

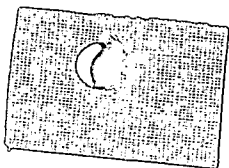

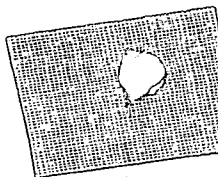

Re Miami teletypes to Bureau dated 11/23 and 29/62
entitled JOSEPH ANTHONY INDELICATO, Aka, AR.

While in Tampa on 11/26/62, Mr. WILLIAM KENNEY,
Assistant Attorney General, Miami, advised

He mentioned he had not as yet learned
from Internal Revenue Service how HARLAN ALEXANDER BLACKBURN
allegedly contacted subject in Miami in the past as he
had previously mentioned.

Investigation by Legat, Mexico City, indicates
no open gambling permits nor gambling casinos planned
at Guatemala.

Houston advised 11/21/62 that a deputy sheriff
there had made inquiry of the Tampa PD concerning subject;
however, nothing further of any importance developed.

Cadillac observed at Columbia Restaurant in
Tampa in the past registered to CHARLES V. and BETTY J.
PASSANTINO, 44 Cocoanut Grove, Palm Beach, Florida, but
no specific connection with subject developed there.

JACK de la LLANA, Tampa PD, Intelligence Unit, advised 11/27/62 he had an agreement with FRANK CAPPELL, Miami PD, Intelligence Unit, to be immediately advised telephonically should SANTO leave Miami and he had no word that SANTO had returned to Tampa from Miami. He advised on the night of 11/26/62 that he had been told by a source, whom he identified only as being Italian, who had just arrived from Miami that he had seen SANTO TRAFFICANTE at the Fontainebleu Hotel, Miami Beach, over the weekend, 11-24, 25-62, accompanied by MARK HAWES, an attorney from St. Petersburg, Florida, who represented HENRY TRAFFICANTE in criminal matters in the past. HAWES was also identified by de la LLANA as presently being an attorney handling a Florida Senate Investigating Committee regarding state affairs.

De la LLANA said source asked him (de la LLANA) if SANTO were living there and made the comment that after he had breakfast, he intended to exchange greetings, but subject had already left.

De la LLANA said that another source told him that subject had something going in New Mexico, but that was the only information he had heard concerning subject.

Daily checks of subject's residence for his presence negative. Fisur at 2505 Bristol, 11/29/62 only established regular vehicles there and SARA ANN attended the University of South Florida and returned to residence at 4:22 PM.

CHARLES SAMS, U.S. Postal Carrier (PROTECT), who carries mail to subject's residence on a daily basis, advised on 11/29/62 only subject's daughter and son-in-law were observed. He stated ANNIE MAE JACKSON, maid at 2505 Bristol, is also on his route and she has been ill.

No information developed from JACKSON on 11/29/62.

[REDACTED] PCI, (PROTECT) advised 11/28/62 that the subject has not been seen or reported at the Columbia Restaurant.

Mrs. DANE BAILEY, Station Supervisor, Mackey Airlines, Inc., Tampa International Airport, advised SA JOHN
