TOMASCINA CIAFOLO, an English instructor employed at the Berlitz School of Languages, Rockefeller Center, New York City. (u) (S)

NORMA VILLA, a receptionist at the Berlitz School of Languages, Rockefeller Center, New York City. (u) (S)

GALE BROOKS, 509 West 112th Street, New York City. He is a student of the Japanese language and attended the party with his Japanese roommate, (First Name Unknown) KUBOTA. (u) (S)

MASAHIRO HASHIMOTO, a student at Columbia University. (u) (S)

RAYMOND OTANI, owner and manager of the Japanese Food and Gift Shop, 97th Street and Broadway, New York City. (u) (S)

AMERICO SALEBE, NY T-7 advised that SALEBE had met [KOVALEV] several times before. He asked [KOVALEV] how [GEORGE] was, referring to [YURIY A. MISHUKOV]. [KOVALEV] told him that [MISHUKOV] was sorry that he could not come to the party but did not ask [SALEBE] if [DENNIS HARBER], his former roommate, was still in New York City. [SALEBE] told [KOVALEV] that [HARBER] was sick and in a hospital in Kansas. [SALEBE] told NY T-7 that he had recently been contacted by [LIBBY HOLMAN REYNOLDS], a wealthy socialite friend of his, who wanted to arrange a party to which several [Soviets] would be invited. He told NY T-7 that this woman had given several parties during the period from the summer of 1958 to the summer of 1959, to which he had brought [KOVALEV] and [MISHUKOV] and another Soviet since she had requested him to do so. She had told [SALEBE] that she wanted to meet some Soviets since she contemplated visiting Russia. (S) (u)

NY T-7 stated that SALEBE had learned that REYNOLDS did not, in fact, go to Russia. (S)

As [KOVALEV] left the party, he stated that he would see NY T-7 at 7 PM on April 19, 1960, so that they could begin exchanging Russian and English language lessons. (S) (u)
