The source of information in the enclosed letterhead memo is captioned PSI, who furnished the information on 11/8/60, to SA MAURICE F. FARABEE. The information in the enclosed letterhead memo is furnished in the event the Bureau desires to disseminate it to CIA, sincw DE LA PAZ is a member of MIRR. (It is noted CIA has advised the MIRR is not a part of operation CLIP and CIA is suspicious of the MIRR, but is interested in following its activities.) During the time he was in NYC, from approximately 9/22/60, to 10/24/60, JOAQUIN SANCHEZ, Clerk, Cuban Consulate, [5] NYC, an acquaintance of DE LA PAZ for approximately the past [3] year, endeavored to contact him telephonically at his place of employment, the Latina Shipping Co.) on 4 or 5 occasions. 5 On the last occasion SANCHEZ was successful and expressed [5] indignation that DE LA PAZ had not returned his calls. DE LA [5] PAZ said he informed SANCHEZ that he had not returned his calls [5] since he, DE LA PAZ, has been labeled a counter-revolutionary [and did not think it proper for him to be talking with SANCHEZ 5 whereupon SANCHEZ terminated the conversation. That night, [5] (5) ANTONIO SOSA, Consul, Cuban Consulate, NYC, telephonically Contacted DE LA PAZ. DE LA PAZ said he was an acquaintance of SOSA during the time DE LA PAZ was employed at the Cuban Consulate and when he received the call from SOSA he was [5] harsh in his conversation with SOSA and SOSA wanted an explanation S as to why DE LA PAZ was so harsh. DE LA PAZ said he told SOSA [S] that he did not trust SOSA. Thereafter SOSA inquired about [5] Mismi PSI (HEROINA GONZALEZ MELO with whom DE LA PAZ) has resided (5) in commonlaw in the past and after DE LA PAZ told SOSA MELO [5] was doing okay so far as he knew, [SOSA] hung up. DE LA PAZ [S] said the above persons plus MARINA MORALES and LUIS GARCIA, CS mentioned in the enclosure, were the only Cuban Consulate [5] employees he talked with while in NYC. (d

It is noted that PSI advised on 11/7/60, that

MANUEL GUILLOT told her on 11/5/60, that DE LA PAZ had called the Cuban Consulate, NYC, 3 times and had talked with NILDA S

NUNEZ, ANTONIO SOSA and PEDRO VEGAS, all employees of the Cuban S

Consulate. According to PSI MELO, DE LA PAZ told her after his S

arrival in Mismi on 10/26/60, that ANTONIO SOSA had given him S

\$20 and CELIA GIRONA, also an employee of the Cuban Consulate, S

NYC, had given him \$5.

PSI advised on 11/7/60, that DE LA PAZ, after (S) his arrival in Miami left in her residence a rifle with case. Tifle number (5MK1ROF(F) -- 5/45M2288, which DE LA PAZ said was a

hunting rifle. DE LA PAZ, when interviewed on 11/8/60, advised mentioned rifle was a rifle he purchased approximately 2 years ago and had left in the residence of an acquaintance, OCTAVIO LAREDO) in NYC; however, LAREDO was straid to have the rifle around his son, and DE LA PAZ brought it to Miami with him.

PSI made available a personal letter in the Spanish language dated (11/1/60,) to her, which DE LA PAZ (5) had [left at her residence,] shortly after his arrival in (5) Miami. An English translation of the letter reads as follows:

"November 1, 1960]

"My dearest Cuqui: (5)

"You will not understand what this separation means, maybe you will not understand the reasons for it, but maybe some day you will understand "something," maybe even everything, connected: with this short letter.

"I want you always to remember that I am giving the up everything that is good, and the happiness I had with you. With God's help, we will be together again and never be separated again.

"GUQUI, it will be hard for you, I realize that, and even harder for me, since, as I said before, I gave up everything that is good, especially you.

