The Pittsburgh "Sun-Telegraph" December 7, 1949, edition in an article entitled, "Tannas Buys Into Charles" reported as follows:

Informant also said that on April 29, 1955, JACK I. DRAGNA sent the following telegram from the Desert Inn Hotel to MINI TRIPOLI, 7400 Sumpet Boulevard, Hollywood, California:

"Have room for two at Desert Inn under name of J. BAKER. Have rooms for four CHARLIE B. Haven't been able to phone through. Send wire when you will arrive to SAM MANNARINO, room 115, Desert Inn. Bring LOUIS important. JACK DRAGNA."

In January, 1950, Corporal J. P. HELFENSTEIN, Pennsylvania State Police, Greensburg, Pa., informed SA WILLIAM J. MYERS that he had accompanied a Captain of the Pennsylvania State Police from Harrisburg, Pa., on a special assignment to interview SAN.REMORATNO in regard to a complaint received by the Governor or Pennsylvania concerning illegal election contributions by members of the underworld in Nectmoreland County, HELFENSTEIN stated that NANNARINO during the interview Senied any illegal activity and added that he had invested heavily in a plant to manufacture juke boxes (Pilbin Coin Nachine Company, Chicago, Illinois), but that the venture was a failure. According to HELFENSTEIN, MANNARINO stated that he expected to lose several hundred thousand dollars in connection with this business enterprise.

According to the article, the indictment acquired MANNARINO of approaching HARRY TRUITT, former New Kensington dental technician, and paying him \$150 to avoid testifying in the vote fraud trial which involved seven defendants.

On January 17, 1957, a jury hearing the above charges returned a verdict of not guilty as to GABRIEL MANNARINO.

A reliable informant on May 13, 1957, advised SA PORTELLA that SAM MANNARINO continues to purchase large tracks of land in Westmoreland County and recently purchased 400 additional acres in the section of Westmoreland County known as Weinels Crossing for \$39,000. The informant said that MANNARINO has also purchased land in Somerset, Pa., and is looking for land in other outlining areas. Informant also said that MANNARINO has requested him to arrange for the building of an artificial lake on the property acquired at Weinels Crossing. (PG545-C)

HANGOUTS AND PLACES OF AMUSEMENT

The Kenmar Hotel is considered by local law enforcement officers as a hangout for racketeers and hoodlums in the New Kensington area from which the MANNARINO organization is reputed to direct its various operations. The Lateus Club is likewise considered to be under the control and ownership of SAM MANNARINO. This club has also been unauthoratively reported to be an after hours spot and a gambling establishment. The City News Stand at New Kensington is believed by local law enforcement officers to be owned by TOM LATEOS and is the reputed headquarters for the MANNARINO numbers operation in that area. The Greek Club and the Bachelors Club located in New Kensington and the Sans Souci Club, Havans, Cuba, have been described in the past by local law enforcement officers as establishments frequented by SAMUEL MANNARINO and his associates.

IDENTIFICATION RECORD AND DESCRIPTION

In September, 1950, Sergeant HELFENSTEIN of the February vania State Police, advised that a small horse room had opened up in Greenaburg, Re. According to HELFENSTEIN this form was reportedly established under the auspices of Attorney PAUL MC CORNICK, who according to HELFINSTEIN, represents gashlers brought before the courts of Mestmoreland County. HELFENSTEIN explained that the operations of the horse room Mere initially supervised by ROCGA SUFFONE, described by HELFENSTEIN as a member of the Mannagino organization. HELFENSTEIN added that EUFFONE subsequently turned over the operation of the horse room to local operators.
