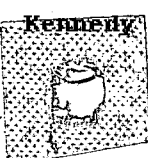

SUBJECT: REQUEST OF GENERAL MAXWELL D. TAYLOR  
FOR INFORMATION ON CUBAN SITUATION

CEJERITO LIBERTADOR DE CUBA

Liaison Agent Bartlett yesterday talked to General Taylor about our desire to furnish newspaperman Charles Bartlett the true facts concerning statements allegedly made to a Cuban contact of the Washington Field Office. General Taylor said that because Charles Bartlett is such a close friend of the President, he would like to clear this with the President before any contact was made.

At 11:35 a.m., 6/27/62, General Taylor telephoned Liaison and said he had furnished the Director's letter of 6/25/62 to the President; that the President had said the letter was quite satisfactory; and that a letter of acknowledgment was being prepared and would be sent to the Director. General Taylor said that with regard to Charles Bartlett, however, the President did not wish this individual brought into the situation again. We assured him that the President's wishes would be followed.

At this time we pointed out to General Taylor that just a few days ago we had secured the permission of the Attorney General to interview Charles Bartlett in connection with an entirely different matter, having to do with a foreign official (Soviet Embassy Assistant Information Secretary Bolshakov, against whom we are considering use of Bartlett as an intermediary in a defection approach). We told General Taylor that in view of this we would go ahead with our contact with Bartlett on the other matter, but would make no reference whatever to the Cuban situation. General Taylor stated that this was quite satisfactory, and that he would mention this additional development to the President.

In accordance with the President's wishes, we will refrain from discussing the Cuban matter with Charles Bartlett but will proceed with our interview with him to evaluate him as a possible intermediary in a defection approach to Bolshakov.
