Captioned anti-Castro organization has been planning bombing raid over Cuba from Bimini, Bahama Islands. The plane to be used was located at Fort Lauderdale, Florida. Two boats were to depart from Florida area, one of which was to be scheduled to carry bombs. Arrangements were made for Customs to stop actual raid.

Special Agent (SA) Albaugh, Miami, telephonically advised at 7:35 p.m. on 12-28-63 as follows: (confirming teletype, 12-28-63, attached)

The Piper Aztec plane, N4811P, pilot William T. Scherar, took off from Broward International Airport, Fort Lauderdale, at 4:40 p.m. on 12-28-63. He filed flight plan indicating he was flying to Bimini.

The two boats, the "Ebbtide" and the 18-foot FL5171H, were seized by U. S. Customs between 6 p.m. and 7 p.m. on 12-28-63 after rendezvous meeting. Four bombs were found and apparently other bombs were thrown overboard. Customs is returning boats and crews to Miami. Miami will obtain additional details after boats arrive.
