MALLAMO furnished informant a car, a two-tone Buick, which according to the informant, is parked at the rear of the Workingmen's Club, East Federal St., Youngstown, operated by MALLAMO, when not in use. Informant stated he contacted BRUNO and BRUNO advised him the package was not ready, but that he would deliver same to the informant in Youngstown on 6-7-64, for the informant to give to MALLAMO. Informant stated as of 6-9-64, when he was contacted by contacting Agent, he had not been contacted by BRUNO.

Informant further advised JOHN SALVATORE was fired from his job as steward of the C.M.A.S. Club, by MALLAMO, and to date, MALLAMO has made no appointment to fill the job. CV-278-C-TE stated the reason SALVATORE was fired was because his name was mentioned in the Youngstown "Vindicator" newspaper as steward of the Club when he was held in contempt of court, following his appearance before the recent Mahoning County Grand Jury. Informant stated SALVATORE is of Sicilian background, and when MALLAMO fired him, he was so mad he slapped SALVATORE, and for this reason SALVATORE wants nothing further to do with MALLAMO.

CV-591-C advised the annual picnic of the C.M.A.S. Club will be held on Sunday, 7-12-64, at Shady Grove Park, Youngstown, and members are currently selling raffle tickets for Savings Bonds to be awarded at a drawing that day.

Re: PAUL HOLOVATICH, aka., "Pinto", suspect in CAVBOMB

CV-591-C advised regarding the safe burglary at the Kroger Supermarket Store, Struthers, Chio, 6/7-8/64, where the thieves hauled away the safe door in committing the burglary, HOLOVATICH was one of the participants. The safe door was hauded away in HOLOVATICH's "Joe Blow" car, a 1955 Pontiac, Chio license K-1563-B. Informant stated the reason the safe door was taken was because it was an inside job, in that a Kroger Co. employee furnished the safe combination to HOLO-VATICH, and the door was opened by this means. In order to cover the employee, who had furnished the combination, the thieves had to take the door. Informant stated he is the only individual other than the thieves, who have knowledge of this modus operandi, and for this reason this information cannot be immediately disseminated to local authorities. If and when informant heard of anyone else possessing this information, then the information will be made available to local authorities.

Re: HARRASSMENT OF LOCAL THIEVES AND RACKETEERS

CV-591-C advised PAUL HOLOVATICH had participated in a coin collection burglary of \$12,000 at North Royalton, Chio, a Cleveland suburb, within the past month, with FRANK LENTINE, who is a close associate of HOLOVATICH and JOE SARICH,

Judge RIGELHAUPT advised he is also scheduled on that same day to sentence RONALD DAVID CARABBIA, STEPHEN ALMASY, MICHAEL STEPHEN GRANCHAY, and RICHARD MARZETTI, on the charges of promoting a numbers game. He stated he would impose a sentence of imprisonment in the Ohio State Penitentiary from 1-10 years on CARABBIA; and the remaining defendants, all of whom have pleaded guilty, will receive a sentence of 6 months in the Mahoning County Jail, plus 5 years probation, with the stipulation that during that period of time they are neither to engage in any illegal activities, nor associate with convicted felons or police characters. Violation of the period of probation, according to Judge RIGELHAUPT, will mean immediate imprisonment for the remaining portion of the unexpired five year period. He stated he intends to impose a similar sentence on CCMAN, in the event he appears before the Court as stated.

Both Judge RIGELHAUPT and Prosecutor OSBORNE stated at this time they had been approached by Dr. DAVID BELINKY, M.D. Mahoning County Coroner, in an effort to have the promoting of a numbers game charge dropped against JOHN SWEETKO. RIGHTHRUPT stated Dr. BELINKY told him he, BELINKY, had assured SWEETKO he would attempt to assist him on the matter in return for SWEETKO's support in the recent primary election. It should be noted CV-559-PC advised JOHN SWEETKO had contributed between three and four thousand dollars to Dr. BELINKY's campaign fund, with the understanding that Dr. BELINKY, who is a friend of RIGELHAUPT, would attempt to "fix" the case. OSBORNE stated Dr. BELINKY had told him SWEETKO "was good for at least 3,900 votes in Campbell during the coming November , and OSBORNE would need these votes to beat his Democratic opponent, Atty. HAROLD J. RICKERT, JR. Judge PAUL BROWN of the 7th Circuit Court of Appeals also advised a Bureau Agent recently, he had been approached by "an elected official", who had asked him to intercede on behalf of SWEETKO with Judge RIGELHAUPT.

OSBORNE further advised, on 6-6-64, Dr. RAYMOND CATOLINE, M.D., recently defeated by Dr. BELINKY in the Democratic primary for Coroner, visited him at his, OSBORNE's home, and asked him to withdraw the Grand Jury subpoena for FRANK FETCHET. Dr. CATOLINE stated FETCHET advised him to tell OSBORNE he was willing to make a "sizeable" contribution to his campaign fund, in return for withdrawal of the subpoena.
