MMERICO SALEBE. NY T-7 advised that SALEBE had met KOVALEV several times before. He asked KOVALEV how GEORGE was, referring to YURIY A. MISHUKOV KOVALEV told him that MISHUKOV was sorry that he could not come to the party but wild not ask SALEBE if DENNIS HARBER, his former roommate, was still in New York City. SALEBE told KOVALEV that HARBER was sick and in a hospital in Kansas. As KOVALEV left the party, he stated that he would see NY T-7 at 7 PM on April 19, 1960, so that they could begin exchanging Russian and English language lessons.
