Reference is made to your communication dated  
November 3, 1958, your reference S/8791. (S)

Concerning Alberto Blanco, the "Miami Daily  
News" on May 31, 1957, carried an article entitled  
"100 Anti-Batista Marchers in Clash with Miami Police,"  
which reflected that more than 100 anti-Batista revolu-  
tionaries and their friends clashed with the Miami  
Police that day when they attempted to march on the  
Cuban Consulate, after having first assembled in front  
of the bust of Cuban patriot, Jose Marti, in Miami.  
According to the article, the demonstrators flashed  
signs stating "Down with Batista," "Stop the Bloodshed,"  
and "Cuba, the Hungary of America." The article disclosed  
that Cesar Fonseca, one of the spokesmen for the group,  
stated that the demonstrators did not intend to march  
on the Cuban Consulate, which is some five blocks from  
the bust of Marti, but that the arrival of police caused  
the demonstrators to make a dash for the Consulate. Two  
police officers were knocked down and beaten by the  
demonstrators. One Alberto Blanco, 1019 Southwest  
24th Road, possibly identical with the Blanco concerning  
whom you are inquiring, was among those booked by the  
Miami Police Department for their part in the demonstration.

In February, 1958, an informant, who has furnished  
reliable information in the past, learned from other sources  
that approximately 25 members of the Directorio Revolucionario,  
an anti-Batista organization, under the leadership of Faure  
Chomon, had reportedly departed from somewhere in Florida  
unpresumably for Cuba. Among the individuals who reportedly  
participated in this expedition was one Alberto Blanco,  
possibly identical with the Blanco concerning whom you  
are inquiring. (97-3400 Serial 35 page 7)

The name of one Antonio Guzman, not further identified, was included in a list of members of the Patriotic Club of July 26, Miami, Florida, which was made available to us in September, 1956, by an informant who advised he had received the list from a source he considered reliable. It is noted that this club is made up of followers of Fidel Castro, Cuban revolutionary leader. It is possible that this Antonio Guzman may be identical with the Guzman concerning whom you are making inquiry. (U) (109-430-1603 page 5)
