JFK Law 11(a)

On March 3, 1961 T-1 advised that FELICE GALINO was known to him as a business associate of CARLOS MARCELLO.

T-2, on January 13, 1961 advised that the recent raid on Kent's Golden Parrot Restaurant on Jefferson Highway by the Louisiana State Police was instituted by CARLOS MARCELLO to protect his gambling operations at the Riverside Drive Inn which is the Old Southport Club. He said he did not know how this was arranged by MARCELLO but assumed it was through contacts which MARCELLO has in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, whose identities are not known to T-2. He advised that his authority for this information was RAYMOND ROLLING, investigator for the District Attorney's office, Jefferson Parish, who may have some interest in Kent's Restaurant or being paid off by Kent's Restaurant to permit gambling to operate upstairs there. He advised that ALTON WILLS. SR. had an O.K. to operate gambling in the daytime only at Kent's and attempted to operate an evening gambling set up which was in competition with the Riverside Drive Inn.

T-2 advised that he had no direct information that CARLOS MARCELLO was connected with the Riverside Drive Inn but from RAYMOND ROLLING he had received information that MARCELLO had personally contacted the Constable, GEORGE ROME attempting to bribe ROME who had on two or three occasions participated in raids of the Riverside Drive Inn and who on other occasions was conspicuously present in front of the place thereby preventing its operation and driving away potential customers. T-2 advised that he received this information about the first week in January, 1960. He believed that the meeting between MARCELLO and ROME occurred sometime in December 1960. He said that ROLLING told him that ROLLING had actually surveilled ROME and observed the meeting between CARLOS MARCELLO and ROME. According to T-2 ROLLING told him that ROME did not accept MARCELLO's offer.
