FRANK FERRARO.

MUNIZZO SAID HE IS ALSO ACQUAINTED WITH MURRAY HUMPHREYS, FRANK FERRARO, RALPH PIERCE, AND FRANK SKID CARUSO BUT HAS NOT SEEN THEM FOR OVER A YEAR. HE DOES NOT SOCIALIZE WITH ANY OF THEM AND HAS NO
