REGARDING REPORTED ATTEMPT BY UNKNOWN CHICAGO POLICE OFFICERS TO GAIN ENTRANCE TO ALEX'S APARTMENT, INFORMANT WHO IS APARTMENT MANAGER CONTACTED. HE STATED ON DAY SUZANNE FUEGER DEPARTED FOR EUROPE ALEX STATED HE HAD JUST RETURNED FROM AIRPORT WHERE HE LEFT FUEGER WHEN HE RECEIVED INFORMATION FROM CHICAGO POLICE OFFICER, IDENTITY UNKNOWN TO INFORMANT, THAT UNKNOWN CHICAGO OFFICERS HAD ATTEMPTED TO GAIN ENTRANCE TO ALEX'S APARTMENT BUILDING FOR PURPOSES OF PHOTOGRAPHING HIS DOOR LOCK. ALEX SUBSEQUENTLY HAD ALARM INSTALLED ON INSTANT DOOR. INFORMANT STATES HIS DOORMAN APPARENTLY FIRST OBSERVED ABOVE INDIVIDUALS BEHIND THE APARTMENT BUILDING AND DISRUPTED THEIR ATTEMPTS TO COMPLETE THEIR PHOTOGRAPHIC MISSION. INFORMANT BELIEVES DOORMAN MAY ALSO HAVE CONFIDED IN ALEX AS TO ABOVE ATTEMPT.
