Sloboda was born 1/27/27 at Pedkamien, Waraine. According to information furnished Legat, Bonn, by Intelligence Division of the U. S. Army, Europe, Sloboda had worked as an interpreter for the NEVD in East Germany and escaped to West Germany Z in 1946. In 2/48 he emigrated from Germany to Great Britain, returning to Germany in 7/52. In 2/53 ho married Lillian Satelife, a British subject, born 2/12/32 at Halifax, Yorkshire, and whose address at the time was Number 10 Ovendin Terrace, Halifex, In 8/53 Sloboda enlisted in the U.S. Army following which he emigrated to the U.S. under the Lodge Act as an Alien Enlistee in 11/53. He was honorably discharged from the U. S. Army 8/3/58 at Fort George G. Meade, Maryland, He re-enlisted 8/4/58 at the same place. He arrived in West Germany for assignment to Headquarters, 513th Military Intelligence Group 11/6/58. He became a U. S. citizen 8/14/58. Aw The Slobodes had three children. The oldest, David, was born in Great Britain in 1953 before Sloboda became an American citizen. The second, Victor Edwin, was born at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, in 1956. The youngest, Elena, was born in Germany in 1959 after Slobada had been naturalized (Ku) Army records indicate Slobeds was an officer in Polish intelligence prior to his defection to the West. On 8/2/60 Sloboda was assigned to the 513th Military Intelligence Group Headquarters at Oberureal, West Germany. He bad a "Secret" clearance. The 513th Willtary Intelligence Group was directly under the control of the Intelligence Division of the U. S. Army in Europe and had responsibilities for intelligence operations from West Germany into East Germany, Poland, and to some extent Russia. In addition, it had counterintelligence and security jurisdiction for the U.S. Army in the northern half of West Gormany and Berlin. It also operated the Army Interrogation Center, commonly referred to as Camp King.

On 8/2 /60 Slobeda drove in his personal car from Oberursal to Cologue, West Germany. Leaving his car in Cologne, he flew by commercial airline to Berlin. Apparently he had not told his wife of his plans but later communicated with her from Berlin transmitting the sum of 60 marks to her.

Investigation into the circumstances of Slobeda's defection by the 513th Military Intelligence Group revealed that an unauthorized telephone call was made from the day room of the subject's unit in the 513th Military Intelligence Group a few days before the subject departed. This call was made to a firm in the vicinity of Cologne, two principal officers of which had been reported to have communist connections. It was not possible to determine whether Sloboda made the call. On the efterneon in question, he was in charge of the day room.

Late in 1960 Sloboda's wife and three children joined him in the Soviet Union. Sloboda's wife returned to Great Britain for a period of time in 1962-63 and [was interviewed by MI-5 in 3/63; A copy of the results of that interview, classified "Secret," is attached for the information of UPO. She indicated she was returning shortly to the USSR. Vs/
