Mins LORENZ was operated on 1/20/60 and was released from the hospital on 1/22/00. All information in possession of Myo regarding this matter is being set forth in a form sulfable for alssemination.

edvised the MYO on 1/22/00 that the received a cable er 5 c.s. on 1/22/6d from Mencedes Moneyo the hed carriod a personal letter to PIDEL CAUTIO regarding the abortion performed in Mavana on MANIFA LÖREW and esking that the Oubon Government deswie responsibility for hospital and medical expenses. Mrs. LORENZ eccording to instructions in cable contacted HERCIDES PORENO by phone and MORENO told Yrs. LORENZ that mire had delivered the letter to PIDEL CASTRO and that CASTRO oleimed ignorance of the abortion and all blace was being placed on Captain JESUS YAVES PELLETIER. FIGTENO stated that PELLETTER had threatened harm to Man. LONEWS and MARITA LORGIZ for writing this letter and said that PELLETIER had accused her, Mondayo, and her father, of counter revolutionary activity.

RAFAEL DIAZ BALART, source of information, who is in charge of the "White Robes", an anticolastro Organization telephonically advised the NYOtthat members of the July 26th Movement would picket International Airport on the afternoon of 1/22/60 when Spanish Ambassador JUAN PABLO de LOJENDIO would arrive enroute to Madrid, Spain after being asked to leave Cuba by FIDEL CASTRO.

Lieutenant FRANCIS M. SULLIVAN, Commanding Officer, BSS, NYCED was advised of the information furnished by DIAZ BALART and BSS sent men to the airport to ensure that any picketing would be orderly.

ALFREDO HERNANDEZ, source of information, advised on 1/22/60 that there was a picket at the airport upon the arrival of the Spanish Ambassador to Cuba, JUAN de LOJENDIO, who was recently asked to leave Cuba.

The NYO will, from established sources, ascertain the reason for Captain PELLETIER'S presence in NYC, and attempt to determine his activities and contacts.

It is the opinion of the NYO that PELLETIER, due to his close contact and association with FIDEL CASTRO, is not a political defecte of the Castro Government and that if he defects or leaves Cuba it is because of personal reasons rather than political reasons.
