SUMMARY FROM FRENCH (S)

[Felipe Carrera] (S)

Translator's Note: The following names and information were obtained from a mimeographed book concerning Felipe Carrera. The book does not provide any specific information as to the circumstances under which Felipe Carrera was either investigated or arrested, but seems to be concerned with a detailed description of the papers, publications, correspondence and other material that were found in the possession of Felipe Carrera. (S)

Concerning the subject himself, the book states: (S)

"Felipe Carrera, a Venezuelan national, was born on February 3, 1926. He industriously worked at the preparation and shipping of propaganda material advocating revolution in Latin America, specifically in Venezuela. He duplicated and sent out such magazines and bulletins as "Latin America," "News From Venezuela," and "Know Your Venezuela," as well as other publications. (S)

As previously stated, the book in question pays a great deal of attention to describing the material impounded. Efforts have been made to list all the names mentioned in the various publications, pieces of correspondence and the like. (S)

For example, concerning "Latin American" magazine the list of directors and contributors appearing in the oldest issue seized (January, 1962) is as follows: (S)

It was in correspondence with F. Carrera. As a matter of fact, Carrera submitted reports on his activities on behalf of the Venezuelan Communist Party and of the National Liberation Front of Venezuela for three years and requested payment of the amounts of money which the Embassy had promised him to cover the expenses incurred by Carrera in his activities. (S)

Mrs., Paris. Together with Jean-Paul Sartre she was the addressee of a letter signed by Julio Escalona, President of the Federation of University Centers, Caracas, Jose Rafael Zaroni, Secretary General of FCU (Federation of University Centers), and Adolfo Herrera, Under Secretary General of the same organization. In this letter, the addressees were urged to publicly express their advocacy of an amnesty of political prisoners in Venezuela. In view of the fact that Carrera, in his "Know Your Venezuela" publication mentions the name of Mrs. de Beauvoir, along with other names, "as one of the illustrious persons who have expressed their sympathy with the campaign of a movement for amnesty...." It is to be believed that she ~~granted~~ the request of the leaders of the Federation of University Centers. (S)
