On 1/4/62, DL-95-C identified the third owner of the Red Men Club as Postman ELMER GLUCK. GLUCK was a Postman involved in the hijacking of a poker game several years ago in Dallas and further investigation being conducted concerning GLUCK.

On 1/2/62, Patrolman LEONARD DORSETT, advised SA JOSEPH M. MYERS that former Fort Worth police Lieutenant McCALEB who resigned from the Fort Worth PD several months ago is now employed at a liquor store at 28th and Cliff Streets in Fort Worth. DORSETT stated that McCALEB could possibly be

developed into a good source of information as he is believed to know a lot about the criminal element in Ft. Worth. (Efforts are being made to contact McCALES to develop him as a APCI). DORSETT advised that former Vice Squad Sergeant ROBERT WOOTEN who resigned from the PD about 2 years ago is now located in California, town not known, but is reported to have purchased a motel there for \$40,000 and this money is believed to have come from payoffs received by WOOTEN from prostitutes and gambling in Ft. Worth prior to his leaving the force. DORSETT stated he understood that WOOTEN had gone to California prior to leaving Fort Worth permanently and took two Fort Worth prostitutes with him and spent something like \$20,000 on this This information was also furnished trip while in California. to SA MYERS on 1/4/62 by DL-84-C and PCI advised that while in Ft. Worth when she was residing on 9th Ave. she gave Officer WOOTEN \$20 to \$50 over a period of 6 or 7 months every few days. Informant stated that at the time she was earning a lot of money as a prostitute and estimated that she gave WOOTEN approximately \$1,000 over a few month's period. At one time she stated she gave WOOTEN either \$10 or \$20 when he approached her at a telephone booth in the downtown section of Fort Worth. Informant stated further that a Negro bellhop named TINY at the Rockwood Courts on the Jacksboro Highway had told her somewhere around 1958 or 1959 that WOOTEN took two Ft. Worth prostitutes to California. DL-84-C stated that most recently she has given \$10 to \$20 at different times to Vice Squad Officers E. M. BILGER, H. T. CLUCK and Vice Squad Officer McMILLAN. stated that he has several girls working for him in Ft. Worth in 1957, 58 and 59 and he estimated that he gave former Vice Squad Officer WOOTEN \$500 to \$600 in cash over a period of several months plus a diamond ring which he understood WOOTEN was wearing when he left Ft. Worth. stated that he had been told by Ft. Worth prostitutes VIC TE CARMICHAEL and another Ft. Worth prostitute named ____ did not recall, that they had traveled PAT. last name to California with WOOTEN about 1958 and WOOTEN had spent \$20,000 <u>to \$25</u>,000 on them in clothes and jewelry while ____stated that CARMICHAEL told him that she had seen WOOTEN with either \$104.000 or \$140.000 in cash in his suitcase. (A new 31 matter is being opened in the Dallas Division re this).

Patrolman DORSETT advised on 1/7/62 that he had learned through some of his associates in the PD that Chief of Police CATO/HIGHTOWER's brother C. L. HIGHTOWER, formerly

operated a building plant known as University Supply and Equipment Co. at East Rosedale and East Lancaster Streets in Fort Worth until a short time ago when he went into bankruptcy. DORSETT stated he understood that the 1957 and 1958 Fort Worth police annuals had been printed by this company and that the annuals were purchased by officers of the PD for \$6. DORSETT estimated that 1,000 annuals were printed, costing the officers about \$60,000 and DORSETT felt sure that HIGHTOWER received his cut from this business. This information is being furnished to the IRS in Fort Worth.