"You know what this letter means. God will forgive me, and I hope you, too, will forgive me.

"From one who loved you, who loves you now, and who will always love you.

psr also made available a note on a piece of paper with no addressee which she found in a suitcase left at sher residence by DE LA PAZ. It was in the Spanish language. She an English translation reads as follows: "I am going to Guba to die or to win, not for personal gain, but to keep the torch of liberty forever lighted."

OTHER 4

participated in any practices in training camps or has intentions of going to Cuba. He mentioned the pistol practice referred to in the enclosure, but stated he has been in no training camps and knows of none which exist in Florids. When questioned concerning the note made available by PSI indicating he was spoing to Cuba, DE LA PAZ was unable to furnish a valid explanation for the note but stated it was a foolish thing to do and that the note had no significance but was part of his plans of breaking off his relationship with MELO.

In view of the fact there is a discrepancy in information furnished by DE LA PAZ concerning his contacts with semployees of the Cuban Consulate, NYC, and that information furnished by MANUEL GUILLOT to PSI plus the fact DE LA PAZ has admitted being a member of the MIRR, a counter-revolutionary group, no further contact will be made with him and the 134 file in the Miami Office is being closed.

A source with whom there has been insufficient contact to establish reliability but who is well acquainted with NOSE ALBERTO DE LA PAZ RODRIGUEZ, also known as PEPE DE LA PAZ, furnished the following information to the Miami Office of the FEI on November 8, 1960. DE LA PAZ was born July 30, 1931, at Havana, Cuba, and commenced employment at the Cuban Consulate, New York City, in July, 1949, a position held until his transfer to the Cuban Consulate, Miami, Florida, on January 6, 1960. He was the Acting Commercial Attache at Sthe Cuban Consulate, Miami, until May 19, 1960, when he received written notice of dismissal from his position by the Cuban government under provisions of Cuban Law 203, which Silaw deals with the cooperation with the former regime of FULGENCIO BATISTA on the part of a current government employee. DE LA PAZ currently resides at 2143 Southwest Silah Street, Miami, Florida.

From the time of DE LA PAZ dismissal from the Cuban Consulate, Miami, he resided in Miami until approximately September 20, 1960, when he moved to New York City. In New York City he resided with an acquaintance named (5) OCTAVIO LAREDO, 130 West 57th Street, New York City. After (5) several days of seeking employment, he located employment as a clerk for the Latina Shipping Company, a freight (5) forwarding company, located in New York City and owned by (5) EDUARDO GONZALES. GONZALES is a member of the Frente Revolucionario Democratica (Democratic Revolutionary Front) (FRD). Through GONZALES, DE LA PAZ met CARLOS RODRIGUEZ, a C5)

Revolutionary Recovery of Cuba (MIRR). As a result of
DE LA PAZ conversations with RODRIGUEZ, DE LA PAZ signed
a membership document in the MIRR. While in New York,
DE LA PAZ conversed with MARINA MORALES and her brother-inlaw, Luis Garcia, both of whom are employees of the Cuban
Consulate, New York City. DE LA PAZ also talked with
CLEMENTE MORALES who resides with MARINA MORALES and Luis
GARCIA, CLEMENTE MORALES was a commander in the Cuban
police force under the regime of PRIO SOCARRAS and holds
a high position in the Associacion de Amigos de Arango
(Association of Friends of Arango) (AAA), an anti-CASTRO
organization headed by AURELIANO SANCHEZ ARANGO. LUIS (S)
GARCIA is also a member of the AAA.

DE LA PAZ left New York City on about October 24, 1960, and arrived at Mismi, Florida, on October 26, 1960. Since his arrival in Mismi, he was issued a .45 caliber pistol by an unidentified member of the MIRR and has practiced with it on the outskirts of Mismi on two or three occasions. The MIRR in Mismi is reportedly headed by ORLANDO BOSCH, 4138 Southwest 16th Terrace, telephone Highland 6-1289.
