RE MIKE ZERVOS - INFORMATION CONCERNING

Confidential source MIKE ZERVOS on 8/14/58 advised SAS RICHARD GORDON DOUCE and THOMAS G. FORSYTH, III, that he visited Assistant Attorney General D. MALCOLM ANDERSON of the Criminal Division in his office in Washington, D.C., for approximately 35 minutes on the afternoon of 7/30/58.

It was tactfully determined through conversation with ZERVOS that he did not specifically discuss information in his possession regarding the MANNARINO organization of New Kensington, although ZERVOS claims Mr. ANDERSON voluntarily mentioned that he was very pleased about the obvious success of numbers raids conducted at New Kensington by the Intelligence Division, Internal Revenue Service, on 7/19/58 and 7/24/58.It is recalled thatthe Internal Revenue Service raids in New Kensington, Pa., were based on information developed by ZERVOS and disseminated by the Pittsburgh Office to the Internal Revenue Service.

ZERVOS pointed out that during their chat Mr. ANDERSON spoke mainly about the health and activities of his family, and their mutual friends in Donora, Pa. According to ZERVOS, Mr. ANDERSON, without going into detail, mentioned when he first assumed office in Washington, D.C., he was greatly disappointed to find a lack of cooperation among "Federal Investigative Agencies" and mentioned that he hopes to achieve a great degree of cooperation among the agencies before leaving office. ZERVOS said Mr. ANDERSON did not single out the FBI in this portion; of his conversation.
