On 1/15/65, MM 635-S made an appointment to see Dr. ORLANDO BOSCH AVILA, Medical Doctor, at the Abbey Clinic, 5190 S.W. 8th St., Coral Gables, Fla., where BOSCH is employed. MM 635-S had a foot infection which was examined by BOSCH, after which BOSCH, in the presence of MM 635-S, typed out instructions for MM 635-S to follow in treating this foot infection. The typewriter was observed by MM 635-S to be an old model Underwood. MM 635-S was accompanied by his young son, who was also examined by BOSCH for a minor ailment. (X)(u)

Enclosed for the Bureau is the above-described typewritten statement which is written on white paper in the Spanish language. "JOE" is the name used by MM 635-S for identification purposes. (X)(u)

The FBI Laboratory is requested to compare this typewriting with the three extortion letters, post-marked Miami, Fla., 9/14 and 28, and 11/12/64, which have been previously submitted to the Bureau.

The Miami Office is in the process of attempting to obtain more extensive specimens of this Underwood typewriter, as well as of all typewriters at the Abbey Clinic. In the meantime, a cursory examination by Agents of this office reflects that the above-described specimen obtained by MM 635-S appears to be extremely similar to the typing which appeared in the letter postmarked 9/28/64, sent to ROBERTO MENDOZA - victim. For the information of the Bureau, investigation to date has reflected that the Abbey Clinic is in disrepute with the local Medical Association. It has also reported that BOSCH is held in high regard by the doctors who operate the Abbey Clinic. Consequently, at this point it is felt that a direct approach to the Abbey Clinic to obtain specimens is unwise. (X)(u)

The FBI Laboratory is requested to expedite its examination of the enclosed specimen.

Also enclosed to the Bureau are two Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) documents containing typing from a typewriter in possession of JOSE RICARDO GARCIGA-ORBE of 1575 N. W. 2nd St., Miami. GARCIGA is regarded as a suspect in this case. These INS documents were obtained on 1/20/65, by INS Investigator JAMES C. De LISLE in cooperation with his immediate superior, Mr. CHESTER WOISH, Chief of Investigations, INS, Miami, in cooperation with this office. GARCIGA possessed an electric portable Coronet typewriter.

The FBI Laboratory is also requested to examine the typing on these two documents with the extortion letters mentioned above.

It is requested that all of the enclosures be returned to this office after completion of examination by the Laboratory.
