The three pro-Chinese organizations which exist in France have striven to create, individually, several press organs. (\$) The French Communist Movement (Marxist-Leninist) M. C. F. (M. L.) - publishes L'Humanite Nouvelle' (New Humanity), central organ of the MAC. F. (MAL.). Launched in February, 1965, at Marseilles, this newspaper was a monthly Rance until 1966. The first weekly issue appeared on October 6, 1966. The edition was 55,000 copies. On October 12, 1967 the edition dropped to 18,200 copies. It is printed at Meaux (Seine-et-Marne), but its offices are located at 40, boulevard Magenta, Paris (10me.). The managing director of the paper is Mr. Francois Marty. The chief editor is Mr. Regis Bergeron. (5) In addition to this weekly (which has the highest number of copies as far as the pro-Mao press is concerned), the M. C. F. (M. L.) puts out a number of papers which appear irregularly. As a matter of fact, they are more similar to "tracts for cells" than to regular newspapers. However, they all have claims to being the first stage toward the greation of local publications appearing at fixed intervals. (5) The more vigorous of these publications is VEveil Proletarien' (Proletarian Awakening), organ of the Engene Pottier cell from Chateaudun, which occasionally rates the honor of radio broadcasts in French from Peking and Tirana. should also be made of "October, 1917" (student cells from Marseilles), Red October" (Jean-Pierre Timbaud cell from Tours) "The Worker from Loir-et-Cher" (Blois), Proletarian Reveille" (Limoges), Young Guard" (students from Amiens) and, finally, "The Struggle" (Nimes)

Certain publications of the M. C. F. (M. L.) have disappeared very quickly; for example, "The Vanguard of French French Youth" (a single issue in February, 1965) and Red Flag" (December, 1966). They were put out by student circles and the leadership of the M. C. F. (M. L.) was afraid of displays of independence and verbosity. In this connection, mention should be made of the ex-organ of the "Federation of Marxist-Leninist Circles" (before the creation of "New Humanity"). The name of this paper used to be: "For the Defense of Marxism-Leninism. For a while, the leadership of the M. C. F. (M. L.) has contemplated resuming publication of this paper in the form of a bulletin for internal liaison. At the present time, pending the transformation of the movement into a party, the P. C. F. (M. L.), ambitions are growing and there is under study the launching of a "quarterly theoretical review" before the end of 1967. If this materializes, the pro-Chinese Communist Party will have an organ comparable to the "Notebooks of Communism" of the French Communist Party. (6)

Speaking of the M. C. F. (M. L.), one cannot possibly ignore the existence of the "Notebooks of New China," a daily bulletin (red title) which reprints, without any commentary, the imbrmation reported by Hsinhua Agency. The director is Jean Martin, who is himself a member of the M. C. F. (M. L.). Every Friday, there appears a weekly edition of the "Notebooks of New China" (green title), which reprints the most important texts of the week.

In addition, it should be pointed out that the Association of Franco-Chinese Friends - A. A. F. C. - controlled by the masterminds of the M. C. F. (M. L.) and, for the time being, without a press organ, has just launched a national magazine called Eyes Turned Toward China," the first issue of which (October, 1967) was printed in 5,000 copies by the presses of Conchon Trinting Shop at Meaux. The managing director is Mr. Joseph Marchisio, Treasurer of A. A. F. C.

II. The Marxist-Leninist Center of France (C. M. L. F.) is a general staff with no troops. It is believed that putting out a newspaper is a tight-rope walk for them. Nevertheless,

they managed to put out 21 bulletins of Marxist-Leninist information (a monthly, whenever possible) between early 1964 and April, 1967. However, a few issues of another monthly - Red Star" - which calls itself the "Organ of the C. M. L. F." also, have been put on sale since April, 1966.

Last June, the C. M. L. F. was able to afford the luxury of launching a new organ: "Red Tribune," whose offices are located at 13, rue St-Lazare, Paris (9 me.), with the actual printing being done at Lyon. The political director of "Red Tribune" is Mr. Claude Beaulieu, the managing director being Mr. Jacob Busch. The magazine is printed in 10,000 copies.

III. - Union of Communist Youth - Marxist-Leninist

(U. J. C. - M. L.). This is the latest pro-Chinese organization and is meant to appeal to the students. Despite a rather small following, U. J. C. - M. L. puts out two newspapers...

One, Red Guard, is published as "the central organ of U. J. C. - M. L." and began publication at Nancy in February, 1967. Since that time, each edition has been running about 5,000 copies. The other newspaper, called Serving the People, is presented as "the newspaper of U. J. C. - M. L." It has been coming out every 15 days since July 1 of this year. Also in this case, each edition runs about 5,000 copies. Like "Red Guard," it is printed at Nancy.

The director of these two publications is Mr. Francois Lebovits. Distribution in Paris is done by Mr./Lecourt Chenot. 106, rue de la Glaciere (13 me.) and Git-le-Coeur bookseller's shop (6 me.) jointly.
