

Bugene L. Maximilien is the Haitian Consul General in Miami, Florida. The following is a summary of pertinent information relating to Maximilien's activities during the period January to April, 1967.

A. BACKGROUND

1. Residence

On April 18, 1967, MM T-1, a Haitian national (5)

presently living in the United States who is well acquainted with Eugene Maximilien of ther Haitian personalities, advised Eugene Maximilien continues to reside at 5448 S. W. 62nd Evenue He continues to entertain guests there and has frequent parties. He has recently imported a Haitian (5) bodyguard to protect his residence in view of his fears for his safety. The informant did not know the name of the bodyguard. He stated he is a young Negro male, about 6' tall, weighing 200 pounds, with black hair and brown eyes.

Maximilien continues to be visited at his residence by a young girl named Valerie Fanan or Fanin (5) The informant has learned that Valerie Fanan fives on Southeast 14th (5) Street about three Fouses east of Brickell Avenue in Hiami. The telephone number of the residence where Valerie lives with her mother is 373-9403. Valerie's father is in jail (5) and her mother is believed to work for the Catholic Welfare Program (5)

The records of the Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Company as reviewed on February 10, 1967, reflect the following information regarding telephone 373-9403.

The telephone is a non-published number listed to John Courtney (Office), 149 S. E. 14th Lane Miami. It was indicated that Courtney (S) in addition to having an office at this location, resides at the same address.

The above records are confidential and can only be obtained through the issuance of a subpoena duces tecum. This subpoena should be directed to Mr. George Lester Freeman, Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Company, Miami, Florida, or his authorized representative.

On April 18, 1967, informant further advised that Rugene Maximilien no longer is visited at his residence by Ruth Anthony a former paramour. He allegedly found Ruth having an affair with another man, became enraged with her, and has had nothing to do with her since.

With regard to the bodyguard of Maximilien 3)
mentioned above, it is to be noted that Department of
State Telegram dated February 9, 1967, from the American
Embassy, Port-au-Prince, to Secretary of State, Washington,
D. Cladvised that the American Embassy in Port-au-Prince
on February 6, 1967, had issued 4-3 visas to Francisco E.
Tellesfort and Mrs. Gerard Bernard who are designated as
attendants for Comsul General Eugene Maximilien in Niami.

A Haitian foreign office official informed the American Embassy Grally that the two individuals are to serve as "security guards" for Maximilian following the recent alleged burglary at his residence.

B. ACTIVITIES

On January 27, 1967, MM T-1 stated that Eugene Maximilien recently said that if any plots are mounted

against President Duvalier of Haiti, he will not fight against them inasmuch as he dislikes Duvalier and his activities. Maximilien Went to Haiti on January 26/21967, to see President Duvalier and was expected to return to Miami in a few days.

On March 10, 1967, MM Tol stated that Maximilien S) plans to go to Haiti on April 12 1967, for an important festival which was being held there at that time.

on April 18, 1967, MM T-1 stated that Maximilian (5) was at that time still in Haiti having gone there to take part in the festival celebrating the ten years in power of President Duvalier. Informant stated he heard Maximilian went to Haiti in the airplane of Edwin Marger, a Miami attorney who has had previous interests in Haiti. Maximilian recently mentioned that the economic situation in Haiti tends to be bad and pointed out that during March the Haitian consulate the part of the eceived only \$1500 for expenses whereas they normally receive between \$6,000 and \$7,000 per month. Prior to going to Haiti, Eugene Maximilian met with Mayor Elliot Roosevelt of Miami Beach and Chuck Hall, Mayor of Dade County, regarding participation of these men in the festival in Haiti. Informant stated that Mayor Roosevelt agreed to go to Haiti as a guest of the government but Chuck Hall declined. Maximilian stated that all this is a part of the Haitian government's efforts to present an attractive picture for tourists, and that any American official who goes to Haiti at the present time will be treated royally.

Contacts of Subject

On February 7, 1967, MM T-1 identified a picture of one Ralph Serrano as that of an individual known to him as Ralph who tigited Eugene Maximilien several times in the latter part of 1966 CoRalph acted and talked like a LA hoodlum and informant was of the opinion he had a criminal

background. Serrano is a friend of Mitchell/Werbell, who was recently indicted for his part in the abortive Haitian invasion attempt which was stopped by U. S. Customs at Coco Plum Key January 8, 1967. The charges against Werbell were subsequently dropped.

On March 10, 1967, Immigration and Maturalization Service (INS), Mismi, advised that they had determined that Ralph Serrano, who had been deported from the United States to Santo Domingo on January 9, 1965, was now illegally in this country and was subject to immediate deportation if he could be located.

