On 1/13/71, CS BS 19-S advised that JOHNSON reportedly organized a trip to the Middle East during the previous summer which was attended by sixteen people from the white New Left. On 8/2/71, Boston requested to interview JOHNSON to obtain information that organizations such as Al Fatah, the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine, and the Democratic Popular Front for the

Boston file 100-40012, Bufile 100-454824, New York file 100-166806 reflects that Miss SAM BARNES on 6/16/69 was one of several persons who were en route to Cuba, returning from Cuba 8/16/69 aboard the Cuban freighter, "Manuel Ascunce."

On 4/13/71, BS 1271-S made available an "Organizers Manual" issued by PCPJ at Boston, Mass., which manual revealed the various organizers' responsibilities for anti-war demonstrations to be held in the Boston area during the month of May, 1971. SAM BARNES (female) was to be coordinator to the press.

No other pertinent information is contained in this file.

On 4/7/69, NANCY BARNES, DOB 10/31/46, then residing at 363 Beacon Street, Somerville, Mass., was arrested by the Mass. State Police during a take-over of a building at Harvard University, Cambridge, Mass. The building take-over was in connection with SDS action.
