Miss Marita Lorenz, 344 West 87th Street,
New York City, telephonically contacted the New
York Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation
on March 11, 1960 and advised that Captain Yanez
had come to her apartment on the morning of March 11,
1960, and had asked her to accompany him to Mexico.
Miss Lorenz stated that Captain Yanez accused her of
being the cause of his falling out with Fidel Castro,
Prime Minister of Cuba, and because of her, Castro
forced him, Yanez, to divorce his wife in Cuba
and told him to marry Marita Lorenz.

Concerning Marita Lorenz, it is to be
noted that she resided in Havana, Cuba from the
latter part of February, 1959 until October, 1959
when she returned to New York City.

Miss Lorenz was considered one of the
girl friends of Fidel Castro and, according to
the information furnished by her, she was five months
pregnant by Castro and when this was ascertained, she
had been drugged and an abortion had been performed
on her in Havana, Cuba.

Re: Jesus Jose Secundino Yanez Pelletier

Lieutenant Enright stated that Miss Lorenz did not press charges against Captain Yanez on the assault and attempted rape and the matter was dismissed by the New York City Police Department.

Lieutenant Enright further stated that Miss Lorenz had told him that she was leaving on her father's boat at midnight March 14, 1960, for Germany.

NY T-1, an individual who is connected with anti-Castro activities in the New York area, on 3/15/60, advised that he had been told by a source within the Cuban Consulate that Captain Yanez had appeared at the Cuban Consulate on March 14, 1960, and that the Cuban Consul General, Rogelio Guillot, had made a special request of the Mexican Consul General to issue a visa for Captain Yanez for Mexico.

NY T-1 stated that his source within the Cuban Consulate advised that Jose Vasquez Blanco, Consular Attache, was very perturbed over the situation involving Captain Yanez and Miss Lorenz and had told Yanez that this incident embarrassed Fidel Castro and the Cuban Government.