On March 10, 1967, MM T-1 stated that on March 8, 1967, he had observed the well known anti-Castro leader, Manuel Artime, at the residence of Rugene Maximilien (5) Artime to the head of the Movimiento Recuperacion Revolucionario (Movement for the Recovery of the Revolution) Elnformant did not know the purpose of Artime's contact with Maximilien, (S)

On April 21, 1967, Charlotte Silverstein was contacted at her place of buginess, La Vari, Finc., 8250 Biscayne Boulevard, Miami. Miss Silverstein stated that she is an American citizen and presently resides at 1990 Drive, Normandy Isle, Miami, Florida. (\$

Miss Silverstein stated she has known Eugene Maximilien the past two years. Swhen he first came to the country he was very concerned that his dark complexion might alienate him from many Miamians. His Silverstein Silverstein stated she had been well acquainted with a previous employee of the Haitian Consul, Miss Gladys Monnier and Monnier (S) furnished her name to Maximilien. Miss Bilverstein stated that she introduced Maximilian to many people in the Miami community and made things easier for him socially during his first few months in Miami She stated that she herself dislikes the type of person Maximilien represents inasmuch as she considers him crude, dishonest Pand too much of

a ladies man. Although she does not like Maximilien (5) she visits at his residence from time to time and continues contact with him and other employees of the Haitian Consul (5) she does not know of any illegal activity in which Maximilien (5) has engaged. She pointed out that her acquaintance with Maximilien was purely social in nature and as far as she was concerned had no political ramifications.

As previously reported, several cars mere observed parked near the apartment of Eugene Maximilien at the time he resided at 6539 West Flagler Street, Miami, Florida & Among these cars were the following:

1W 64167. 1982 Chevrolet sedan, registered to Francisco E. Rodriguez, 545 S. W. 10th Street. M. A.M. K. A.

1-158463. 1962 Chevrolet station wagon, registered to Francisco Ferrer, 3082 M. W. 11th Avenue.

1-64608. 1955 Plymouth, registered to Mrs. Nell Knapp, 4840 S. W. 93rd Court.

On March 21, 1967, Mr. Joseph Pappalardo, 537 S.W. 10th Street, advised that he is the owner-manager of the apartments at 545 S.W. 10th Street. He stated that a Mr. Rodriguez lived in apartment seven at one time but Rodriguez moved out several months ago and is no longer living there. Mr. Pappalardo pointed out that most of the tenants in the apartment house are Cuban refugees and the turnover of apartments is frequent. He recalled Rodriguez as a quiet, law-abiding individual who caused no trouble, and he had no idea where Rodriguez was living at the present time.

On March 21, 1967, Mrs. J. Mc Larney, 308 M. W. 11th Avenue, advised that there is no such number as

 $308\frac{1}{2}$ W. W. 11th Avenue. She stated that she and her husband and four children have lived at 308 for many years. She does not know anyone by the name of Francisco Ferrer and has had no Cubans residing in her residence.

On March 27, 1967, MM T-2 stated that there were no forwarding addresses available for Francisco E. Rodriguez, 545 S. W. 10th Street, or Francisco Ferrer, 308 N. W. 11th Avenue.

On March 22, 1967, Mrs. Mell Knapp, Appellate Section, Internal Revenue Service, (IRS), Room 306, Federal Office Building, Miami, Florida, advised that she resides at 4840 S. W. 93rd Court.) She is presently employed as a clerk in the Appellate Section of the IRS and has been so employed for the past seven and one-half years. She stated that the namelEugene Maximilien means nothing to her, and she knows no Haitians in the Miami area (Mrs. Knapp stated that she is an American citizen and related that two of her sisters reside on 66th Avenue just north of Flagler Street in Miami, and that she frequently visits these sisters at the motel located adjacent to the residence of her sisters which motel's address is 6539 West Flagler Street.

Maximilien had several visitors at his residence including Dave Marks, 815 N. E. 48th Street, and one Jack Simone. (5)

Dave Marks has been previously interviewed and furnished information in regard to these contacts

On April 17, 1967, Dave Marks, 815 N (W. 48th)
Street, advised that neither he nor Jack Simone have had
any further contact with Eugene Maximilien and that he
has had only one additional contact with Simone who as far
as he knows is still in the Miami area. Simone has lost
all interest in Haitian matters and is presently busy

making a living. Simone introduced his wife to Marks of and told Marks that she is from Houston, Texas. Marks did not know the name of Simone's wife.

On April 18, 1967, MM T-1 stated that Eugene Maximilien has acquired another girl friend. Her name is Joyce Gaillard (5) Informant believes that Gaillard (5) may be an American citizen who is married to a Chilean. She is a young and intelligent woman who may be employed as a teacher in some school in the Miami area. Informant stated he would attempt to obtain further descriptive data regarding Gaillardi.

Miscellaneous

On February 3, 1967, MM T-3, another government agency which conducts intelligence and security investigations, advised that they had received information from a source whose reporting has proved accurate, that Eugene Maximilien, the Haitian Consul in Miami, Florida, would be replaced in the near future by Michel Bredy S who is now the Haitian Consul in Puerto Rico. According to MM T-3, Bredy was in Miami for a month and made a declaration in Spanish and English for the Haitian government of the Spanish of the Haitian government of

Bredy is a completely unprincipled and unscrupulous individual who would be more undesirable as a consul in the Miami area than Eugene Maximilien (5)
