The subject resides at Apartment 30, 110 Christopher Street, NY, NY with his wife, SUSAN H. FRANK. He is employed as a free-lance Assistant Director out of Local 161, Motion Picture Assistant Directors and Script Clerks Union. Informants report that the subject has not been working regularly. Subject reported to receive financial help from his mother. [In May, 1964, subject was reported to have been in Geneva, Switzerland. In August, 1964, he reportedly travelled through the southern part of the US, and informant stated that the subject and his wife postponed a planned trip to Mexico. Subject reported to be in contact with JAMES and ANN LEF of the "China Daily News"; ROSE and CHARLES "Bob" COE; IRA GOLLOBIN; JACK SHULMAN; MILTON K. ROSEN, head of the Progressive Labor Party; JACOB ROSEN; WILLIAM L. EPTON; FRED JEROME; LEON JOSEPHSON and WILLIAM H. HINTON. The subject also reported to be depressed on occasions and to have loud arguments with his wife.

NY T-1 advised on November 12, 1965, that RICHARD CYRIL FRANK continues to reside at Apartment 30, 110 Christopher Street, New York City, New York, with his wife, SUSAN H. FRANK.

NY T-5 advised on March 10, 1965, that on February 25, 1965, a deposit of \$9,380.79 was made in the subject's savings account. At this time, he had a balance in his savings account of \$10,958.03.

NY T-4 advised on June 30, 1965, that the subject stated that he has about 33 bonds and one of them was recently called and that he put the money which was about \$9,000.00 in the bank.

NY T-5 advised on November 12, 1965, that on that date the subect had a balance in his savings account of \$7,500.00.

The information from NY T-5 is not to be made public except in the usual proceedings following the issuance of a subpoena duces tecum.

Travel of the Subject

NY T-6, a confidential source abroad, advised on January 25, 1965, that RICHARD FRANK, home address, 110 Christopher Street, New York, New York, resided at the Hotel Victoria, Geneva, Switzerland, arriving alone from New York from May 5 to 13, 1964 and at the Hotel du Jet d'Eau, Geneva, Switzerland, arriving from New York from May 13 to 14, 1964. At the second hotel, where he stayed for one night, it was recalled that he had been in possession of a great amount of photographic material and had not stayed with anyone.

NY T-6 stated that the Swiss Television was not called on to collaborate with FRANK which is customary for professional reasons when a representative of a foreign television organization comes to Switzerland and is usually done through Eurovision, whose Swiss office is at Zurich

At 1:05 p.m. on December 9, 1964, the subject was observed by SAS of the FBI to be in the company of MILTON K. ROSEN, in the lobby of 39 CCortlandt Street, New York, New York.

NY T-4 advised on December 7, 1964, that on that date AMILTON K. ROSEN told the subject that there would be a meeting of the Teachers' Committee the following Wednesday . evening, and he would like the subject and his wife to attend.

NY T-4 advised on January 6, 1965, that on that date RICHARD FRANK told ROSEN that he had received the material on the "Negro Question" which ROSEN had mailed to him.

NY T-4 advised on January 14, 1965, that on that date MILTON K. ROSEN asked the subject if the subject could take over a class on the following night, since he, ROSEN, could not make it.
