Re Bureau airtel to Albany, 4/22/63.

In connection with Bureau instructions it has been ascertained that at the present time there are no specialized police gambling schools being conducted within the Dallas Division. It is noted, however, that close liaison is being maintained by the Dallas Division with trustworthy law enforcement officers concerning procedures employed by gamblers and bookmakers and vernacular used by these subjects. Any pertinent information developed is immediately brought to the attention of agents assigned to the Criminal Intelligence Program in the Dallas Division for assistance in their investigations.

In connection with State laws regarding introduction of microphone evidence in State trials, it has been determined that there is no such law either pro or con, concerning this matter in Texas, according to local trustworthy police officers and the local DA's office, Dallas. These sources, however, state that it is their belief that the introduction of such evidence in local trials would be barred in view of recent supreme court decisions and therefore, any evidence so obtained is not even used in local trials. It is also noted there is presently before the Texas House of Representatives, a proposed legislation introduced by a group of Texas attorneys which would make wiretapping, by anyone, a violation and punishable by imprisonment.
