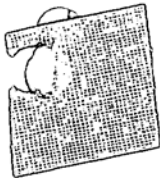

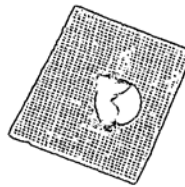

RACE WIRE SERVICE
NEW ORLEANS FAIR GROUNDS

On January 9, 1962, the New Orleans Police Department, with local search warrants, entered the premises of 2019, 2019 $\frac{1}{2}$, 2021 and 2021 $\frac{1}{2}$ Fortin Street, New Orleans, and disrupted the local wire service from the New Orleans Fair Grounds. No arrests were made, however, four telephones with illegal extensions were confiscated from this address and telephone service was removed from the residences. A complete survey of the telephones in the area was made by officials of the telephone company and numerous "dead wires" were removed from the 300 block of Fortin Street.



Contact with PCI [redacted] and PCI [redacted] on the afternoon of January 9, 1963, disclosed that there was no wire service being received by the local bookmakers.

OTHER 4

On January 10, 1963, several locations where local bookmaking flourishes were checked by Bureau Agents and it was determined that information was being received from the New Orleans Fair Grounds approximately 10 minutes after the completion of the race.

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JOSEPH KORJENECK, New Orleans Fair Grounds, advised that he had received similar information and at the present time efforts are being made to determine if some unknown individual or individuals are walking the winner and par-mutual orders from the track.
